Message from the Mayor

Summer is moving along at a rapid rate with many events happening as Zorra celebrates Canada's 150th. Business continues for both Zorra and County Councils. The usual summer lull is just not happening.

I am pleased to see the "Historically" signs around our Township and glad that their destruction by petty thieves seems to be under control. If we have missed your particular historic crossroad please contact me as we want to recognize as many as we can.

In the lobby of our office building we have an area now devoted to displaying work of Zorra artists and businesses. So far we have had displays of jewellery, pottery, figurines, coffee, paintings, etc. Very soon I hope to highlight quilting and braided rugs. Some of the articles are priced to sell—at the artist's discretion. We are always looking for new items to display. If you have such items or know of residents who do, please let me know. I think it is important for people to see the fine work being done by residents of Zorra.

One of the County committees I serve on is "Zero Waste"—although I have commented that I think it would be better called "Towards Zero Waste". Right now the work is very technical as they are studying directions the County will take sometime in the future when the present landfill reaches capacity. There are some very exciting proposals being developed and committee members are evaluating possibilities. Zorra Council hosted one such presentation recently. It is truly amazing the techniques being explored—certainly if they are feasible they would be much preferred to burying future waste in the ground.

Another idea being worked on is encouraging groups within the County to plan their events to a "zero waste standard". There are many who have already attempted this with excellent results and who are willing to help other groups get started. We plan to provide a guide early this fall with ideas of how to accomplish this goal. It is our hope

that every organization will at least attempt one or two of the suggestions and then be encouraged to try even more steps in order to make their events zero waste producers. This is just not for major events but also for regular meeting and gatherings.

This is turning out to be a Waste Management article but those of you who know me recognize how interested I am in this field. I also heard that the landfill is working on being able to accept payment for loads delivered in ways other than cash. So many people have asked about this and the changes are coming.

Concerns have been expressed about the "High Speed Train" proposal being made by the Provincial government. Quite a bit of information is available now and mention is being made that it could follow the hydro corridor that runs through Zorra. I think it is something we need to be thinking about and watching developments in planning as it has the potential, if it ever were to occur, to divide our Township very significantly and affect, among other things, traffic movement north and south, road maintenance, busing, emergency services, ...not to mention the division of farms.

Much discussion lately at Zorra Council is about the future of the ponds at Embro and Harrington. I would ask that you educate yourself about the proposals being made and send your ideas to Council. The decisions made will affect all of Zorra. As well early in the fall, Council will begin budget deliberations. Your input is critical as we make decisions regarding all future spending. I encourage you to attend the public meetings designed so we can hear from you.

I continue to encourage you to contact me with suggestions, concerns, etc. so Council can assist you.

BATTERY RECYCLING



The Township of Zorra has a free program for the recycling of household batteries through Raw Materials Company Inc. (RMC). The program is being offered at four locations throughout the Township:

Since the start of this program in September 2012, the Township of Zorra has collected and returned 1643lbs. of batteries to Raw Materials Company for recycling.

LIONS RECYCLE **2017**



Thank you to our Sponsors and to the Residents of the Thamesford and Embro districts for supporting our successful recycle initiative. With your contribution of metal waste, batteries and end of life cycle electronics we diverted some 52,000 lbs from landfills and at the same time generated a profit of six figures to support Community activities.

This is our 3rd year in the Recycle Program and in that time the Thamesford Lions Club has diverted some 138,000 lbs from landfills and at the same time turned \$16,000 into Community projects.

Special mention to Green Valley Recycling, Aarts Trucking, Heartland Farm Mutual and RBC without their help this initiative would not fly.

Rural Offord Economic Development

PEOPLE • PROXIMITY • PROSPERITY

For almost a decade, rural communities like Zorra Township have been discussing the support that is in demand by local businesses. Conversations on how to assist the growth and expansion that often leads to red tape challenges have taken place with both staff and with council.

In 2014, an arms-length, non-profit, economic development corporation – the Rural Oxford Economic Development Corporation (ROEDC) – was created. Bernia Wheaton, an experienced economic development officer was brought on board and work began. Based on feedback from the business community, a strategic plan was developed to address the most complex issues in the county.

With one full time person and a lean budget, the five townships found a unique way to share the responsibility and the benefits that now support our community.

You may be wondering, what is an economic development officer? What is it that Bernia does?

