

Message from the Mayor

Oxford County continues to lead the way in Waste Reduction and Sustainability plans. The Zero Waste committee continues its work in exploring new ideas for lowering the amount of waste going to our landfill and new ways of salvaging and handling the waste still

being received. There are some exciting developments in this field but much study is needed as to feasibility, costs and results....and this is highly technical. Fortunately we have some highly educated and trained members who are leading the way in the investigations. Public meetings are planned for various locations in the County including Woodstock, Embro and Ingersoll. Watch for announcements regarding date and time or call the Township Office for details. Progress being made by the committee and future plans will be discussed and explained. ...and to those who continue to spread "false news!!" we are not planning to replace Salford with another landfill. We are trying to extend its "life" until we are able to move into a whole new world of waste management.

Solar panels are being placed on Embro and Thamesford arenas; an electric vehicle charging station is available at the Thamesford Library; your Council approved installing another one at the Township Office. Watch for further details. An information night is planned for April 10 at the Thamesford Library regarding electric vehicles and introducing the charger there.

The lift for the Towns Hall in Embro is now a reality. Credit goes to the Thistle Theatre organization for taking the lead in this project and for the work done by their members, especially Wendy Marshall, who worked tirelessly as the Project Manager. The building is now fully accessible for the many people who have been unable to make full use of it until now. Great job!

Thamesford Lions continue to try to start a similar club in Embro. At last Fall's Council meeting at Zorra Highland Park School this was one of the proposals from the students there. They are aware of the opportunities given communities who have active service clubs and want this for their area. If you have not been contacted give me a call and I will give you names of the people you can talk to. Many of us remember the wonderful contributions made by the Optimist Club in Embro several years ago and believe it is time for another such organization to help local citizens—particularly the young people asking for this.

Meetings continue regarding proposals for the landfill and high speed train in Zorra. It is critical that as many people as possible be informed and participate as we face these huge, potentially life changing projects, within our borders.

Council had an informative meeting with our insurance providers. This business becomes more involved every year and we look critically at our coverage on your behalf. There have been many major catastrophes just in North America recently. Insurance generally can easily assess material losses and much can be replaced but liability concerns can go on for years.

Work continues at the County for the amalgamation of our Oxford County Board of Health with the Elgin St. Thomas Public Health which will then both work as one unit under a newly formed Board of Health. The plan is to make the changeover as trouble free as possible, causing little disruption to residents and ultimately providing enhanced services to all residents of both original boards. As always the hope is to also save money for taxpayers. Watch for details as the plan moves forward.

I expect, like me, you are anxiously waiting for Spring—even though we had a reasonable trouble free, (weather wise) winter. With two major elections planned for this year—Provincial, in early June and Municipal, in late October—I urge you to get to know the candidates (perhaps even consider being one yourself) and thinking through the issues so you vote with purpose and confidence. The right to vote is a right and a responsibility and deserves your most serious consideration.

PRACTICE SAFE WASTE

Help protect the health and safety of our waste collection team. Practice safe waste by making set outs safer, driving responsibly near collection vehicles and properly disposing of sharps.

PRACTICE SAFE SET OUTS

Making your set outs safer for garbage and recycling collectors is easy. Here are five ways to make your set outs safe:

- 1. Lighten the load Leave some extra room in the garbage bag or blue box. Max weight per container is 44 lbs (20 kg).
- 2. Box up any glass place broken glass or mirror in a sealed box. Label "broken glass" and place in garbage bag for collection.
- 3. Make sure all bags and boxes are easily accessible for collectors.
- 4. Don't put hazardous waste or sharps in your curbside set outs.

PRACTICE SAFE DRIVING AROUND COLLECTION VEHICLES

Practicing safe driving around collection vehicles is important for the health and safety of you, your passengers and the collection drivers. When passing a collection vehicle, please do the following:

- 1. Approach collection vehicles slowly and carefully, leaving plenty of space for them to maneuver.
- 2. When passing, use caution and make sure you have a clear path to pass. Leave lots of space between you and collection vehicles.
- 3. Do not follow too closely, collection vehicles stop frequently and without warning.

PRACTICE SAFE SHARPS DISPOSAL

DO NOT put sharps (medical needles, syringes and insulin pen-tips etc.) in your garbage or recycling. To protect the health and safety of collectors, curbside collection will be discontinued if sharps are found poking out of garbage bags or in recycling boxes.

Sharps should be placed in a sealed, puncture-proof container. Pharmacies will accept sharps in properly sealed containers. Visit wasteline.ca for further sharps handling instructions and participating drop-off locations.

MORE THAN JUST CURBSIDE COLLECTION

To help you dispose of unwanted items and divert waste from the landfill, Oxford County Waste Management offers a number of additional waste diversion programs. Certain items can be disposed of at the Oxford County Waste Management Facility, or at special collection events held in the community throughout the year. These items include:

- Electronics
- Scrap metal
- Tires
- FOG cups (kitchen fats, oils and grease) NEW!
- Large household appliances

- Hazardous waste
- Construction and demolition material (accepted at Oxford County Waste Management Facility only)

2018 SPECIAL COLLECTION EVENTS

The May 5 special collection event in Woodstock has been cancelled. Material typically collected at this event can be brought to the County's Waste Management Facility. Remember, loads containing garbage will be subject to tipping fees. The special collection event in Tillsonburg will proceed as planned.

