Message from the Mayor - Margaret Lupton



As I was preparing to write this article I reviewed my blog on the Township site. It is not possible for me to cover all issues in the space allowed in this magazine. I encourage you who

are able, to go online to the Township site for more complete coverage - www.zorra.on.ca

By the time you read this Mike Heath will be competing in London at the Paralympics. To have a Zorra Olympian is an amazing thing and I have extended to him the best wishes of all residents. When he returns, I hope to have him appear at Council to discuss his recent experiences. Groups planning programmes for the fall might consider inviting Mike and his Mother, Kelly, as they are certainly motivational speakers for people of all ages.

Our Recreation Department has had a busy summer with extra cleaning and repair activities in all facilities. The pool reopening at Thamesford was a very special, well attended event. The pool is now much more accessible with a set of steps into the water and much improved change rooms. A new funding programme was announced by the Federal government and we have submitted three applications for assistance: Thamesford Arenacompressor and lighting; Harrington Hallwheelchair ramp and chair lift; and North Park- ball diamond improvements. These projects came as recommendations from ZRAC-after much deliberation-and now we wait for award announcements.

John McFarlan is our new Fire Chief. The reorganization of the department has been a long process and mistakes have been made but we think we have things right this time and certainly I am hearing good things from the firemen. A new Chief will have to be appointed for Thamesford and I hope to have that announcement very soon.

Chief McFarlan mentioned today the need for emergency water sources when fighting fires. It would seem that perhaps the ponds in gravel pits might be a ready source. Investigations will be done but I think this might be one way for pit owners to contribute in a very meaningful way to our community.

I am certain many have been inconvenienced this summer because of watering restrictions and fire bans. Thank you for your patience and cooperation. Concerns have been expressed as to whether residents are actually using too much water or if the supply is perhaps too small. This is being investigated.

The people of Taiwan have presented Zorra with a five volume set of books containing more information about the work of Dr. George Leslie Mackay. These are available at the Township Office for your use.

Staff announced recently that many of the Township forms needed by residents are available online and many can be returned the same way. Check the website!

Earlier this week, Don MacLeod, Marie Keasey and I met with OPP Inspector Clark regarding policing issues. It would seem that the department feels it is giving Zorra good coverage and that they are actively patrolling for speeding issues as is indicated by the number of tickets issued. There is a feeling that residents concerned with speeding vehicles think traffic is moving more quickly than it is. I believe it might be worthwhile having a radar gun for people to use and perhaps see if this is true. The speed sign has been in Zorra thirteen times since the beginning of the year and is to return shortly. Our Public Works department is using a traffic counter that also records speed. We are trying very hard to find ways to control speeders. Council is considering lowering speed limits in residential areas to 40km. This might not slow people down initially but more significant fines might increases awareness. Your suggestions would be most welcome.

Embro residents are asking about billing for the drainage work done during the sewer project. I have just learned that Staff is investigating programs being initiated in other areas whereby instead of large bills being sent to each landowner for their share of the cost, consideration is being given to initiating a monthly fee of \$8-10 which would cover not only the capital costs but also ongoing maintenance and repair costs. More information will be provided as it becomes available.

County Council will soon be starting the budget process. Zorra Councillors are being asked to consider an earlier schedule. I am interested in your comments and suggestions in this very important part of our work. So please contact me regarding this.

BOULEVARD BY-LAW

The Township of Zorra Council recently enacted By-law 50-12 to Govern and regulate the maintenance, occupancy, use of, and other matters pertaining to, those portions of public highways under the jurisdiction of the Township of Zorra known as boulevards. The purpose of the by-law is to improve boulevard maintenance, safety and aesthetics throughout the Township. By-law 50-12 defines "Boulevard" as "that part of a Highway (whether assumed or unassumed by the Township) between a Street Line and the edge of the curb or, where there is no curb, that portion of the Highway Road Allowance between the travelled portion to the Street Line. A Boulevard may or may not contain a sidewalk. A boulevard must be in a serviced area of the Township as defined in the Official Plan." By-law requirements are as follows, but not limited to:

- Clean and Clear the Abutting Boulevard of all debris, waste, refuse and litter;
- Clean and Clear the Abutting Boulevard of any abandoned items, machinery, equipment or other thing;
- Maintain grass and weeds on any Abutting Boulevard at a height which is not greater than twenty (20) cm [eight (8) in] in height;
- Maintain the Landscaping on any Abutting Boulevard so that Landscaping materials do not encroach over that portion of an adjacent Highway that is travelled or designed to be travelled by Vehicles, adjacent driveway or sidewalk.