In short, an economic development specialist is trained to find innovative solutions that facilitate the prosperity and sustainability of our business community. Given the unique needs of Townships like Zorra, the ROEDC sought out an EDO with experience in agriculture and with rural communities. Bernia was

educated in Economic Development from the University of Waterloo and as the owner of her own business, she understands entrepreneurship as well as municipal processes. With almost twenty years of business and economic development experience, Bernia brings a fresh approach to problem-solving.

What has been a true benefit to Zorra and to the ROEDC, is Bernia's experience in introducing economic development to rural communities. Prior to joining the Rural Oxford EDC, she received numerous awards and media attention for her innovative approach to rural economic development.

Her success in mitigating economic barriers in rural Ontario led to an invitation to speak before the Standing Committee on General Government at the Ontario Legislature in support of Bill 11. The Attracting Investment and Creating Jobs Act of 2012 was subsequently passed to support the continuation and establishment of development funds in order to promote regional economic development in southwestern Ontario. On numerous occasions, the Ontario Ministry of Agriculture, Food, and Rural Affairs has showcased her work as best practices for rural Ontario.

We encourage Zorra businesses to reach out to Bernia and to the ROEDC when facing challenges. Accessing this service is FREE to Zorra businesses. Township of Zorra 2016-2018 Dog Tag Campaign

Save Time, Apply Online! www.zorra.on.ca

It's easy, and it's the law!

For those residents who purchased a 2016-2018 dog tag, there is no action required on your part this year as those tags are valid until the end of 2018. There is an annual administrative fee of \$15.00 per tag that will be charged to your final 2017 tax bill.

For tenants, an invoice will be mailed.

If your dog tag is lost, there is a \$3.00 fee for a replacement tag. Please call or email the office for more information.

If you did not register your dog in 2016 or if you have a new dog, you can obtain a tag by visiting our website www.zorra.on.ca or you can contact the office by email admin@zorra.on.ca or by phone 519-485-2490 Ext 221 for your new tag. Payment methods include cash, cheque, debit, or charge to taxes.

Failure to obtain a dog tag may result in a fine of \$125.00.

*** Animal Care and Control By-law 43-15 ***

- Requires all dogs over 3 months of age to be licensed with the Township.
- Failure to register your dog may result in a fine of \$125.
- A valid tag will assist animal control staff in returning your dog should it ever become separated from you.
- Prohibits or regulates the running at large of dogs within the Township of Zorra. All dogs in Zorra must be kept on a leash when not on the owner's property. If a dog strays it can be impounded and its owners can be fined for "permitting a dog to run at large." The dog that is impounded is not being punished but rather protected.
- To protect individuals and other pets from disease, Zorra requires that any person who owns, harbours or possesses a dog shall immediately remove and sanitarily dispose of any feces (droppings) of the dog. Failure to do so may result in the owner being fined.
- Canine Service Animals, Livestock Guardian Dogs, Police Working Dogs, and Dangerous Dogs shall only be licensed at the Township Administration Office.
- Kennel licenses can be issued to Canadian Kennel Club (CKC) members only and proof of valid CKC membership is required. Kennel licenses will now also require an approved Site Plan, must adhere to minimum standards, and will be subject to an annual inspection. Kennel licenses are issued at the Township office only.
- All dog owners must adhere to the minimum health and general well-being standards.
- PROVINCIAL LEGISLATION REQUIRES THAT ALL DOGS HAVE CURRENT RABIES VACCINATIONS.
- All animal bites should be immediately reported to The Oxford County Board of Health at 519-539-9800.
- By-Law 69-12 Noise By-law. Barking dogs are an annoyance and a nuisance. Barking falls under the Noise By-Law which is enforced by the Zorra By-Law Enforcement Officer.

BY-LAW ENFORCEMENT

RECREATIONAL VEHICLES PARKING

The Township's Zoning By-law has been amended to permit the temporary storage of not more than two recreational vehicles in residential zones from May 1 — October 31 in a driveway, provided that the recreational vehicle does not exceed 29.5ft in length and does not impede on sight lines. Recreational vehicles includes, boats, snowmobiles, motor homes, and trailers for the hauling of snowmobiles or boats. You may store a recreational vehicle year round in a garage, carport, or on the interior side yard or rear yard provided that it is stored a minimum of 3.3 ft to the rear lot line or interior side lot line.

OFF-ROAD VEHILCES

ORVs and ATVs remain NOT PERMITTED on Zorra Township and Oxford County Roads.

