Your suggestions for future awards are always welcome.

Significant growth has occurred in the subdivisions in Thamesford and Embro. I know some people do not welcome the changes this makes in the community but we really need to maintain and grow the assessment base if we are going to keep up the services required without overwhelming a shrinking population.

We are heading towards a municipal election. I encourage you to educate yourselves so you vote for those you feel can best address the issues. It is not a popularity contest but an exercise in selecting strong leadership that benefits all of Zorra.



VOTER INFORMATION

2018 MUNICIPAL & SCHOOL BOARD ELECTION - OCTOBER 22, 2018

The Township of Zorra will be utilizing the VOTE BY MAIL alternative method of voting again for the upcoming 2018 Municipal & School Board Election.

With Vote by Mail, voters can fill out their ballots in the privacy and convenience of their own home. Casting a vote is as easy as mailing a letter. Security features are built into the voting kits to ensure the secrecy of your vote until vote tabulating takes place on Election Day – October 22, 2018.

During the week of September 24, 2018, delivery of voting kits will begin to those that are on the Voters' List. Voters will receive a Voter Kit in the mail containing all of the materials required to place their vote by mail. The voter simply follows the instructions in their kit, deposits in the mail, BY OCTOBER 11, 2018, using the postage paid response envelope, and the ballots will be delivered to the Municipal Office for tabulating on Election Day.

If you choose not to mail your vote, or it is AFTER OCTOBER 11, 2018, you may drop-off your ballot at the Municipal Office located at 274620 27th Line, during regular business hours (8:30am-4:30pm) or place in the afterhours locked drop box next to our main entrance at the Municipal Office. On Election Day, voting kits can be delivered in person to the office from 8:30a.m. to 8:00 p.m. when the polls close. The Municipal Office is the ONLY polling location accepting hand delivered voting kits. All ballots, whether mailed or hand delivered, are placed into a sealed ballot box that remains sealed until Election Day.

A person is entitled to be an elector at an election held in a local municipality, if on voting day he or she is:

- a Canadian citizen;
- at least 18 years old;
- residing in the local municipality or an owner or tenant there, or the spouse of such owner or tenant: and
- not otherwise prohibited from voting.

At the close of voting on October 22, the totals from all votes will be compiled. The unofficial results will then be displayed at the Township Office at 274620 27th Line and on the Zorra Township website. Feel free to attend!


Please ensure that your information is accurate and on the Voters' List by contacting the Township Office at 519-485-2490 or visiting www.zorra.on.ca

Please visit the Township website and select "Am I on the Voters' List?" to make a request to verify that your name appears on the list for the upcoming Municipal Election.

The revision period for electors to make changes to or have their own name removed from the list takes effect from September 4, 2018 until Voting Day on October 22, 2018.

If your name appeared on the Provincial Voters' List it DOES NOT mean that you will automatically appear on the Municipal Voters' List!!! We encourage residents to check that their name appears on the Voters' List and that their information, including school support, is recorded correctly to ensure that they receive the correct voting kit in the mail.

Township Wards and Representation

The Township of Zorra Council consists of the Mayor and four Ward Councillors. There is one Councillor elected by vote of the residents within each Ward. The Mayor, also referred to as the Head of Council, is elected Township wide. Members of Council are elected by residents to a four year term of office.

Council acts as the Township's decision making body. Decisions are made by Council as a whole and by majority vote at Council meetings. The elected Councillors represent the public and considers the well-being and interests of the Township on a range of issues such as roads, emergency services, buildings, by-law enforcement, licensing, property taxes, winter maintenance, recreation and economic development. Council develops and determines which services the Township will provide and carries out the duties of Council as provided in the Municipal Act and the Township's Procedural By-law.

Education is a provincial government responsibility in Canada. In Ontario, education is governed principally by the Education Act and its regulations which set out duties and responsibilities of the Minister of Education and of school boards, school board supervisory officers, principals, teachers, parents and students. Ontario's 72 District School Boards operate the province's publicly-funded schools. They are made up of 31 English-language public boards, 29 English-language Catholic boards, 4 French-language public boards, and 8 French-language Catholic boards. A school board is a body that operates the province's publicly funded schools and is governed by its publicly elected members – school board trustees.

