Message from the Mayor

Proposals for the Landfill and High Speed Rail continue to be huge concerns. I urge you to visit the Township website for information. If you cannot do this, please contact a friend or the Township Office for a written copy. Both of these issues have significant

importance to Zorra and you should be informed. It would seem the meetings planned by the Provincial government regarding rail service do not include invitations to rural representatives. We must understand the impact to our Township so we can speak with one strong voice so our concerns are heard.

The Zero Waste committee continues to work towards its goal. Meetings were held November 23 to encourage groups planning events - from regular meetings of local organizations to some of our significantly huge events - looking for ways to lessen the garbage that remains at the end. There is talk from the Province that garbage pickup will no longer include materials that contain compostable garbage - as much kitchen garbage does now - by early 2018. Clearly we can begin with small steps. Watch for more information. Be sure your group is represented at one of the meetings.

Recently I attended a meeting regarding County Paramedic Services. As you know there are regulated response times for urban areas - but not for the rural areas. The response time is often longer because rural ambulances do not always remain at their station but are positioned around the County in order to respond to calls for urban emergencies. The County budget is asking for at least two more ambulances for Woodstock. I have had concerns expressed to me about this being "not fair". In actuality this will help greatly with our response times as rural ambulances will not be called on as often to assist with urban emergencies.

I am always grateful for the opportunities offered to me since you elected me as your Mayor. I was invited by the Garner family to attend the Woodstock Sports Hall of Fame awards. Ross Garner was honoured posthumously for a Lifetime Achievement. At the same time Michael Heath of Golspie, who was supported in his efforts by Zorra, was named Male Athlete, and Stacey Simmons daughter of our Treasurer, Maureen Simmons, was Captain of the Girls' Hockey team that won the Team award. It was really an outstanding day for Zorra.

Zorra has just finished a Branding exercise and recently presented the results to all employees. When I first started into Public Service I had no idea what this term had to do with a Township. I have since come to understand how important it is in telling people what it means, and how it affects what we do. Keep watching. You will see some changes in how we present ourselves and how we do business.

Both Zorra and the County are working on budgets for next year. Your input is important as we plan projects and services. Attend public meetings or at least contact me or one of the councillors. We need to hear from you.

Be watching for solar panels on both arenas (We hope to collect even more energy than the buildings use), completion of the new soccer field and ReuseapalooZaha (Embro Community Centre April 28/18).

Council continues to honour groups that work in Zorra. Please try to communicate with us directly. Sometime we hear from several members with differing views and it would help to hear by resolution or contact by a member of the Executive. We want to see you succeed with your projects.



REDUCED LOAD SEASON

An early reminder to all drivers of heavy trucks and equipment that the reduced load season takes effect for the period of February 15 to April 30 inclusive each year. In accordance with By-law 21-03, signs will be posted on applicable Township roadways.

HALF LOAD SEASON RATIONALE


- Minimize long term damage to Infrastructure
- Problems caused when roads are soft often require major repairs
- Prevent additional damage to culverts and bridges
- Heavy loads do damage to road sub-base that is difficult to detect
- Changes in the size of agricultural equipment i.e. large liquid manure trailers
- Multiple aggregate producers in Township
- Infrastructure repair costs borne directly or indirectly by residents

All of the above lead to safety issues during Half Load Season.

WINTER ROADWAY MAINTENANCE ON TOWNSHIP OF ZORRA ROADS

The winter level of service to be delivered is prescribed in the Minimum Maintenance Standards – Ontario Regulation 239/02 regarding snow and ice control. The Minimum Maintenance Standards are a regulation of the Municipal Act, 2001. Service will be delivered during the following hours: Monday to Friday - 7:00 a.m. to 3:30 p.m. with additional hours as determined by weather conditions. Saturday, Sunday, holidays - as determined by weather conditions.

TAX DEPARTMENT

WHY NOT PAY YOUR TAXES MONTHLY?

Sign up now for the 10 or 12 month Pre-Authorized Payment Plan for 2018.

If you are interested in enrolling in this payment plan for 2018, you can find an authorization form on our website at www.zorra.on.ca or call Kelly Hall at 485-2490 ext 222. Applications need to be submitted as soon as possible to ensure enrolment for 2017.