WINTER PARKING

Please be advised that the winter parking restrictions will be enforced starting November 15 and remain in place until March 31, 2018 in accordance with By-law 7-95. For snow removal purposes, parking is not permitted on any road or street from 1:00 a.m. to 8:00 a.m. 7 days a week during this period. Any vehicle owner found in violation of this by-law could be fined or have their vehicle removed/ towed at owners expense. The set fine for this violation is set at \$50.

PARKING AMENDMENTS - WILDWOOD LAKE AREA

Please be advised the Township's Parking By-law has been amended to prohibit parking on either side of all bridges to the area at the end of the guard rails. Specifically there is NO PARKING on either side of the 29th Line and 31st Line at the Wildwood Lake area. There are safe parking areas on the shoulders of both roads and a gravel parking area on the 29th Line. Upper Thames River Conservation Authority requires that individuals using the trails in this area have the appropriate permit and require bikers to enter from the Wildwood Conservation Area and pay the appropriate fee.

THAMESFORD PUBLIC SCHOOL PARKING

As a reminder, new signs were erected on the north side of McCarty Street by Thamesford Public School. The North side of McCarty Street in now designated as No Standing at any time. This means no stopping, no parking, no standing at any time on the north side of McCarty Street from Allen Street to George Street. To clarify what "No Standing" is: No Standing means that a motorized vehicle is prohibited from halting, whether occupied or not, except for the purpose of and while actually engaged in receiving or discharging passengers.

Parking restrictions remain in effect on the south side of McCarty Street during the school year only as follows: no parking/no stopping on the south side of McCarty Street from Allen Street to George Street from September 1 to June 30 of each year between the hours of 8:30 am and 9:00 am and between the hours of 3:00 pm and 4:00 pm. Fine is \$50.

LEAVES/SNOW REMOVAL ONTO ROADWAYS

The autumn season is quickly approaching and therefore the leaves will begin to fall. As a reminder to all residents, depositing your leaves onto the roadway and sidewalk is dangerous and is a contravention of the Road Protection By-law and the Yard and Lot Maintenance By-law. If you wish to drop off your yard waste, visit the County of Oxford website to view all brush, leaf and yard waste depot locations. Pushing or placing any leaves, snow or ice or any other obstruction of a roadway is an offence that carries a Provincial Offences Fine of \$105.00.

Fire Safety First

Rural Fire Services of Oxford County promotes prevention, education.

Fire safety on farms is critical. With millions of dollars lost every year due to barn fires, not to mention countless livestock and valuable infrastructure, fire can be devastating to farms. The impact of a barn fire – both tangible and intangible – is significant.

The Rural Fire Services of Oxford County (RFSOC) will be at Canada's Outdoor Farm Show (COFS) not only providing fire protection, but also providing fire safety education and awareness to attendees at their location on Masonville Lane.

"Farming is a big business in southern Ontario and Oxford County, and fires come with potentially devastating economic impacts," says John McFarlan, Fire Chief, Township of Zorra. "The farming community have their own unique exposures when it comes to fire safety and prevention."

McFarlan says prevention and education are key to managing risks and reducing the potential for fire on both farms, and all other properties.

"Canada's Outdoor Farm Show provides the Rural Fire Services of Oxford County with a great opportunity to reach out to the local farming industry and others attending the show to promote our message of fire prevention and fire safety education and awareness," says McFarlan.

TAX DEPARTMENT

The Final 2017 Tax Bills were mailed in July, if you have not received your bill, please contact the Township immediately.

The 3rd Instalment is Due August 31, 2017 and the 4TH AND FINAL Instalment is Due October 31, 2017.
We now accept Debit at the office.

We now accept debit and credit card payments at the office.

To setup your property taxes as a bill payment through your online banking, go to "add a bill" and search for "Zorra". Select Zorra Township Tax and enter the Roll Number from your tax bill as your account number. Use your 15-digit roll number, excluding the dashes.

Example: If your roll number on your tax bill shows 011-090-25600-0000 then you would enter this as 01109025600. If an error occurs, please add the extra four zeros at the end and try again.

PRE-AUTHORIZED PAYMENT PLAN

Sign up now for the 10 or 12 month Pre-Authorized Payment Plan for your taxes. If you are interested in enrolling in this payment plan, you can find an authorization form on our website at www.zorra.on.ca

If you are currently enrolled in the pre-authorized payment plan, you do not have to re-apply each year, only if there is a change with the account.

