

Message from the Mayor

As I listed the events I want to include in this edition I was surprised at the number. I will try to include as many as I can.

Congratulations to Tony Kelly and his wife, Pat, on the Open House held for them recognizing their many contributions to Thamesford and area during the 40 plus

years they lived there. Council was pleased to present to them with a Distinguished Volunteer Service Award and I know the community wishes them many years of happy retirement in London.

Work continues on our Strategic Plan. As a Council we started with a plan to develop a list of Aims and Goals for this term of Council but it has now become a full Strategic Plan. Turnout at the public meetings was disappointing as to numbers but excellent ideas were proposed. When finalized the plan with be a definite guideline as we make decisions on projects, etc. we will undertake and/or support in Zorra. Responses to agenda items will be decided based on guidelines derived from the Strategic Plan.

Some of you may have heard that a natural gas pipeline is to be installed next year along the 41st line north of the Hickson side road. It would seem that a natural benefit would be access to the gas by neighbouring residents. We are working to see if we can find a way to persuade Union Gas to provide this—perhaps as a pilot project—as it would seem they have not done this previously in other projects and have reservations about doing it now. However the need by many farmers is very real and Council is committed to trying to find a way to make this work.

One very pleasant event early this fall was our Volunteer Breakfast. A full buffet meal was served to nearly 50 people. We hope next year to combine it with an invitation especially for seniors and entertain both groups as a thank you for their contributions to Zorra over the years.

People have asked if I am happy with the results of the Federal Election. It really doesn't matter if the party elected was or was not of your choice. Once the decision is made we all have to get behind the decision and help to make the government work for the benefit of all. This was one of the first lessons I learned in municipal politics. The same thing goes for decisions made at Council meetings. Once the decision is made it is up to all of Council to support the path chosen.

County Council participated in a very interesting activity in October called "Virtual Dementia Training". In groups we were outfitted with apparatus to limit our sight and/or hearing, heavy gloves and uncomfortable inserts in our shoes and then tried to follow directions to perform simple tasks. We learned something of the frustration that must be experienced by people with dementia as they go about daily living. Hopefully lessons learned will assist us as we make decisions re accessibility issues.

In late October members of Staff and Council planted 700 red and white tulip bulbs in the area surrounding the monument on the grounds of the Township Office. We received these bulbs free of charge through a project of the Vessey company. They donated similar numbers to 140 organizations across Canada (approximately 100,000 bulbs in total) recognizing the original donation by the Dutch Government to Canada 70 years ago. Next spring these Dutch-Canadian Friendship gardens will be formally recognized. You will get information of the particulars and we hope community members will join us for a celebration.

The new Waste Management collection programme started mid-September. There were a few "bumps" in the beginning but things seem to be working smoothly now. Many residents report larger recycling amounts now that it is picked up weekly and the collection of plastic film has been well received.

We took "Council on the Road" to A.J. Baker and Thamesford schools with excellent receptions by the students. In both cases they used the meeting as an opportunity to make presentations to Council which led to excellent discussions. Clerk Karen Martin and I returned to each school two days later for "debriefing" when the young people had an opportunity to question us on what had happened during each meeting. This was a very worthwhile exercise for Council and for the students studying local government. Preparation at the schools was very impressive.

As this is the last Zorra News of the year I want to wish all of you a wonderful Christmas season. Whether you celebrate or not I hope you take the opportunity to spend time with family and friends and that we all join together in praying for, and working towards, peace throughout our world. Best wishes from all of us who work on your behalf for the Township of Zorra.

WINTER ROADWAY MAINTENANCE

ON TOWNSHIP OF ZORRA ROADS

The winter level of service to be delivered is prescribed in the Minimum Maintenance Standards – Ontario Regulation 239/02 regarding snow and ice control. The Minimum Maintenance Standards are a regulation of the Municipal Act, 2001. Service will be delivered during the following hours: Monday to Friday - 7:00 a.m. to 3:30 p.m. with additional hours as determined by weather conditions Saturday, Sunday, holidays - as determined by weather conditions.

REDUCED LOAD SEASON

An early reminder to all drivers of heavy trucks and equipment that the reduced load season takes effect for the period of February 15 to April 30 inclusive each year. In accordance with By-law 21-03, signs will be posted on applicable Township roadways.