If you are currently enrolled in the pre-authorized payment plan, you DO NOT have to re-apply each year, only if there is a change with the account.

WHY NOT TRY PAYING YOUR TAXES ON-LINE?

Online or telephone banking is available for making monthly, arrears, or regular instalments. To setup your property taxes as a bill payment through your online banking, go to "add a bill" and search for "Zorra".

Select Zorra Township Tax and enter the Roll Number from your tax bill as your account number. Use your 15-digit roll number, excluding the dashes, starting after 3227. Example: If your roll number on your tax bill shows 011-090-25600-0000 then you would enter this as 01109025600. If an error occurs, please add the extra four zeros at the end and try again.

MUNICIPAL PROPERTY ASSESSMENT CORPORATION (MPAC)

MPAC is a not-for-profit corporation funded by all Ontario municipalities. MPAC's roll is to accurately value and classify all properties in Ontario in compliance with the Assessment Act and related regulations set by the Government of Ontario.

Also filing a Request for Reconsideration (RfR) is a pre-condition to filing an Assessment Review Board (ARB) appeal for properties in the residential, farm or managed forests property class. The deadline to file an RfR is March 31, 2018.

WHEN WILL MY 2018 TAX BILL BE MAILED?

They will be mailed the 1st week of February, with due dates of Feb 28 and May 31, 2018. Unfortunately, legislation states that the municipality is only allowed to bill half of the previous year's taxes, therefore an increase/decrease in taxes for ratepayers will not be until the Final 2018 Tax Bill which are processed in July 2018.

Also, Zorra Fire and Emergency Services spread the word regarding Fire Prevention Week with a fire truck ride to school for AJ Baker students Jenna & Jacob Hutton and Thamesford Public School participated in June at the end of the previous school year.

Ron King, Uniondale Station

Ron King, District Deputy Chief of Zorra Fire's Uniondale Station is also the President of the Firefighters Association of Ontario (FFAO) representing the almost 20,000 volunteer fire fighters in the province. (Ron is now in his second year of a two year term as the president).

Ron and his executive represent the volunteer side of the fire service, accounting for 62% of the 449 fire departments within Ontario, when it comes to concerns on issues of importance to public and firefighter safety.

"Presenting a professional and organized front and stating our concerns with our peers and legislators is a necessary part of our work," Ron said. As President, Ron has attended the national and provincial memorial services held annually in Ottawa and Toronto. Also, he currently attends meetings in Toronto, sitting on the Fire Safety Technical Panel, a group formed to investigate and upgrade legislation for firefighter safety standards.

The FFAO is active on the Section 21 Committee, and worked very hard with other stakeholders to enact the Presumptive legislation that protects and provides for firefighters and their families faced with cancers directly caused by fighting fires.

It is important for the FFAO to maintain and establish relationships with other organizations in the fire service. To that end, the association has met with the Ontario Fire Chiefs Association, and the Fire Service Women of Ontario to strengthen the position of all firefighters in this province. Working together, the full time and part time firefighters will achieve better standards of safety and provide a strong voice when dealing with our government bodies.

Every year the FFAO holds its annual meeting and convention in various locations around the province. A week is dedicated to providing volunteer firefighters with education and training to maintain and upgrade their skills and knowledge. It also provides fellowship and networking opportunities for the members.

Ron is one of the original members of the Uniondale station who just recently received his 40 year Long Service Medals from both the Federal and Provincial governments. Ron became a Captain of the Uniondale station in 1997 and has been District Deputy Chief of our Uniondale station for the last 7 years.

Ron and his wife Lynda have three (3) sons, two of which have followed in his footsteps. Jeff joined us at Zorra Fire in 2011 and most recently with Mike joining



the ranks of Uniondale station in 2016.

From all of us here at home in Zorra, thanks Ron for the time and effort you've put in and continue to put forth for both public and fire fighter safety. We can't thank you enough.