BUILDING DEPARTMENT

Obtaining a Building Permit in Zorra:

Fill out a Building Permit Application, either in person at the Township Office or online www.zorra.on.ca In addition to the completed application form, applicants must also submit building drawings, plans and other documents to the Township of Zorra for processing. A detailed description of the planned work and intended occupancy, identification of the building lot or site, a valuation of the proposed work including materials and labour costs are required.

Building Permit Fees:

Residential: (including new homes, additions, renovations, decks) - \$100.00 + 0.40/sq. ft.

Agricultural: (including coveralls, barns, storage sheds,

workshops) – \$100.00 + 0.20/sq. ft.

Sheds - \$50.00 flat rate Swimming Pools - \$100.00

Demolition Permit - \$50.00

A full list of Building Permit Fees are located on our website, www.zorra.on.ca

A Building Permit is NOT required for a fence.

Failure to obtain a Building Permit will result in a penalty of double the permit fee, as per the Township of Zorra's Building Bylaw.

PUBLIC WORKS DEPARTMENT

Brush, Leaf and Yard Waste Depot

Zorra has a Depot for brush, leaf and yard waste. Located across the road from the Kintore Public Works Shop at 783045 Road 78, just east of Country Road 119.

Acceptable materials include: fruits & vegetables, garden hedge & tree trimmings, grass, leaves, Halloween pumpkins, house & garden plants, brush (not longer than 6ft), Christmas Trees. - Unacceptable materials include: garbage, old fencing, plastic bags, hazardous waste, top soil, rocks and stumps.

This depot is open 24 hours a day, 7 days a week. There is no charge for this service.

Construction Zone Sign Clarification

In a Construction Zone, Local Traffic Only means you are accessing a property inside the section of road that is closed. It does NOT mean that you live in the area adjacent to the construction and the closed road is the shortest distance to your destination. It is a Highway Traffic Act Offence to misuse this privilege.



After making a delegation to Zorra Council at a 2016 meeting, Ms. Hodgkinson's grade 4/5 students from AJ Baker Public School planted milkweed at three different locations in the Township this spring.



These Monarch Waystations are located at the Township Office on 27th Line, the Memorial Tree Forest on 43rd Line, and behind the former Thamesford Fire Station near Dr. Kosmal Park in Thamesford. Monarch Waystations provide milkweeds, nectar plants, and shelter for monarchs throughout their annual cycle of reproduction and migration. Creating and maintaining Monarch Waystations contributes to monarch conservation and helps assure the continuation of the monarch migration in North America.





The Upper Thames River Conservation Authority has trees & grants available. Landowners who reside in the Upper Thames River watershed and own a minimum of 1 hectare (2.5 acres) are eligible to participate in the UTRCA's Tree Planting on Private Lands program.

The program offers:

- Large stock trees (coniferous and deciduous)
- **Seedlings** (coniferous and deciduous species, as well as wildlife shrubs)

Trees purchased through this program may be planted by the landowner or through the UTRCA's full planting service.

Township of Zorra Memorial Trees

Memorial Trees can be purchased, in memory of loved ones, at the Township Office for \$40.00 through the Upper Thames River Conservation Authority (UTRCA). Individuals may also have their loved ones name added to a memorial tree sign when they purchase a tree for an additional fee per. Signs are located at Grace Patterson Park in Thamesford, **Embro Conservation** Area and Harrington Conservation Area. The trees are planted in various locations throughout Zorra on Township or UTRCA property at a predetermined location. Approximately 120 trees, usually 6'-8' sugar maples, have been planted throughout the Township since the start of this program in 1995.

In addition to the Zorra Memorial Tree Program, the Township has partnered with Brock and Visser Funeral Home – Thamesford Chapel and UTRCA to have trees planted in memory of those individuals whose funeral arrangements have been conducted through Brock and Visser Funeral Home. The Memorial Tree Forest is located on the 43rd Line, North of Road 68 on land owned by UTRCA. Since 2015, approximately 150 trees have been planted in the forest!

The Township of Zorra has recognized the recent changing trends in recreation and in an effort to provide direction and to make informed decisions on the future of recreation and the needs of the Communities it serves, Council has approved the hiring of Monteith Brown Planning Consultants to complete a comprehensive Recreation, Arts and Culture Master Plan.

Along with many other topics, the Plan will address such objectives as a current assessment and recommendations for the future development of our services, programs, events, facilities and parks. The project is designed to be completed in three phases, with a completion date in January, 2018. The first phase, which is currently underway, will examine historical analysis, existing conditions and emerging trends. Also included in this phase is community engagement. In September, we will be asking residents to participate in online surveys, visit us at an open house, and join us in focus groups. These community engagement strategies will be used to establish a broad picture of participation in parks, recreation and cultural activities. Your feedback will also help envision priorities for future investment into recreation with your Community. We look forward to what you have to say!





