Message from the Mayor - Margaret Lupton





It is amazing to me that this term of office is almost over. I hope you feel that this Council has represented you well over the past 3 ½ years. Certainly the issues have been many and varied and each of us serving on Council has learned a great deal. Thank you to all who assisted by sharing ideas, concerns and insights with us.

Since the last issue of Zorra Now much has been accomplished in Thamesford and Embro. Residents of Thamesford are moving forward, with the help of a significant Trillium grant, to further beautify the downtown area. You are encouraged to participate in the group working on this project as the decisions to be made will affect the whole village. Embro is experiencing the final phase of the sewer installation project and with the connections being made next year will be ready for new development. The Secondary Plan is well under way and residents there should make it a priority to attend the public meetings as they occur.

Construction at the Embro Community Centre continues with the building hopefully to be ready by the middle of September.

Oxford County Library Board is proposing to down grade the status of the library at Harrington to a "kiosk' with fewer hours, a smaller collection, limited programming, and a change in staffing from a librarian to a clerk. The decision is based on usage and circulation which has been deemed to be insufficient. While the statistics may be smaller it may be that they are excellent given the size of the community, and if it is to be based simply on numbers they can certainly be changed -if only by artificial means. The proposed savings of \$5,000 does not justify the loss to the community.

Staff and members of Council have been attending meetings designed to facilitate the formation of an Economic Development committee which would serve all five rural townships in Oxford. Growth can no longer happen just by chance. It takes a very focused effort and it is felt that working together will have many benefits for all regions. I am grateful to the many organizations in Zorra who plan large events drawing thousands of visitors to our Township each year. This is often the very important first step for people looking to relocate businesses and homes.

After several years of fundraising Embro Fire Department took delivery of their new Rescue Truck. This is really a gift to the community. If you did not contribute to the truck the group is now fundraising to purchase much needed equipment so your donation would be much appreciated.

Many of you are aware of the connection between Zorra and Taiwan (formerly Formosa) because of the missionary work of Dr.George Leslie Mackay in that country. A month long exhibition of Taiwanese photography is planned for the County Administration Building in Woodstock beginning September 8 and a Taiwanese film will launch the Woodstock Art Gallery Movie Series September 27. Plans are underway to revisit our Alcohol Management Policy because of problems arising at functions in both Community Centres. Be aware that the rules will be strictly enforced so renters are advised to read the information given to them very carefully.

As I mentioned at the beginning this term of office is coming to an end. Official voting day is October 25 but Zorra is again using a mail in ballot format. Be very sure to follow the instructions carefully step by step so your vote will count.

As always I thank you for the privilege of serving as your Mayor. I look forward to your calls and hope I will be able to be of assistance to you.

Electronics Waste Depot

Effective, April 1, 2010, Oxford County will divert electronic waste from landfill. A permanent on-site diversion program has been established and there is no charge for segregated loads of electronic waste. Materials will be diverted to the new Electronic Waste Depot located at the Salford Landfill site located at 384060 Salford Road, east of the Village of Salford. The hours of operation are Monday-Friday 8:00 am – 4:30 pm and Saturdays from 8:00 am to 4:00 pm.

Accepted materials include:

- Computer peripherals will include modems
- Printing devices will include copiers, scanners, typewriters
- Telephones
- Cellular phones
- PDA's and pagers
- Audio and video players
- Cameras
- Radios, Receivers, Speakers, Tuners, Turntables, Equalizers, Amplifiers
- Video players, recorders and projectors
- Personal hand held computers

Brush, Leaf & Yard Waste Depot

For Zorra residents, a leaf and yard waste depot is located across from the Kintore Public Works yard at 783036 Road 78.

The following materials are accepted at this location:

- Brush (not to exceed 4 inches in diameter or 6 feet in length)
- Leaves
- Grass clippings
- Garden waste including fruits and vegetables
- Hedge and tree trimmings
- Halloween pumpkins
- Christmas trees

The following materials are NOT ACCEPTED at this location:

- Household garbage
- Demolition waste/debris
- Recycling
- Fencing
- Rocks or stumps

This program is not meant to replace your personal recycling efforts such as backyard composting or grasscycling, but to provide an additional option for residents of the Township. All leaf and yard material will be composted and diverted from landfill.

To provide further value, when available, a portion of the finished compost will be made available to residents for pickup at the depot location.

To ensure the cost effectiveness and viability of this program, residents are encouraged to empty their waste materials from containers or bags in the designated areas and dispose of non-reusable bags in an appropriate manner.

Restoring Harrington's historic grist mill

An integral symbol of Harrington's proud past is back in the public eye thanks to the hard work, dedication and a love of history from a local community organization.

For the past several years the 20-member Harrington Community Preservation and Historical Club Inc. has been devoting its considerable time and efforts to preserve the Harrington Grist Mill as a functioning museum and a working educational site.

"The Upper Thames River Conservation Area acquired the mill in 1966 and since then, it has remained closed and unused," says restoration committee chair Tim Van de Kemp. "In April 1998, the UTRCA held a public meeting to discuss the future of the mill.

"The community was supportive of efforts to restore the mill at its current location so in February 1999, the UTRCA entered into a lease agreement with the club for the long-term restoration of the grist mill and the maintenance of Harrington Conservation Area."

While much of the efforts were concentrated on fundraising at events like the annual Highland Games in Embro, the club also received a \$70,800 grant from the Ontario Trillium Foundation. They quickly discovered the money was about half that was needed to replace the entire foundation.

"Our engineer Ed Talsma of Burnside and Associates of Stratford said he would re-do the drawings, doing it for the money we had," Tim adds. "Since 2009 there has been a considerable amount of work done on re-installations, new foundation and re-alignments to loosen up the running gear.