If the by-law enforcement officer is satisfied that a contravention of the bylaw has occurred, the officer may make a Work Order requiring the person who contravened the by-law or who caused or permitted the contravention or the owner or occupier of the land to do the work to correct the contravention. Failure to correct the contravention will allow the Corporation of the Township of Zorra to have the property brought into compliance and recover the costs incurred from the person directed.

DUMPING ON PRIVATE PROPERTY

Please be advised that it is a violation of the Waste Disposal By-law 70-1978 to dump refuse on any land in Zorra Township. Refuse includes but is not limited to: garbage, domestic or industrial waste, automotive parts, tires, material resulting from construction or demolition projects, paper or cardboard packaging, animal remains, rubber, mechanical equipment or parts, soil, concrete, bricks, plastic containers, glass containers etc.

All evidence of dumping will be thoroughly investigated by the By-law Enforcement Officer. The results of the investigation may include in a Provincial Offences Notice of \$500.00. Please contact By-law Enforcement with any questions related to Dumping.

POOL FENCING REQUIREMENTS

Please be advised that every owner of a privately owned swimming pool in Zorra Township shall erect and maintain a fence completely surrounding such pool in accordance with the provisions of By-law No. 23-08 known as the Pool Fencing By-law.

A privately owned swimming pool is any type of pool, when filled, contains a depth of 18 inches or more of water at any given section and is not enclosed and covered by an accessory structure but does not include fish ponds, hot tubs, spas or irrigation ponds. If the pool is an above-ground swimming pool a fence is not required if the structure is at least 4 feet in height above grade, and has no permanently attached ladder which is removed when the pool in not in use. It cannot contain any exterior foothold or handholds including a pump or accessory appurtenance or structure.

Where a deck is erected at or near the rim level of an above-ground privately owned swimming pool, the deck shall be fenced and gated and such deck fencing and gates shall conform to the requirements In addition, no owner shall fill a privately owned swimming pool with water or allow water to remain therein unless a fence has been erected in accordance with the bylaw.


Once the fencing has been completed to the specifications as outlined in the by-law, the owner shall notify the Chief Building Official or the Township Building Inspector within 24 hours or by the next business day so that an inspection may be conducted.

Special Occasion Permits (SOP) are for the sale and service of beverage alcohol at special occasions such as weddings, charity fundraisers, receptions etc. Special Occasion Permits are issued through select Liquor Control Board of Ontario ("LCBO") stores throughout the province. For further information and access to the application form visit: http://www.agco.on.ca/ PLEASE NOTE: As of June 1, 2011, for outdoor events, the permit holder must at least 30 days prior to the event, write to the local municipality, police, and fire and health departments informing them of the event. The building department must be notified as well if a tent or marquee is used. 

PRE-AUTHORIZED PAYMENT PLAN FOR PROPERTY TAXES

Benefits of the monthly plan

- Easy to budget by spreading payments over ten (10) equal payments withdrawn automatically from your bank account.
- Saves cost of postage or cost of driving to municipal office to pay your taxes.
- Avoid late payment or worry about missing due dates.

How much does it cost?

- There are no service charges or penalties for using the Pre-authorized Payment Plan.
- The amounts deducted are based only on taxes levied.

Who may enrol?

- You must have no arrears outstanding on your tax account.
- Your taxes are not included in your mortgage payments.

How the monthly plan works

• Your annual tax levy will be estimated based on the prior year's actual taxes, and divided into ten (10) equal payments. This amount will be deducted directly from your bank account on the last working day of the month from January to July. Once the actual tax rates have been established for the year, the

amount from August to October will be adjusted accordingly.

- Your enrolment in the Pre-Authorized Payment Plan will be confirmed by letter or email indicating the amount to be withdrawn from your account on a monthly basis.
- Your final tax bill will be receipted and mailed to you.

