Message from the Mayor - Margaret Lupton





"The future of agriculture will be a political decision." This is a quote from a recent seminar that caught my attention. I have mentioned this to both Zorra and County Councils. Certainly one piece of this would be decisions about land use and sale. Councillors generally speak in favour of retaining land for agriculture but will have to act accordingly when faced with decisions affecting our land base. I believe

this is to be especially true in Oxford which is recognized for its excellent farmland.

A great amount of time recently has been spent revising our Noise By-law and especially noise from gunfire. Watch for notice of Public Meetings regarding this by-law. We are hoping the updated version will be easily understood and enforced. Regulations include sections surrounding lawful hunting and normal farm practices. Along with several Councillors, I attended the Good Roads/AMO

conference in Toronto. Since Zorra is one of the top ten aggregate producing municipalities in Ontario, I was included in discussion with a new Aggregate Caucus being formed to deal with associated issues. We all seem to have similar concerns and I learned much from the discussions. We have already had one meeting with the Minister of Natural Resources. The Minister could see validity in the presentation and was willing to move forward with our suggestions. You will hear more in the next few months.

On the topic of aggregate extraction, Council and staff met with Harrington neighbours to report on Zorra's Robinson Pit. It was an excellent meeting with good cooperation evident. Concerns about noise will be dealt with. We were pleased to announce that after the first two years of operation, gravel savings amounted to over \$375,000.

Council was visited by representatives from UTRCA who reported that since none of the three dams in Zorra are part of the flood control plan, they are of no value to them. I believe they would be relieved to divest themselves of any interest in the structures and the land surrounding them. If Zorra were to assume the dams there would be a huge financial impact as both Harrington and Embro dams have been assessed as needing major repairs and likely should be removed.

As you know smoking has been banned in all Township facilities. Because of numerous complaints we are now considering banning the practice on all Township properties.

The doctor's office in Thamesford is open. If you have experienced difficulty transferring please talk directly with the staff there for assistance. The plan for the revitalization of downtown Thamesford is moving forward with leadership from both T'TAG and TBA. The Embo sewers should be operational by late summer. Please contact Mike Hughes at the Township Office about hookups. The Urban Design Committee will soon finalize their work and the results published. Kintore residents can look forward to new sidewalks this year. Ambulance service from the depot north of Embro will increase coverage to 12 hours per day seven days per week.

Zorra is participating with the other four rural townships in a plan for Economic Development. A Coordinator will be hired shortly to carry out a business review of the entire area. All business owners will be interviewed as we plan not only to expand but also do our part in assisting present businesses to continue and perhaps even expand.

Budget deliberations continue. OPP increases amount to another 3% in our budget. Insurance costs increase despite our excellent claims record, I think, because of the so called "joint and several liability" clauses which find municipalities footing major parts of liability actions simply because of their "deep pockets". Grant requests continue to be a concern as they increase in number and amounts. We are asking cemetery boards to review plot prices as there is a variance across the Township and we are hearing of people beyond our borders interested in purchasing "bargain" plots. I do not feel Zorra Township residents should have to subsidize this practice.

Rainbarrels are available at the Township Office. \$45 Cash only. If you enjoy history you will appreciate this: In 1861 the Township of the day sold an unopened road allowance at Lots 35 and 36 Concession 7 to John Kerr for \$35. Unfortunately they neglected to complete the documentation. Earlier this year, 150 years later, Zorra Township Council had the pleasure of passing the necessary by-laws—thus completing the necessary paperwork.

As usual I look forward to hearing from you.

TREE PLANTING BY-LAW

A reminder for residents that the Township of Zorra Council enacted By-law 21-01, to authorize the following:

"Following the removal of any trees by municipal or contracted workers, adjacent landowners shall have the option to determine if a replacement tree is required. Should the property owner request a replacement tree, the Township shall deliver a tree (species of tree set out in Schedule "A" of the by-law) for the owner to plant and maintain."

GRAVEL ROAD – DUST SUPPRESSANT

The Township Public Works Department will be applying biennial maintenance gravel to all gravel roads south of Road 84 beginning in May. The dust suppressant application will take place in May and June. It takes six weeks to apply dust suppressant to all gravel roads based on product supply and road preparation. Each year the application of dust suppressant starts in a different area of the Township so time frames for application will vary year by year.