HALF LOAD SEASON RATIONALE

- Minimize Long Term Damage to Infrastructure
- Problems caused when Roads are soft often require major repairs
- Prevent additional Damage to Culverts and Bridges
- Heavy loads do Damage to Road Sub-base that is difficult to detect
- Changes in the size of agricultural equipment i.e. Large Liquid Manure Trailers
- Multiple Aggregate Producers in Township
- Infrastructure repair costs borne directly or indirectly by residents

All of the above lead to safety issues during Half Load Season.

WHY NOT PAY YOUR TAXES MONTHLY?

Sign up now for the 10 or 12 month Pre-Authorized Payment Plan for 2016.

If you are interested in enrolling in this payment plan for 2016, you can find an authorization form on our website at www.zorra.on.ca or call Kelly at 519-485-2490 ext 222. Applications need to be submitted as soon as possible to ensure enrolment for 2016.

If you are currently enrolled in the pre-authorized payment plan, you DO NOT have to re-apply each year, only if there is a change with the account.

WHY NOT TRY PAYING YOUR TAXES ON-LINE?

Online or telephone banking is available for making monthly, arrears, or regular instalments. All banks accept Zorra as a client and the account number required is your ROLL NUMBER from your tax bill, starting after 3227.

COMMERCIAL & INDUSTRIAL PROPERTY OWNERS ONLY.

VACANCY REBATE PROGRAM

If your commercial or industrial property was vacant for a period of up to three months for 2015 you are eligible for a vacancy rebate. Applications can be found on our website or picked up at the Township Office. The deadline for filing is February 29, 2016

MUNICIPAL PROPERTY ASSESSMENT CORPORATION (MPAC)

MPAC is a not-for-profit corporation funded by all Ontario municipalities. MPAC's roll is to accurately value and classify all properties in Ontario in compliance with the Assessment Act and related regulations set by the Government of Ontario.

Learn how & why your property was assessed the way it was with AboutMyProperty. You can also compare your property assessment with others in your neighbourhood and community, all free of charge. Look for your Roll number and Access key on your Property Assessment Notice and visit www.aboutmyproperty.ca

Also filing a Request for Reconsideration (RfR) is a pre-condition to filing an Assessment Review Board (ARB) appeal for properties in the residential, farm or managed forests property class. The deadline to file an RfR is March 31, 2015.

WHEN WILL MY 2016 TAX BILL BE MAILED?

They will be mailed the 1st week of February, with due dates of Feb 29 and May 31, 2016. Unfortunately, legislation states that the municipality is only allowed to bill half of the previous year's taxes, therefore an increase/decrease in taxes for ratepayers will not be until the Final 2016 Tax Bill which are processed in August 2016.

Ride To School in the Fire Truck!

Zorra Fire and Emergency Services provided a "Ride to School" in the Fire Truck for the Campbell Family who purchased the ride during the Fun Fair Auction last summer.

The ride was Monday, October 5, 2015 to kick of Fire Prevention Week.

The Uniondale District Fire Chief, Paul Mitchell picked up the two children just before 9 AM outfitted them with fire helmet, coat and a pager before heading to AJ Baker Public School for just after announcements. The entire school was waiting at the front of the school as the fire truck pulled up to drop them off for the day.



Keep Fire Safety in Mind as Temperatures Drop!

Zorra Fire & Emergency Services is urging everyone to keep fire safety in mind as the temperatures turn colder.

Unfortunately, we often see more home fires during the winter months due to heating equipment and appliances. People need to pay close attention to potential fire hazards such as fireplaces, furnaces, chimneys and vents, and space heaters.

There are some simple things people can do to stay fire safe during the colder months:

- Have all fuel-burning appliances inspected annually by a registered fuel contractor. Go to COSafety.ca to find a contractor near you.
- Keep chimneys and intake/exhaust vents for furnaces and heating appliances free of debris, ice and snow accumulations to reduce the risk of carbon monoxide (CO) build-up from inefficient combustion.
- Burn dry, well-seasoned wood in fireplaces and woodstoves to reduce the risk of excessive creosote build-up in chimneys.
- Allow ashes from your fireplace or woodstove to cool before emptying them into a metal container with a tight-fitting lid. Keep the container outside.
- Keep space heaters at least one metre (3 feet) away from anything that can burn, including curtains, upholstery and clothing.

- Replace worn or damaged electrical wires and connections on vehicles and extension cords and use the proper gauge extension cord for vehicle block heaters.
- Consider using approved timers for vehicle block heaters rather than leaving heaters on all night.
- Ensure that vehicles are not left running inside any garage or building.
- Ensure there is a working smoke alarm on every storey and outside all sleeping areas of your home.
- Install CO alarms to alert you to the presence of this deadly gas.