Or Four pre-authorized payments

- If would like your four (4) regular tax instalments to be withdrawn automatically from your bank account.
- This may be great idea for those that like to go south for the winter, no worries about leaving the post-dated cheque at the office, or getting someone else to pay the instalment.

If you are interested in enrolling in this payment plan for 2013, you can find an authorization form on our website at www.zorra.on.ca or call Kelly Hall at 485-2490 ext. 222. Applications need to be submitted as soon as possible to ensure enrolment for 2013.

If you are currently enrolled in the pre-authorized payment plan, you do not have to re-apply each year, only if there is a change with the account.

Online or telephone banking is available for making monthly, arrears, or regular installments. All banks accept Zorra as a client and the account number required is your ROLL NUMBER from your tax bill.

VACANCY REBATE PROGRAM

If your commercial or industrial property was vacant for a period of up to three months for 2012 you are eligible for a vacancy rebate. Applications can be found on our website or picked up at the Township Office. The deadline for filing is February 28, 2013.

JUST A REMINDER, if you remove a structure from your property, it is your responsibility to contact our office to have the structure written off.

Township of Zorra Fire Department Message from Chief McFarlan

s the newly appointed full time Fire Chief of Zorra, I'd first like to thank everyone for all the cards, letters, and emails. It is very humbling to have the support of so many as I take on the new challenges of the Fire Service for Zorra Township.

Although fire prevention is a 24/7/365 days a year, ongoing practice, the hustle and bustle of everyday life seems to lower our guard, or numb us to the possibility of fires within our homes and workplaces. It is for this reason that each fall

the Fire Services across both Canada and the United States rally together to bring fire safety and prevention to the forefront of our busy lives. This year, October 7th to October 13th, 2012 is Fire Prevention Week with the theme "HAVE 2 WAYS OUT."

Your three fire stations within Zorra Fire and Emergency Service - Embro, Thamesford and Uniondale, will be busy visiting the schools within Zorra, spreading the word and practice of "HAVE 2 WAYS OUT." Your children may even bring home some fire prevention "homework" for you to assist them with. I urge you to take a few moments to spend doing this with them. We don't want to miss the empty nesters either! (Those without children in school). If you belong to a group, service club or organization, we will gladly bring our message to you and your group. Please contact any one of the three stations in Zorra, or give me a call at the Township office (519-485-2490 ext. 240)

Everyone should have a fire escape plan with "2 WAYS OUT" and practice

it with your family and visitors. Set your predetermined safe meeting spot, and always remember to "GET OUT and STAY OUT!" I also cannot stress enough the importance of working smoke detectors and the proper placement of them within your home or workplace. Test and check your smoke detectors on a monthly basis to ensure they are in good working order. The Zorra Fire and Emergency Service has had a very busy year to date responding to over one hundred calls. Our emergency calls not only include fire, but encompass medical calls and assistance, motor vehicle accidents, and ice/water rescue but to mention a few. Our 58 volunteer firefighters train a minimum of twice per month to keep their skills honed and up-to-date, ready for when they receive a call. Throughout the year, your fire stations hold special events and fundraisers to assist them with costs associated

> with special training and equipment purchases. Do come out and support their efforts.

With the drought like conditions this summer, a County wide fire ban was implemented to help curtail and prevent the potential of wildfires. Despite these measures, we still had three major burns within our immediate area, some of which required participation from all three Zorra Stations and two adjoining municipalities.

The Township of Zorra has an "Open Air Burn" by-law that requires you to obtain a permit PRIOR to having large open air burns. Small bonfires contained in burn barrels or rings are exempt from the permit, but must be tended to at all times and extinguished prior to leaving unattended. The permit is available at no cost and can be found and completed on the Zorra web page www.zorra.on.ca Take the time to familiarize yourself with the requirements and usage of the permit.

Please help me keep both you, and our firefighters' safe by being vigilant

about fire prevention and safety in both your home and work place. Remember, "HAVE 2 WAYS OUT."

Zorra is a great place to live and do business. By working together, we can keep it a safe one!

The Ontario Fire Code requires that an operational smoke alarm be installed on every floor level of your home and outside of all sleeping areas.