Embro Watewater Servicing Township Of Zorra


Construction of the Embro sanitary sewer system is progressing well, and is on schedule to be fully commissioned in early-August 2011, allowing residences to begin connecting to the system. Several construction contracts, discussed below, will be completed throughout the spring and summer of this year.

Elgin Construction has completed sanitary sewer installations within the Village of Embro. Final restoration activities within the Village should be completed during April and May 2011. A small package pumping station will also be installed by Elgin Construction near the southern boundary of the Village. Steve Smith Construction is currently installing the sanitary forcemain between Embro and Woodstock, and should be complete in mid-July 2011. The main sanitary pumping station at the north end of Embro is being constructed by Sierra Construction, who is scheduled to have the station commissioned in early August 2011. Sierra Construction is also constructing the Odour Control Facility at the outlet of the forcemain in Woodstock, and is extending the sanitary sewer system in Woodstock to the outlet of the Embro forcemain. The contract to install the local pumping station packages located on Commissioner St. East and Commissioner St. West will be tendered shortly, and completed by early-August 2011.

County staff are preparing an information package for Embro residents, which will provide details related to connection timing, plumbing permits, inspection requirements, monthly billing and decommissioning existing septic systems. A capital cost update will also be provided, along with a preliminary discussion on payment options and a mandatory connection deadline. Residences requiring individual grinder pumps will also receive additional information related to the units. Information packages will be delivered to residents during May/June 2011.

Once the system is commissioned, residents are encouraged to connect their homes to the system as soon as possible. This will minimize operational complications related to low initial flows, and will also minimize trucking costs (until a certain number of homes are connected and a specific wastewater flow is being generated, wastewater will be trucked from Embro to the Woodstock Wastewater Treatment Plant).

Residents and business owners can continue to contact Oxford County staff with property specific questions related to the Embro wastewater collection system.



Thamesford Gears Up For **Calithumpian and Wienerfest**

Thamesford's unique Calithumpian Weekend Festival is only eight years away from the historic milestone of its 100th anniversary.

"That's our goal," says Delanie Evans, president of Calithumpian Weekend Inc. "This year it will be the 92nd Annual event (Victoria weekend May 20-23). I've been involved for the past six or seven years and it's always been a real joy taking part in an event that has such a sense of community.

"A hard-working committee of eight people organizes Calithumpian every

year. There's a generational involvement over the years because our parents and their friends were involved during the earlier days

and now it's been passed down to us."

Delanie says the aim is to keep the celebrations fresh every year, maintaining favourites but always adding a new wrinkle here and there to keep all age groups happy. Then there's that major goal just down the road – ensuring the community's annual event reaches that magical 100-year mark.

"That should be quite a celebration," she adds. "Getting to the century mark is a major achievement and we'll mark it in style."

Meanwhile, all eyes are on the 92nd Calithumpian Weekend that kicks off the evening of Friday, May 20.

"There will be many amusements and we're bringing back the family movie night," says Delanie. "Shown in the arena, we'll feature a current family film, followed by a teen movie. At this point, we don't know the films' names but this night is always a hit.

"The parade is on Monday and the procession of floats, musicians and performers begins at the arena, wends it way through the village heading south, then north and ending at the north park. Also, there will be fireworks at the arena Sunday evening. Last year we had several hundred turn out on what was a beautiful clear night. Those who don't make their way down can catch the action from their backyards or anyplace in town."

Sunday morning's big trout brunch organized by the local Lions club is another returning crowd pleaser that attracts hundreds of hungry participants. Other activities include a 5 km run/walk, a children's potato sack race and a road hockey tournament which students help to

New this year will be two outdoor beer tents on Saturday and Sunday. The tug-of-war will test residents' strength on Sunday, while skill and speed are the attributes needed for the lawn mower races.

Sunday's pet show and a variety of gifted craft vendors on Saturday and Sunday highlight the festivities along with a village-wide yard sale on Saturday morning. The Trojans hockey team stages a Saturday night dance.

"There are several meanings to the word Calithumpian but our celebrations are probably closest to the one that translates into a loud, boisterous parade," says Delanie. "About three



years ago we decided to move everything to the arena so children can enjoy the fun in one central place.