Heron's General Store & Post Office



Robert Heron Jr. and his wife - the former Annie Darling - both born in Roxborough, Scotland - bought this property in 1874. It remained in the Heron name until 1902. Like his father before him - Robert was a tailor by trade. He also served as the Harrington Postmaster until his death in 1880 at age 45. Robert and Annie's daughter Mary helped run the store and was postmaster after his death - from 1881

to 1892. The Embro West Zorra History Book describes the store here as a long rambling 2 storey building. The tailor shop was on the 2nd floor, and there was a warehouse out back. The General Store was on the main floor, at the front of the building and carried everything from toothpicks to horse harness.

At this time in rural Ontario - the general store was often a place where locals stopped to discuss issues of the day - a place to chat as well as to buy. They carried a wide variety of merchandise - staples like coffee, flour and sugar, and items of hardware, clothing and many other items for the village residents and surrounding farming community.



"We've met some really neat kids over the years," says R.R. 2 St. Marys farmer Paul Mitchell. "Kids who have gone on to do some really neat things have had their first jobs here, picking raspberries."

But now, after the conclusion of the 2017 summerbearing raspberry season, Paul and Janice Mitchell are calling it quits . . . from growing raspberries, that is.

"We're not selling the farm, and the catering business is not closing," Paul smiled as he greeted a Journal Argus reporter at the family's Oxford Road 96 farm last week. "You know how rumours get started."

For some raspberry pie-loving catering customers, the raspberries go hand in hand with Janice's Fine Country Catering; they might wonder what an event served by the extremely well-regarded caterer will be like without a straight-from-the-farm raspberry dessert on the menu.

Those customers needn't worry just yet; the couple figures that, by the end of this growing season, they'll have enough frozen berries to last through two years of pie-making — at an established rate of 700 per year, destined for both catering and as frozen pie sales. "We pride ourselves on never having sold a day-old berry in 22 years in business," notes Janice, adding any freshly-picked berries left over at the end of the day have always been put in the freezer for later use in pies or for sale frozen.

Still, there is some truth that the two businesses have gone hand in hand.

"The first (raspberry) bushes were planted in 1994," Paul relates, adding that's around the same time Janice began her catering business. The first berries were picked the following year — around the time, likewise, that Janice's efforts to promote her business began to really bear fruit.

"The number one reason (for planting the raspberries) was to give the kids something to do as they grew up," Paul says. "And it accomplished that, beyond our expectations."

All four Mitchell children, he continues, "learned to get up and go to work — first picking, and then supervising other pickers, and then running the (onfarm retail) stand."

"And on top of (learning those lessons), they made a little money on the side."

From the standpoint of the business owners, Janice and Paul aren't complaining about the money they made over the years. But growing raspberries, they stress, is truly hard, physically-demanding work. And it was time to give up that work — especially for

Paul, who spent countless hours each fall on his hands and knees cutting away every single fruitbearing cane from

that year and burning it as a way of breaking the pest cycle. In the spring, he was back at it, clippers in hand, thinning out the less thrifty new canes that would only provide unnecessary competition for the high-quality canes, and impede the air flow that can keep raspberry cane borer insects at bay.

"That's one nice thing; we've never had to spray," he says, attributing the high elevation of the family's property for keeping air flowing well through the one-and-a-half acre berry patch. He adds, though, that news has come to Ontario's berry growers that a new and tough-to-combat pest insect has been advancing in recent years, so he's happy to be getting out now.

The Mitchells started in business with the traditional summer-bearing raspberries, and never moved to ever-bearing varieties to extend the season. Janice remembers cold July mornings when she handed out gloves with cut-out fingertips to her young pickers, and circulated through the rows a little while later handing out mugs of hot chocolate. "We never wanted to be picking into the fall. We wanted to the season to come and then go, so we stuck with the summer-bearing."

"We've had around 300 kids work for us over the years," Paul relates.

Raspberry season is on now, and the Berry Barn is open. The Mitchells are located 963229 Road 96, between Uniondale and Harrington.

And for those who think they can't live without Mitchell berries, they'll quite likely get the opportunity to purchase one of the farm's plants. In October, Janice says, they plan on having a charity "come dig your own plant" party as a way of officially shutting down the business. Proceeds will go to the St. Marys Memorial Hospital Foundation.