Business is booming in Rural Oxford

Over the past months, economic development staff have been talking to local business about their unique needs and opportunities. The initiative, known as a business retention + expansion (BR+E) study is an action oriented and community-based approach to economic development. The BR+E plan focuses on nurturing existing businesses, and prioritizing community efforts, allowing us to foster economic development by learning more about challenges and opportunities to retaining and growing businesses and developing action plans to address these concerns as part of the community's economic development strategy. Rural Oxford Economic Development Corporation (ROEDC) has focused this 2018 BR+E on the Agri-business, Food Processing, Logistics, and Manufacturing business sectors across Rural Oxford.

What we learned is that Rural Oxford has a healthy economic diversity with the primary market for most businesses being regional (38%) or international (29%), while 18% serve a primarily local market.

We were also please to find that a significant majority (91%) of the businesses surveyed have a good or excellent impression of the community as a place to do businesses.

What was exciting to hear, is that 59% of the businesses surveyed reported plans to expand within the next 18 months. In doing so, they expect increases in workforce, floor space, employee training, and process improvements. In one case, a business owner

indicated that, "Expansion will lead to an additional 10-15 people per year for the foreseeable future." It's also encouraging to note that None of the businesses interviewed have plans to close, downsize, or sell.

When asked about thecommunity's top advantages, respondents most often listed its central location, the quality of rural life, proximity to their suppliers and customers, along with support from the community as benefits to doing business in Rural Oxford. As for drawbacks, respondents cited a lack of qualified workforce, unsatisfactory internet and cell service, distance to larger centres / transportation, and insufficient infrastructure such as natural gas and 3-phase power.

Out of the dozens of pages of data, we learned that while Rural Oxford is a thriving and prosperous place to do business, there is still much work to be done to support our businesses. The volunteer leadership team for this project met for a day to pour through your confidential responses and identify the key priorities that need addressing. These priorities, along with the initiatives that our economic development office will implement over the next three years can be found in the final report for this BR+E study. 

Kelly Hall,Tax Collector/Deputy Treasurer

The Tax Collector is responsible for the calculation and collection of property taxes for the Township. Annual property taxes are calculated by multiplying the current value assessment of your property by the Municipality's

Assessment Corporation (MPAC) determines the
assessed value of all properties in the Province
of Ontario. Kelly has been employed by Zorra
Township since January 1990.

It's easy, and it's the law!

RENEWAL DUE BY: December 31, 2018

The process for registering dogs with the Township changed in 2016. We no longer have representatives going door-to-door to sell dog tags. The onus is on the dog owner to have their dog registered with the Township. The price for a dog tag remains unchanged at \$15.00 per dog per year. Online forms are available at www.zorra.on.ca or you can contact the office by email admin@zorra.on.ca or by phone 519-485-2490 Ext 221 for your new tag. Payment methods include cash, cheque, debit, or charge to taxes.

Failure to obtain a dog tag may result in a fine of \$125.00.

Visit the Township office or mail the completed application form with your payment to Township of Zorra 274620 27th Line, PO Box 306, Ingersoll, ON N5C 3K5.

Animal Care and Control By-law 43-15

- Requires all dogs over 3 months of age to be licensed with the Township.
- Failure to register your dog may result in a fine of \$125.
- A valid tag will assist animal control staff in returning your dog should it become separated from you.
- A maximum of 3 dogs are permitted in each dwelling and a maximum of 2 dogs are permitted in each multi-unit dwelling.
- Prohibits or regulates the running at large of dogs within the Township of Zorra. All dogs in Zorra must be kept on a leash when not on the owner's property. If a dog strays it can be impounded and its owners can be fined for "permitting a dog to run at large." The dog that is impounded is not being punished but rather protected.
- To protect individuals and other pets from disease, Zorra requires that any person who owns, harbours or possesses a dog shall immediately remove and sanitarily dispose of any feces (droppings) of the dog. Failure to do so may result in the owner being fined.