"It was a lot of work on these Saturday mornings but it was fun with lots of fellowship. The bottom line is the grist mill is now open to the public for viewings. It's been a great project but of course the work is ongoing. Through our annual barbecues (300 attended the August 14 event this year) and other projects we've raised in the area of \$10,000."

The club's website paints an intriguing portrait of the mill's historical background:

"The grist mill at six-hectare Harrington Conservation Area was built by the town's founder — an Empire Loyalist named D.L. Demorest. Built with hand-hewn native pine timbers and topped with a split shingle roof, it was first powered by an overshot waterwheel which was later replaced by a more efficient water-driven turbine in the 1880's.

At that time the mill was still utilizing the Frenchburr stone system for the production

of flour. When the practice of grinding coarse grains for area farmers was introduced, it quickly deteriorated the stones and that method of milling ceased.

In the late 1890s, the introduction of modern milling equipment came to Harrington in the form of an oat roller and chopper. The oat roller at the mill dates back to 1899 and was manufactured locally by Whitelaw Machinery of Woodstock.

The Mill was in continuous operation from 1846 to 1966, except for a brief period of time in 1923 when it succumbed to fire and twice in 1903 and 1949 when the mill dam broke. In later years, a diesel engine was used to operate the Mill when the water supply was too low to operate the turbine."

Committee member Doug Diplock says it was gratifying to see the "groundswell" of support from the general public to restore a structure that had been used largely in recent years as a storage facility for UTRCA.

"The other option was to sell the mill," adds member Sam Coughlan. "If it got back into private hands, we weren't sure whether it would be restored for its historic value. So this was the best route and the community really came through.

"For example, Whitelaw Machinery took out all the equipment, restored and re-installed all of it so it now looks brand new."

Pointing to a wall covered with plaques highlighting the names of companies and organizations, Tim says the restoration project would not have as successful without the assistance of firms like: Pounder Timbermart, Whitelaw Machinery, VicWest, Kittmer Enterprises, Kirby Electric, R. J. Burnside, Wellington Construction Ltd. and the Township of Zorra (with annual donations of \$3,000).

"What this project has done is to provide upcoming generations with living history to show how rural communities operated and why they existed because of mills like this one," adds Sam. "It helped pull our community together, enhancing those old times with a new sense of purpose.

"The Trillium Foundation award came at just the right time, helping to bolster the community support

that was already growing. This all challenged our sense of community.

For Doug, it was a case of not walking away from such an important historic symbol, adding, "I just didn't want to see us doing nothing with this. This is a central part of what Harrington is all about and who we were then and are today."

"The mill shows today's generations and those in the future the kind of industries that were prevalent throughout Canada during those times," says Tim "Many grist mills from the period 1844-1923 no longer exist, some of them burned down.

"The Harrington Mill stopped for a while in 1923 because of the fire but it was restored. Now it stands as a reminder of our history. It's been a great project to be involved in."

Smoke Alarms: A Sound You Can Live With

Fire Prevention Week 2010 focuses on the importance of having working smoke alarms installed on every floor level of your home and outside of all sleeping areas. A working smoke alarm will provide you with the protection and early warning that you need to give you and your family the best chance to survive a fire in your home.

Where to Install Smoke Alarms:

The Ontario Fire Code requires that an operational smoke alarm be installed on every floor level of your home.

- If anyone in your household sleeps with the bedroom door closed, consider installing a smoke alarm inside the bedroom
- On floor levels not containing sleeping areas, install smoke alarms in the living area or at stairwells leading to an upper level
- Do not install smoke alarms closer than 1m (3') to kitchens or bathrooms (to prevent false alarms)
- Install smoke alarms high on a wall or on the ceiling. If mounting on a wall, position the top of the smoke alarm approximately 30cm (4"-12") from the ceiling. If mounting on a ceiling, position the alarm at least 10cm (4") away from the wall
- Do not install smoke alarms near heating registers where air movement may affect products of combustion from smoke alarm sensing chamber



Vote by Mail

This election is being conducted using "Vote by Mail". As the name suggests, the election will be conducted using Canada Post's mail delivery system and each elector will receive a voting kit in the mail. Voter kits will be mailed to each eligible voter on Tuesday, September 28, 2010.

The voting kit will consist of an election ballot, secrecy envelope, voter declaration form and a postage paid return envelope, and include instructions on how to use the kit.

As indicated on the voting kit, it must be returned by mail by Saturday, October 16, 2010 to ensure that it will be received at our office by Election Day on October 25, 2010. For voters choosing to vote later than October 16, 2010 or simply wishing to deliver their voting kit may hand deliver it to the Municipal Office located at 274620 27th Line. The Municipal Office is the ONLY polling location accepting hand delivered voting kits.

Voting kits will be accepted at the Municipal Office from September 28, 2010 until October 22, 2010 during regular business hours from 8:30 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. After hours, voting kits can be deposited in the locked drop box next to our main entrance. Any voting kits deposited in the secured drop box will be removed at the beginning of the next regular business day for immediate processing. On Election Day, voting kits can be delivered to the office from 8:30 a.m. to 8:00 p.m. when the polls close.



All-Terrain and Off-Road Vehicles are banned from all UTRCA property including:

- conservation areas
- all trails, including rail-trails
- all natural areas and wilderness areas

Anyone found using an all terrain or similar vehicle on UTRCA property is trespassing and liable to charges under the Conservation Authorities Act and the Trespass to Property Act. (\$2,000 plus the cost of restoring the damaged area.)

lay charges against those found