- If anyone in your household sleeps with the bedroom door closed, consider installing a smoke alarm inside the bedroom
- On floor levels not containing sleeping areas, install smoke alarms in the living area or at stairwells leading to an upper level
- Do not install smoke alarms closer than 1m (3') to kitchens or bathrooms (to prevent false alarms)
- Install smoke alarms high on a wall or on the ceiling. If mounting on a wall, position the top of the smoke alarm approximately 10-30cm (4"-12") from the ceiling. If mounting on a ceiling, position the alarm at least 10cm (4") away from the wall
- Do not install smoke alarms near heating registers where air movement may affect products of combustion from entering the smoke alarm sensing chamber



Have you heard about HEROES OF ZORRA?

..... coming soon to a computer near you

If you haven't yet had the chance to hear and learn about HEROES OF ZORRA, this is your opportunity. HEROES OF ZORRA will be a website available on the internet that is dedicated to recognizing ALL of the many individuals from the Township of Zorra (formerly the Townships of West Zorra, East Nissouri and North Oxford) who have served our country from the 1860's to present day. Once this site is constructed and available, it will be a valuable resource to students, teachers, family members, those researching their family history, those with a special interest in the Military, and the list goes on. Whether a relative, friend or neighbour, every one of us has been touched by the realities of war.

The idea for such a website is the result of local residents of Zorra attending a Military Funeral Honors & Memorial Ceremony in Los Angeles, California on May 15, 2010. This event was hosted by the Government of the United States of America and the California Medal of Honor Project. It was to honor Benjamin Franklin Youngs, one of our own 'Sons of Zorra', as the recipient of a Medal of Honor. Youngs earned this Medal on June 17, 1864 during the battles of the Civil War. Advancing on Petersburg, Youngs captured the Confederate flag from the 35th North Carolina Regiment. He jumped over the breastworks and into the thick of battle, held the flag, and turned it over to his commanding general. This resulted in a promotion to Sergeant and in December 1864 Youngs was presented the Medal. He was 19 years old.

When the event concluded the Canadian attendees were asked what Zorra would be doing to recognize one of its own? After a number of meetings and discussions it was decided that if we were going to volunteer our time and energy towards something, we wanted it to be of interest to many and something that could be built upon in the years to come. Hence, the idea of a website that would recognize all of those from Zorra who have given service to their Country. With sincere gratitude to those volunteers who dedicated many hours to writing our local history books, the Military sections of these books will form the basis of this website. What is different is that any individuals who were inadvertently omitted, and those serving up to present day can now be included on this ever growing and evolving information highway.

In the next 3 months (September to December) we will be asking the residents and businesses of Zorra to help us in accomplishing this task. We need your support in helping us to make this happen. Together we can make this unique resource available to you, your family and our descendents.

Beachville District

Beachville was the heart of Oxford County and possesses a fascinating history. It was one of the first settlements in Oxford since 1791, when it was first founded. Some other firsts: The first ever recorded Baseball game in North American history, first gristmill, post office, Catholic Mass and some of the largest open faced quarries in Canada.

The Beachville District Museum is situated on 4.5 acres of lush park- land. In 1851 Philander King built the first story then it changed hands several times. John Downing purchased it in 1880, he was one of the founders of the limestone quarries. In 1902 the second story was added and the house remained with the family until they sold it in 1969. Beachville District Historical Society bought it for \$2.00 in 1992 from Beachville Lime Ltd.

The Museums houses many interesting artifacts from Mastodon bones found on the O.j, Bond farm, a history of the limestone quarries and a baseball display describing the first baseball game.

The museums two agricultural buildings contain a vast array of agricultural implements, and tractors, also miniature buildings hand crafted by Mr. Wray Prouse formerly of Mount Elgin.

If you are planning on a wedding, family reunion, wedding photographs or even a picnic, Beachville District Museum has the perfect site. Call to reserve, we can accommodate almost anything.

At the Beachville District Museum there is always something going on, our special exhibits change year round, the feature exhibit being "A History of the Amish and Mennonites in our Area." Followed by an exhibit on scrapbooking coming out late this summer, we will also be having people come in to do a few classes on scrapbooking for anybody who is interested. We are currently looking for scrapbooks to use in our display, and would love to see any that people would like to have displayed in the exhibit.