BY-LAW ENFORCEMENT

SMOKING PROHIBITED

By-law 42-15 prohibits smoking at all Township facilities. Township facilities are defined as: any building, structure or premise to which the Township holds right of ownership to, including a building, structure or premise which is leased by the Township. This includes all playgrounds, sports fields, parks, buildings, park walkways, and even includes parking lots. As soon as you pass the threshold from the sidewalk or roadway onto a Township owned/leased lot it is prohibited to smoke any smoking product. Smoking Product is defined as: tobacco or tobacco-like product whose primary purpose is to be burned or heated to produce vapours, gases or smoke, which are inhaled, and shall include but is not limited to non-tobacco herbal shisha, and other plant material or oils intended for inhalation. Violations may result in a fine of \$305.00 plus additional fees.

RECREATIONAL VEHICLES (RV's)

Please be advised that Subsection 5.28.4 of the Zoning By-law has been amended to reflect the following: To permit the temporary storage of recreational vehicles in residential zones from May 1 — October 31, provided that the recreational vehicle does not exceed 29.5ft in length and does not impede on sight lines. Recreational vehicles includes, boats, snowmobiles, motor homes, and trailers for the hauling of snowmobiles or boats. You may store a recreational vehicle year round in a garage, carport, or on the interior side yard or rear yard provided that it is stored a minimum of 3.3 ft to the rear lot line or interior side lot line.

WINTER PARKING

Please be advised that the winter parking restrictions will be enforced starting November 15th and remain in place until March 31, 2018. Parking is not permitted on any road or street from 1:00 a.m. to 8:00 a.m. 7 days a week during this period. Any vehicle owner found in violation of this By-law could be fined or have their vehicle removed/ towed at owners expense. The fine for this violation is set at \$50.

Parking By-law notice to parents, volunteers and teachers at Thamesford Public School: Reminder, there is no parking/stopping on south side of McCarty Street 8:30-9:00am & 3:30-4:30pm. Signs are posted and violators will be ticketed \$50.00. You may drop off your children on the north side of the street provided that you do not stand for a period of time longer than it takes for children to exit the vehicle, otherwise you may be ticketed for a "no standing" violation, also \$50.00. If you need to exit your vehicle I suggest using the many parking spaces on George Street by the ball park. If you have any questions about this, please contact By-law Officer Mathew Paul at 519-485-2490 ext 230.

SNOW REMOVAL ONTO ROADWAYS

This is a reminder to all residents that depositing snow from private property onto a public roadway is dangerous and in contravention of the Road Protection By-law 6-95. Pushing or placing any snow or ice or any other obstruction of a roadway is an offence that carries a Provincial Offences Fine of \$105.00. Additionally the Yard and Lot Maintenance By-law 15-15 also prohibits the deposit, or cause to be deposited, snow or ice upon a sidewalk.

MOTORIZED VEHICLES

Please note that the Motorized Vehicle By-law 18-90, prohibits motorized vehicles in public parks within Zorra Township and is subject to a Provincial Offences Charge \$105. Motorized vehicles includes but is not limited to recreational all-terrain vehicles (ATV's) and snowmobiles. Parks prohibiting motorized vehicles are as follows: Thamesford District Recreation Centre — Entire property, Grace Patterson Park, Thamesford North Park, Bob Fisher Soccer Field, Lions (South) Park, Matheson Park, Community Centre Park, Wallace Park, Memorial Park and Harrington Park NOTE: Unless permission is obtained from property owner, ATVs and Snowmobiles are prohibited on private property. All trespassing complaints should be forwarded to the Ontario Provincial Police.

ANIMAL CARE & CONTROL

- All dogs over 3 months of age require a license with the Township. Failure to register your dog may result in a fine of \$125.
- All dogs in Zorra must be kept on a leash when not on the owner's property. If a dog strays it can be impounded and its owners can be fined for "permitting a dog to run at large." The dog that is impounded is not being punished but rather protected.
- To protect individuals and other pets from disease, Zorra requires that any person who owns, harbours or possesses a dog shall immediately remove and sanitarily dispose of any feces (droppings) of the dog. Failure to do so may result in the owner being fined.
- Kennel licenses can be issued to Canadian Kennel Club (CKC) members only and proof of valid CKC membership is required. Kennel licenses will now also require an approved Site Plan, must adhere to minimum standards, and will be subject to an annual inspection. Kennel licenses are issued at the Township office only.