Zorra Fire & Emergency Services reminds everyone that the Ontario Fire Code requires smoke alarms to be installed on every storey of your home and outside all sleeping areas. Carbon monoxide alarms are required outside all sleeping areas if the home has a fuel-burning appliance, a fireplace or an attached garage.

Protect yourself and your loved ones, install and maintain your smoke and carbon monoxide alarms. For more information about smoke and carbon monoxide alarms, or fire safety, contact Fire Chief John McFarlan at 519-485-2490, Ext 240.

The purpose of the application is to amend two sections of the General Provisions Section of the Township of Zorra Zoning By-law 35-99, being:

To amend Table 5.1.1.3 Regulations for Accessory Uses - to permit a maximum lot coverage of accessory buildings and structures of 10% of lot area of 170 m² (1,830 ft²) within RR and RE zones; and

To amend Section 5.19 – Parking Provisions – to introduce new accessibility parking standards in order to be consistent with the requirements of the Accessibility for Ontarian's with Disabilities Act, 2005.

By-Law Enforcement

RECREATIONAL VEHICLES (RV's):

If you are an owner of a recreational vehicle (including trailers and boats) and you reside in a Residential Zone, please keep in mind that the Zoning By-law regulates both the size of RV/boat, location, and length of time to which it can be parked in your driveway.

'The owner or occupant of any lot in a Residential Zone may store or park not more than two recreational vehicles that do not exceed 9m (29.5 ft) in total length in the front yard 'of such lot for a total period of not more than 72 hours in one calendar month.'

You may park your RV at the interior side lot and or rear yard provided that it is more than 1 metre from the lot line.

WINTER PARKING

Please be advised that the winter parking restrictions will be enforced starting November 15th and remain in place until March 31, 2016. Parking is not permitted on any road or street from 1:00 a.m. to 8:00 a.m. 7 days a week during this period. Any vehicle owner found in violation of this by-law could be fined or have their vehicle removed/towed at owners expense. The fine for this violation is set at \$50.

SNOW REMOVAL ONTO ROADWAYS

This is a reminder to all residents that depositing snow from private property onto a public roadway is dangerous and in contravention of the Road Protection By-law 6-95. Pushing or placing any snow or ice or any other obstruction of a roadway is an offence that carries a Provincial Offences Fine of \$105.00.

MOTORIZED VEHICLES

Please note that the Motorized Vehicle By-law 18-90, prohibits motorized vehicles in public parks within Zorra Township and is subject to a Provincial Offences Charge \$105. Motorized vehicles includes but is not limited to recreational allterrain vehicles (ATV's) and snowmobiles.

Parks prohibiting motorized vehicles are as follows: Thamesford District Recreation Centre — Entire property, Grace Patterson Park, Thamesford North Park, Bob Fisher Soccer Field, Lions (South) Park, Matheson Park, Community Centre Park, Wallace Park, Memorial Park and Harrington Park NOTE: Unless permission is obtained from property owner, ATVs and Snowmobiles are prohibited on private property. All trespassing complaints should be forwarded to the Ontario Provincial Police.

SMOKING REGULATIONS

Please note that smoking and the use of smoking products is prohibited at any Township facility, including but not limited to municipal parkland, playground equipment, sports fields and spectator seating, at all times. Regardless of whether or not there is a "No Smoking" sign posted.



THEFT OF HISTORICAL SIGNAGE

There has been a number of Historical signs stolen from locations around the Township of Zorra. The Township of Zorra intends on pursuing criminal charges to anyone caught stealing signage or is in the possession of stolen property of any Township asset. Theft is a Criminal Offence described under Section 322 of the Criminal Code of Canada. The maximum punishment is set at 6 months imprisonment and or a \$2,000 fine. Township of Zorra 2016-2018 Dog Tag Campaign

It's easy and it's the law!

*** NEW *** Representatives from the Township will no longer be going door-to-door to sell dog tags. The onus is on the dog owner to have their dog registered by December 31, 2015. We hope that you will find this new initiative more convenient. The price for a dog tag remains unchanged at \$15.00 per dog per year and we have raised the maximum number of dogs from 2 to 3 on all Zorra properties. Online forms are available www.zorra.on.ca or you can contact the office by email admin@zorra.on.ca or by phone 519-485-2490 Ext 221 for your new tag. Payment methods include cash, cheque, debit, or charge to taxes.

Failure to obtain a dog tag may result in a fine of \$125.00.

Visit the Township office or mail the completed application form (on back) with your payment to Township of Zorra 274620 27th Line, PO Box 306, Ingersoll, ON N5C 3K5.

