LONDON — A 90-year-old Ingersoll woman died as the result of a collision between a car and a truck in London, London city police confirmed Monday.

The police identified the woman as Estelle Ferguson, of 228 Earle St. She died at University Hospital shortly after the collision.

She was a passenger in a car driven by her grandson, Edward Gillespie, 34, of Concord. Gillespie and his son, Alexander, 14, received minor injuries in the accident, which happened about 2 p.m. Sunday on Windemere Road, west of Adelaide Street.

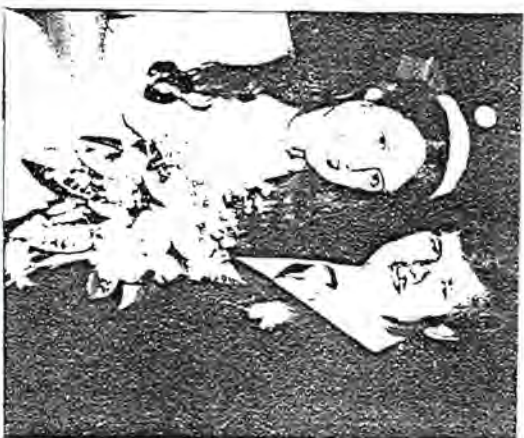