- All dog owners must adhere to the minimum health and general wellbeing standards.
- PROVINCIAL LEGISLATION REQUIRES THAT ALL DOGS HAVE CURRENT RABIES VACCINATIONS.
- All animal bites should be immediately reported to The Oxford County Board of Health at 519-539-9800.
- By-Law 69-12 Noise By-law. Barking dogs are an annoyance and a nuisance.
 Barking falls under the Noise By-Law which is enforced by the Zorra By-Law Enforcement Officer.
- A recent update to the Animal Control By-law includes the difference between Dwelling building types and the total domestic cats and dogs that are permitted.

These changes are as follows:

- Section 1.1 which defined the term Dwelling unit has been modified to include specific building types. The definitions now include Multiple Unit Dwellings such as, apartments, boarding houses, converted dwelling, duplexes, street fronting townhouses, and other multiple unit dwellings. Single Dwelling Unitsare semi-detached, and Single Detached Dwelling mean a building that only contains one dwelling unit.
- Section 7 of the By-law outlines how many cats and dogs, and a combination cats/dogs are permitted.
 - 7.1 In a Dwelling Single Unit, no person shall, within the Township of Zorra, keep any animal except those permitted in accordance with the following:
 - a) three dogs;
 - b) three domestic cats; (Amended by By-law 41-16)
 - 7.1.1 In a Dwelling Multiple Unit, no person shall, within the Township of Zorra, keep any animal except those permitted in accordance with the following:
 - a) where there are no dogs, a maximum of two domestic cats;
 - b) where there is one dog, a maximum of one domestic cat;
 - c) where there are two dogs, no domestic cats;

Township of Zorra 2016-2018 Dog Tag Campaign

Save Time, Apply Online!

It's easy, and it's the law!

For those residents who purchased a 2016-2018 dog tag, there is no action required on your part this year as those tags are valid until the end of 2018. There is an annual administrative fee of \$15.00 per tag that will be charged to your final 2018 tax bill. For tenants, an invoice will be mailed.

If your dog tag is lost, there is a \$3.00 fee for a replacement tag. Please call or email the office for more information.

If you did not register your dog in 2016 or if you have a new dog, you can obtain a tag by visiting our website www.zorra. on.ca or you can contact the office by email admin@zorra.on.ca or by phone 519-485-2490 Ext 221 for your new tag. Payment methods include cash, cheque, debit, or charge to taxes.

Failure to obtain a dog tag may result in a fine of \$125.00.

*** Animal Care and Control By-law 43-15 ***

- Requires all dogs over 3 months of age to be licensed with the Township.
- Failure to register your dog may result in a fine of \$125.
- A valid tag will assist animal control staff in returning your dog should it ever become separated from you.
- Prohibits or regulates the running at large of dogs within the Township of Zorra. All dogs in Zorra must be kept on a leash when not on the owner's property. If a dog strays it can be impounded and its owners can be fined for "permitting a dog to run at large." The dog that is impounded is not being punished but rather protected.
- To protect individuals and other pets from disease, Zorra requires that any person who owns, harbours or possesses a dog shall immediately remove and sanitarily dispose of any feces (droppings) of the dog. Failure to do so may result in the owner being fined.

- Canine Service Animals, Livestock Guardian Dogs, Police Working Dogs, and Dangerous Dogs shall only be licensed at the Township Administration Office.
- Kennel licenses can be issued to Canadian Kennel Club (CKC) members only and proof of valid CKC membership is required. Kennel licenses will now also require an approved Site Plan, must adhere to minimum standards, and will be subject to an annual inspection. Kennel licenses are issued at the Township office only.
- All dog owners must adhere to the minimum health and general well-being standards.
- PROVINCIAL LEGISLATION REQUIRES THAT ALL DOGS HAVE CURRENT RABIES VACCINATIONS.

Have you seen these traffic devices around the township?

You may have seen this device, it is a Speed Monitoring Trailer. The Speed Trailer works by refocusing drivers attention on their current speed. This mobile device can be placed anywhere in the Township that requires on going traffic monitoring and reinforcement of speed limits. Not only does it display the detected speed of vehicles, but it records all vehicular traffic. The



data is then transferred to a hard drive where we can view speeds based on time and dates. This information assists us in determining if there is an ongoing issues with speeding. Data can be forwarded to the Ontario Provincial Police who may patrol the area and ticket offenders.