*** New Animal Care and Control By-law 43-15 ***

- Requires all dogs over 3 months of age to be licensed with the Township.
- Dog owners are required to obtain a dog tag by December 31, 2015.
- Failure to register your dog may result in a fine of \$125.
- A valid tag will assist animal control staff in returning your dog should it ever become separated from you.
- A maximum of 3 dogs are permitted in each dwelling.
- Prohibits or regulates the running at large of dogs within the Township of Zorra. All dogs in Zorra must be kept on a leash when not on the owner's property. If a dog strays it can be impounded and its owners can be fined for "permitting a dog to run at large." The dog that is impounded is not being punished but rather protected.
- To protect individuals and other pets from disease, Zorra requires that any person who owns, harbours
 or possesses a dog shall immediately remove and sanitarily dispose of any feces (droppings) of the
 dog. Failure to do so may result in the owner being fined.
- Canine Service Animals, Livestock Guardian Dogs, Police Working Dogs, and Dangerous Dogs shall only be licensed at the Township Administration Office.
- Kennel licenses can be issued to Canadian Kennel Club (CKC) members only and proof of valid CKC membership is required. Kennel licenses will now also require an approved Site Plan, must adhere to minimum standards, and will be subject to an annual inspection. Kennel licenses are issued at the Township office only.
- All dog owners must adhere to the minimum health and general well-being standards.
- PROVINCIAL LEGISLATION REQUIRES THAT ALL DOGS HAVE CURRENT RABIES VACCINATIONS.
- All animal bites should be immediately reported to The Oxford County Board of Health at 519-539-9800.
- By-Law 69-12 Noise By-law. Barking dogs are an annoyance and a nuisance. Barking falls under the Noise By-Law which is enforced by the Zorra By-Law Enforcement Officer.



Waste Management and Special Collection Programs



Garbage and recycling pick-up is offered weekly in new trucks that now allow for single stream recycling – meaning all your recyclables can now go into the same blue box

Your garbage and recycling pick-up is collected on all statutory holidays with the exception of Christmas Day and New Year's Day. Check the new Waste Management Calendar to see when your collection day is and always have your garbage and recycling set out to the curb by 7:00 a.m.

Check out Oxford County's new mobile app called Wasteline. Wasteline is available now to download personalized curbside collection calendars, check on recyclables quickly using a search bar, or sign up for automated reminders by text, email, phone or Twitter message.

Wasteline tools are for use by residents in all eight of Oxford's area municipalities and can be found:

- at www.wasteline.ca;
- in your mobile device's App Store or Google Play; and
- on your local municipality's website.

The new waste management program as approved by Council in February 2015 following two years of study and community consultation. The new program offers better service for a lower cost, with a smaller environmental footprint.







TOWNSHIP OF ZORRA MEMORIAL TREE PROGRAM

Memorial Trees can be purchased, in memory of loved ones, at the Township Office for \$40.00 through the Upper Thames River Conservation Authority (UTRCA). Individuals may also have their loved ones name added to a memorial tree sign when they purchase a tree for an additional fee per. Signs are located at Grace Patterson Park in Thamesford, Embro Conservation Area and Harrington Conservation Area. The trees are planted in various locations throughout Zorra on Township or UTRCA property at a predetermined location. Approximately 60 trees, usually 6'-8' sugar maples, have been planted throughout the Township since the start of this program in 1995. TOWNSHIP OF ZORRA MEMORIAL TREE FOREST

Zorra Township has partnered with Brock and Visser Funeral Home – Thamesford Chapel and UTRCA to have trees planted in memory of those individuals whose funeral arrangements have been conducted through Brock and Visser Funeral Home. TOWNSHIP OF ZORRA REPLACEMENT TREE PROGRAM

Currently when the Township of Zorra Public Works staff take down a tree along a road side or near private property, they offer the land owner two trees to replace the one that was removed. The two trees are for planting on their private property. In 2015, 150 6'-8' sugar maple trees were planted through this program. UTRCA PRIVATE LANDS PROGRAM

Landowners who reside in the Upper Thames River watershed and own a minimum of 2.5 acres of property are eligible to participate in the UTRCA's Tree Planting on Private Lands program. The program offers large stock trees and seedlings. For further details visit the UTRCA website at www.thamesriver.on.ca .