- Canine Service Animals, Livestock Guardian Dogs, Police Working Dogs, and Dangerous Dogs shall only be licensed at the Township Administration Office.
- Kennel licenses can be issued to Canadian Kennel Club (CKC) members only and proof of valid CKC membership is required. Kennel licenses will now also require an approved Site Plan, must adhere to minimum standards, and will be subject to an annual inspection. Kennel licenses are issued at the Township office only.
- Tags for Dangerous dogs will be issued in person at the Township office only.
- All dog owners must adhere to the minimum health and general well-being standards.
- Provincial Legislation requires that all dogs have current rabies vaccinations.
- All animal bites should be immediately reported to The Oxford County Board of Health at 519-539-9800.
- By-Law 69-12 Noise By-law. Barking dogs are an annoyance and a nuisance. Barking falls under the Noise By-Law which is enforced by the Zorra By-Law Enforcement Officer.

BATTERY RECYCLING



The Township of Zorra has a free program for the recycling of household batteries through Raw Materials Company Inc. (RMC). The program is being offered at four locations throughout the Township:

Please feel free to drop off your batteries at any of the above locations.

Since the start of this program in September 2012, the Township of Zorra has collected and returned 1,950 lbs of batteries to Raw Materials Company for recycling.

BY-LAW ENFORCEMENT

RECREATIONAL VEHICLES PARKING

The Township's Zoning By-law has been amended to permit the temporary storage of recreational vehicles in residential zones from May 1 — October 31 in the front yard, provided that the recreational vehicle does not exceed 29.5ft in length and does not impede on sight lines. Recreational vehicles includes, boats, snowmobiles, motor homes, and trailers for the hauling of snowmobiles or boats. You may store a recreational vehicle year round in a garage, carport, or on the interior side yard or rear yard provided that it is stored a minimum of 3.3 ft to the rear lot line or interior side lot line.

OFF-ROAD VEHICLES

ORVs and ATVs remain NOT PERMITTED on Zorra Township and Oxford County Roads.

WINTER PARKING

Please be advised that the winter parking restrictions will be enforced starting November 15th and remain in place until March 31, 2019 in accordance with By-law 7-95. For snow removal purposes, parking is not permitted on any road or street from 1:00 a.m. to 8:00 a.m. 7 days a week during this period. Any vehicle owner found in violation of this by-law could be fined or have their vehicle removed/towed at owners expense. The set fine for this violation is set at \$50.

LEAVES/SNOW REMOVAL ONTO ROADWAYS

The autumn season is quickly approaching and therefore the leaves will begin to fall. As a reminder to all residents, depositing your leaves onto the roadway and sidewalk is dangerous and is a contravention of the Township By-laws. If you wish to drop off your yard waste, visit the County of Oxford website to view all brush, leaf and yard waste depot locations. Pushing or placing any leaves, snow or ice or any other obstruction of a roadway is an offence that carries a Provincial Offences Fine of \$105.00.

KEEPING PROPERTIES CLEAN AND CLEAR

In order to maintain consistency and with regards to safety, appearance, and pest free, all grass and weeds must be maintained at a height less than 8 inches. Further, property owners and tenants shall keep their land free from industrial and domestic wastes, inoperable motorized vehicles (both licensed or unlicensed), vehicle parts, construction materials, and other refuse. If refuse has started to accumulate on your property, you are required to place it in appropriate containers, stored at the side or rear of your lot, and placed curbside within 14 days.

ENERGY CONSERVATION

Ontario Regulation 397/11, under the Green Energy Act, directed all public agencies in Ontario to prepare an energy conservation and demand management plan. Additionally, mandated annual reporting of energy consumption and greenhouse gas emissions commenced on July 1, 2013. The Township of Zorra is committed to reducing the annual consumption of fuels and electricity used by Township facilities by an average of 1% per year until 2019. Below are the current statistics and target numbers for township facilities.

BURNING REGULATIONS

Don't want to end up with a fine this year? Follow the Township of Zorra Burning Regulations!!

Open Air Burning

Zorra Township requires a Permanent Fire Permit process for open air burning. Open air burning is a burn that is exposed to the atmosphere and/or not wholly enclosed in a container. This process involves a one-time application which will reduce the effort required to set up permission for an open air burn. All applications will be reviewed by the Fire Chief and upon approval, the applicant will be able to proceed with open air burns by calling into dispatch directly to report the burn details. Visit our website at www.zorra.on.ca to review the application form and conditions for the permit, then complete your application!