"Calithumpian has always been geared to the family and it draws people from all over. Those who were raised here, but moved away





show up to renew acquaintances with friends and family. It's like a village-wide school and family reunion. Next year we may have a demolition derby."

While the weather can mean an air of unpredictability, the event generally attracts between 1,000-

1,500 people.



"We encourage everyone to get out to meet their neighbours, a reason for the village-wide yard sale," adds Delanie. "The Thamesford Public School and the Minor

Ball Association are holding barbecues."

"Volunteer work means students get community hours for school. Many teens, some of them graduates, stick around to enjoy the fun. As for the parade and much more we have to thank the service clubs and those extremely generous businesses that provide financial support. Everyone plays a part in Calithumpian."

Wienerfest 2011

They go by their proper name of Dachshund (of German origin meaning badger dog) or, the long narrow canine can be called hot dog, sausage dog, doxie, dachsie or the more popular wiener dog.

Belonging to the hound family, they flush out badgers and other burrowdwelling animals. The miniature dachshund was developed to hunt smaller prey like rabbits. In the American West they have also been used to hunt prairie dogs.

Whatever the name or the purpose, the popular dog will be back in great numbers when Thamesford hosts the 11th annual Wienerfest June 25 from 10 a.m.-4 p.m. Last year 703 canines took the spotlight, while 5,213 people enjoyed Canada's premier wiener dog show and one of the most anticipated celebrations in North America.

Held initially in London, the event was moved to the Lions Club Park in Thamesford three years ago because of the generous hosting offer from that service organization.

"We get people from all over Southwestern Ontario, throughout the province and the rest of Canada, The United States and England," says event coordinator Linda Collier. "One lady is coming all the way from Australia, building her trip around Wienerfest.

"They are such wonderful dogs, lovable, fun to be with and they are quite hilarious when take part in our races. They have a huge following in Texas and there is a real history surrounding them. In World War II Adolph Hitler used them to smuggle notes underground and they almost became extinct."



With a wide range of vendors, events like Musical Paws, The Hunt Is On, Hide A Squirrel, The Yogurt Licking contest and costumes are just part of the Wienerfest celebrations. As strong supporters of responsible breeders, adoption and pet ownership, organizers will donate event proceeds to rescue organizations -Helping Homeless Pets.com and Tiny Paws Rescue Canada.

"An added feature is the new Art in the Park in the north end of the park," Linda says. "We're hoping to attract as many as 50 local artisans. That will involve pet portraits, pet photography, pet paws in pottery and a lot of other fun things.

If you would like to report a lost dog, a dog running at large, or are looking for your lost dog please contact the Township office during regular business hours, Monday-Friday 8:30 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. After hours, please contact Kismutt directly at 519-283-6585.

Kismutt charges a boarding fee based on the length of stay of your dog at their facility. In addition, dog owners are required to pay the Township's dog licensing fee if the dog is not properly licensed in the Municipality before the dog will be returned to its owner.

Please ensure that your dog has a current dog tag on its collar. Licensing your dog with the Township can help identify your dog if it becomes lost or injured. If you find a lost or injured dog, contact the number on the tag to make arrangements for the dog's safe return. If you find a lost or injured dog after regular business hours, please contact Kismutt at 519-283-6585. Kismutt is not under contract to provide pick up of stray cats or cats at large.

DOG TAGS

As per the Township of Zorra By-law number 4-95, all dogs over six months of age are required to be licensed with the Township of Zorra. Dog tags that were sold in 2010 are good for two more years so there is no need to get a new one this year. If your dog has lost his/her 2010 tag, please contact the Office and it will replace it free of charge. If you received a 2010 Dog Tag, your property will automatically be billed for a Dog Tag on the Final 2011 Tax Bill. If you no longer have your dog, please notify the Office and the fee will be removed. For new dogs and puppies over 6 months of age, tags are sold at the Township Office at a cost of \$15.00 per year. This amount can be paid in cash or added to your property tax bill. Failure to license your dog may result in fines from \$50 - \$200 per offence. Kennel Licenses are issued at the Township Office at a cost of \$40 per year. A valid CKC Registration is required for all kennel licenses. Please contact Lisa Teeple at the office at 519-485-2490 ext. 221 for more information.