COUNTY OF OXFORD TREE PROGRAM

Currently, if trees are removed on the County's road allowance, the County of Oxford will replace the trees, if the landowner is willing to plant on their own property and not the road allowance. The trees are replaced using a 1 to 1 ratio. As for the species, it typically is native to the area and depends on the soil conditions. Oxford County 4-H has been busy this year celebrating 100 years of 4-H in Ontario throughout the County.

The Oxford County 4-H Association started the year off with a new pop-up banner showcasing 4-H in Oxford over the past 7 decades, and a 4' x 8' sign promoting the anniversary. The sign has been in parades and placed at homes and businesses around the county. There was a 4-H Celebration dinner at the Embro Fair in September with past, present and future 4-H members and volunteers participating in the event. Oxford County 4-H Association sponsored the '4-H Artistic Display' fair class at the 5 Oxford fairs, where Amy Loggan's entry consistently took the top placing. The 14 seed pictures were then taken to the Royal Agricultural Winter Fair in Toronto for the 4-H Artistic Display competition, with Emily Schwartzentruber placing 6th, Amy Loggan 9th, Amy Gras 10th and Hannah Van Boekel 11th out of 30 entries. In October, 100 trees for 100 years were planted at Pittock Conservation Area with sponsorship from Cargill Community Care program, Clarke Abbey Memorial funds, George Thornton Bequest funds, and Oxford County 4-H Association, and support from the Upper Thames River Conservation Authority.

Oxford 4-H welcomed 53 new members and 177 returning members for a total of 230 members completing 28 projects in 15 clubs. There were

five Dairy clubs (Bennington-Cody's, Bonds, East Nissouri, Ingersoll Kiwanis, Tavistock), whose members participated at various cattle shows in the county and region and at the Royal Agricultural Winter Fair, one Swine Club and two County-wide clubs, one specially formed to spearhead celebrations in the County for the Anniversary of 4-H in Ontario, and one exploring the fun, sportsmanship and safety aspects of Paintball (this one was run as an Oxford - Middlesex collaboration). Six Lifeskills clubs explored projects ranging from cooking, sewing, gardening, drama, heritage, woodworking, crafting, conservation, social recreation, pottery and Lego. Brooksdale offered Explore 4-H – an overview of all things 4-H – The Power of Produce, Lego Engineering, Lego Solar, Wind and Water, and Sew Easy. Embro 2 offered All Manner of Red Meat. Hickson offered Small Engines, the Cookie Club, the Potato Club and a craft club featuring Artistic Seed Display – a special class sponsored by Oxford 4-H at fairs in our county. Mt Elgin was busy completing projects on Chocolate, Drama, Woodworking, Our Heritage, and Community Involvement which included blankets made and donated to DASO and pillowcases made and donated to the cancer patients at London Sick Kids Hospital. Oxford Centre offered Trash to Treasure and Focus on Fun. Thamesford was able to offer a project on Pottery with support from the FCC 4-H Club Fund. This allowed them to use the facilities of the London Clay Art Centre with assistance

from the Potters Guild. They also offered Lego, Social recreation, A Walk on the Wildside and A World of Food in Canada. As well, the Community Club explored Community Involvement where the members raised over \$12,000 for their Relay for Life team.

There were 6 teams of Oxford 4-H members participating in the Go For The Gold (trivia game about 4-H projects & local information) competition in July. Two teams advanced to the Regional Go For The Gold in Shedden where one team placed second.

The 2015 4-H Achievement Awards were presented at the Oxford County 4-H Awards Night, November 20 at the Embro West Zorra Community Center. The evening started with a pot luck dinner and then enjoyed guest speaker Andrew Campbell, who is engaged in using social media for promoting and educating about agriculture while he is busy on the family dairy farm and with various organizations, such as 4-H and other farm-related organizations.

The Gay Lea Awards of Achievement for completing 24 4-H projects and being in 4-H for 5 years were presented by Steve Veldman to Tom Jackson, Trent Jones and Ashley Skillings.

The Janet Wilson Outstanding 4-H Member Awards, sponsored by Woodstock Nursing friends and Janet Wilson memorial funds, were presented by Ross Wilson & family for the Novice female & male—Erin Shrigley/Keeton Jones; Junior female & male—Laura Witmer/Brayden Gras; and Intermediate female & male—Jessie Carberry/Lucas Swartzentruber. The Outstanding Agricultural 4-H Member Award, sponsored by Ontario Plowmen's Association, was presented by Eric Howard to Tanner Jones. The Outstanding Overall 4-H Member Award, sponsored by Your Neighbourhood Credit Union, was presented by Sandra Eedy to Elizabeth Bruce.
