Ingersoll man dies while fighting fire

INGERSOLL — A 66-year-old man died Thursday while fighting a brush fire here.

Doug Fitzmorris, of King Street West, suddenly suffered a heart attack while rushing with buckets of Thames River water to extinguish a backyard bonfire which got out of control.

The retired machine and tool plant foreman, who had a history of heart trouble, was found dead at the scene, near the Thames River behind some King Street West houses, Ingersoll police reported.

The blaze was Ingersoll's third grass fire this week.

In a casual conversation after the first fire Sunday, town fire chief Ken Campbell worried out loud about the high potential for grass fires this year.

His fears were reinforced after two more fires Wednesday and Thursday: "Things are so dry, I'm afraid we are going to have more this spring, unless we get some rain. Right now, it's dangerous."

This year's unseasonably mild winter has resulted in a lack of spring run-off which has rendered vegetation unusually dry and susceptible to igniting agents such as unextinguished cigarette butts or matches.