In addition to our Speed Trailer, you may have noticed this small box on utility poles. This discrete box is called a Speedspy. Inside the box is a radar device similar to the what is used with police radar guns. The SpeedSpy is designed to NOT be noticed, so the traffic data that we collect is true identifier of traffic patterns. 2018 MUNICIPAL ELECTION



VOTER INFORMATION

The Township of Zorra will be utilizing the VOTE BY MAIL alternative method of voting again for the 2018 Municipal Election.

With Vote by Mail, voters can fill out their ballots in the privacy and convenience of their own home. Casting a vote is as easy as mailing a letter. Security features are built into the voting kits to ensure the secrecy of your vote until vote tabulating takes place on Election Day – October 22, 2018.

A person is entitled to be an elector at an election held in a local municipality, if on voting day he or she is:

- a Canadian citizen:
- at least 18 years old;
- residing in the local municipality or an owner or tenant there, or the spouse of such owner or tenant; and
- not otherwise prohibited from voting.

CANDIDATE INFORMATION

Interested in running for Municipal Council? Nomination forms may be filed at the Township Office between May 1, 2018 and July 27, 2018, at a time when the Clerk's Office is open and on Nomination Day, July 27, 2018 between 9 a.m. and 2 p.m.

A new requirement under the Municipal Elections Act requires anyone wishing to run for office as a member of Council must submit signatures of 25 eligible voters supporting their nomination to run for office. The requirement to submit 25 signatures does not apply to candidates running for school board trustee positions.

A Candidate for Municipal Office must, upon nomination, be a qualified municipal elector and fulfil all of the following requirements:


- live in the municipality, be an owner or tenant of land there, or the spouse of an owner or tenant;
- be a Canadian citizen;
- be at least 18 years old on voting day;
- not legally prohibited from voting; and
- not disqualified by any legislation from holding Municipal office.







Tree Planting around Zorra!

Trees help to clean the air and fight against global climate change, they also impact aesthetic, social, economic and health benefits.

Environmental needs are becoming increasingly important across our globe and every tree helps!!

Throughout the Township of Zorra there are various tree planting programs available for residents. Available programs are as follows:



New Memorial Forest Sign!! Located on the 43rd Line, North of Road 68.

Township of Zorra Memorial Tree Program

Memorial Trees can be purchased, in memory of loved ones, at the Township Office for \$40.00 through the Upper Thames River Conservation Authority (UTRCA). Individuals may also have their loved ones name added to a memorial tree sign when they purchase a tree for an additional fee per plaque. Signs are located at Grace Patterson Park in Thamesford, Embro Conservation Area and Harrington Conservation Area. The trees are planted in various locations throughout Zorra on Township or UTRCA property at a pre-determined location. Approximately 120 trees, usually 6'-8' sugar maples, have been planted throughout the Township since the start of this program in 1995. Fill out the Memorial Tree Request Form on the Zorra website www.zorra.on.ca or contact the Township Office.

Township of Zorra Memorial Tree Forest

Zorra Township has partnered with Brock and Visser Funeral Home – Thamesford Chapel and UTRCA to have trees planted in memory of those individuals whose funeral arrangements have been conducted through Brock and Visser Funeral Home. The Memorial Tree Forest is located on the 43rd Line, North of Road 68 on land owned by UTRCA. The trees are purchased by Brock and Visser Funeral Home. The trees that are being planted are native species, 6'-8' in size. Since 2015, approximately 150 have been planted in the forest. Contact Brock and Visser for more details at 519-285-2427.

UTRCA Private Lands Program

Landowners who reside in the Upper Thames River watershed and own a minimum of 2.5 acres of property are eligible to participate in the UTRCA's Tree Planting on Private Lands program. The program offers large stock trees and seedlings. For further details visit the UTRCA website at www.thamesriver.on.ca.



The Upper Thames River Conservation Authority has trees & grants available. Landowners who reside in the Upper Thames River watershed and own a minimum of 1 hectare (2.5 acres) are eligible to participate in the UTRCA's Tree Planting on Private Lands program.

The program offers:

- Large stock trees (coniferous and deciduous)
- Seedlings (coniferous and deciduous species, as well as wildlife shrubs)

Trees purchased through this program may be planted by the landowner or through the UTRCA's full planting service.