Recreation Burning

Backyard campfires may be permitted in built up areas (including the Villages of Embro & Thamesford), if the fire is contained within a non-combustible container or pit using only dry seasoned wood. Please ensure safety while having recreational backyard campfires. Be aware of current weather factors including wind and extreme heat. Whether in the backyard of your home, the cottage or at a campground, make fire safety a priority. Provisions and conditions can be found on the Township Website at www.zorra.on.ca (By-law 25-08). Failure to comply with by-law may result in fines.

Some General Provisions are listed below, however, please see Bylaw 25-08 Schedule B for all General Provisions:

- You may have a campfire only between the hours of 4pm and midnight, after which time you are required to fully extinguish the fire.
- No materials other than dry firewood (NO Burning of brush, leaves etc.), commercially produced charcoal and briquettes may be burned
- Campfires shall be confined to non-combustible containers or to a pit no larger than two feet by two feet with flames not exceeding 2 feet in height.
- The campfire shall be confined to a location at minimum of 15 feet in all directions from adjacent properties, structures or combustibles.
- If you have a campfire, you must have an extinguishing agent of sufficient size (water) immediately available at all times.
- The fire shall be attended, controlled and supervised at all times,
- Campfires are prohibited when the wind speed exceeds fifteen kilometres per hour or during rainy or foggy weather conditions or when a smog alert or fire ban has been declared.

Use your 15-digit roll number on your tax bill, example 011-090-25600-0000, you would enter this as 01109025600. If an error occurs, please add the extra four zeros at the end and try again.
- Monthly Pre-Authorized Payment Plan, either on the instalment dates, 10 or 12 month plan. If you are interested in enrolling in this payment plan, you can find an authorization form on our website at www.zorra.on.calf you are currently enrolled in the pre-authorized payment plan, you do not have to re-apply each year, only if there is a change with the account.

PUBLIC WORKS DEPARTMENT

Brush, Leaf and Yard Waste Depot

Zorra has a Depot for brush, leaf and yard waste. Located across the road from the Kintore Public Works Shop at 783045 Road 78, just east of Highway 19.

- Acceptable materials include: fruits & vegetables, garden hedge & tree trimmings, grass, leaves, Halloween pumpkins, house & garden plants, brush (not longer than 6ft), Christmas Trees.
- Unacceptable materials include: garbage, old fencing, plastic bags, hazardous waste, top soil, rocks and stumps.

This depot is open 24 hours a day, 7 days a week. There is no charge for this service.

Construction Zone Sign Clarification

In a Construction Zone, Local Traffic Only means you are accessing a property inside the section of road that is closed. It does NOT mean that you live in the area adjacent to the construction and the closed road is the shortest distance to your destination. It is a Highway Traffic Act Offence to misuse this privilege.

BUILDING DEPARTMENT

Obtaining a Building Permit in Zorra:

Fill out a Building Permit Application, either in person at the TownshipOffice or online www.zorra.on.ca

In addition to the completed application form, applicants must also submit building drawings, plans and other documents to the Township of Zorra for processing. A detailed description of the planned work and intended occupancy, identification of the building lot or site, a valuation of the proposed work including materials and labour costs are required.

Building Permit Fees:

Residential: (including new homes, additions, renovations, decks) -\$100.00 + 0.40/sq. ft.

Agricultural: (including coveralls, barns, storage sheds, workshops) –\$100.00 + 0.20/sq. ft. Sheds - \$50.00 flat rate

Swimming Pools - \$100.00 Demolition Permit - \$50.00

A Building Permit is NOT required for a fence.

Failure to obtain a Building Permit will result in a penalty of double the permit fee, as per the Township of Zorra's Building By-law.

Q: So what is a "Quarterless" Auction?

A: It's an auction-style-raffle event. Imagine a live auction/raffle/vendor sale/craft show, plus silent auctions, door prizes, food and drink, that adds up to an evening of excitement and entertainment. Your admission ticket gets you a numbered paddle with a matching ball that goes in the raffle drum. Bidding tokens (replacing quarters, worth \$0.25 each) will be available at the door. Items valued up to \$25 will be auctioned for one token...up to \$50 for two tokens...and so on. When an item is being auctioned that you want to win, you put your tokens in the collection jar at your table and hold up your paddle. A ball will be pulled at random from the raffle drum and if that ball matches your paddle, you win the item. If the ball doesn't match a paddle that has been entered for the current item, it is called a "nobid" and another ball is pulled until a winner is found!


Memorial Trees