ZORRA LARGE ARTICLE COLLECTION 2018

Have items set out by 7am on Monday May 7 for pickup between May 7 & May 11. Acceptable material includes:

- Household furniture including tables and chairs
- Carpet rolls & under padding (6' maximum, rolled and bundled)
- Plastic & non-metal laundry tubs
- Plumbing fixtures (acrylic tubs/sinks)
- Pool filters (no sand) & pool covers
- Water softeners (no salt or contents inside)
- Mattresses & box springs

This program is for LARGE ARTICLES ONLY. If your items are small enough to fit in a garbage bag, they should go out with your regular tagged garbage.

Unacceptable materials:

- Regular household garbage & recycling
- Glass & mirrors

- Leaf & yard waste
- Electronics (computers, televisions)
- Scrap metal
- Loose materials in cardboard boxes
- Tires
- Construction, demolition & building material (concrete, toilets)
- Freon containing units (fridges, freezers, air conditioners)
- Hazardous waste (paint, pesticides, propane tanks)
- Appliances (washers, dryers, stoves)
- Items that can be broken down and placed in a garbage bag
- Automotive parts
- Items piled on trailers or wagons

OUTDOOR COMPOSTING

- Above ground composter with a 311 litre capacity for \$10
 Underground food digester called the Green Cone, able to digest up to 1 kg of food waste every 1-2 days for \$40 The above are both available for purchase at the Township Office.

COMPOSTING AT HOME REDUCE YOUR GARBAGE BY UP TO 24% Save on bag tag costs at the same time.

The Township has partnered with ERTH Corporation (Erie Thames Power) for a solar panel project at Thamesford District Recreation Centre and Embro Zorra Community Centre. This project will see solar panels installed on both roofs to generate almost half of a megawatt of power per year or enough hydro to power 55 homes per year.

Over the life of the 20-year contract the Township will receive almost \$250,000 in rent from ERTH. ERTH will also benefit by receiving payments from the Province for generating electricity to sell back into the grid.

The Township is a shareholder in ERTH so this project will not only be financially beneficial for both parties but also environmentally responsible. Zorra has undertaken many "green" initiatives over the past several years such as retrofitting streetlights to energy efficient LED fixtures, relamping municipal facilities to LED's, installing electric vehicle charging stations at the Municipal Office and partnering with the County of Oxford to install one at Thamesford Library and Resource Centre. Thamesford Fire Station utilized many energy efficient components to make this facility cutting edge for energy conservation. The proposed new Public Works Operations Centre will also be built with many of these same components and will be a model for energy conservation.

TOWNSHIP OF ZORRA PUBLIC WORKS

Heavy loads on roads could lead to charges

(OXFORD COUNTY, ON) – Members of the Ontario Provincial Police (OPP) Oxford County Detachment, the West Region OPP Highway Safety Division and The Ministry of Transportation-Ontario (MTO) will be out in Oxford County enforcing weight restrictions on our roadways.



The initiative which is running between March 1, 2018 and April 30, 2018, OPP is to assist in reducing road damage to Township and County Roads by enforcing laws as they relate to overweight vehicles.

The by-laws includes that no person shall, during the months of March and April:

- Operate a dual axle tank truck, used exclusively for the transportation of liquid or gaseous heating fuel, and no two axle truck, used exclusively for the transportation of livestock feed, on a highway were any axle transmits to the highway a weight in excess of 7500 kilograms.
- Operate a commercial motor vehicle or trailer where any axle of such commercial vehicle or trailer transmits to the highway a weight in excess of 5000 kilograms.
- Operate a vehicle having a carrying capacity in excess of 1000 kilograms other than a motor vehicle
 or trailer where the weight upon any millimetre in the width of tire exceeds five kilograms.

Of note, the Township of Zorra by-law begins two weeks earlier, commencing on February 15 and continues along with the rest of the County to the end of April.

Police and MTO will be continuing with this initiative in Oxford County until April 30, 2018.

Each Township has designated roads for use and the secondary roads have clearly posted signs advising of the weight restrictions. Grading Township Roads

The Township Public Works Staff grade the roads as often as conditions permit. Ideal conditions are when the roads are damp because it permits staff to cut and reshape the road. When roads are too dry, they are too hard to cut and re-shape and will not re-compact. When the road is too wet, grading will turn the road 'soupy' and will be severely rutted when it dries out. Frost in the roads make them impossible to grade. Often during the spring season, we have to wait until the daily temperature reached 4-5 degrees Celsius before the road is soft enough to grade. Snow on gravel roads during spring conditions can leave the road too wet to grade if it melts during the day. The Township understands when the roads need grading however are tied to the weather conditions and ask for your patience and understanding.

DRAINAGE DEPARTMENT

Legal Outlets:

With the pressure of too much work and not enough time, there may be a temptation to take shortcuts. We have been hearing about some tile drainage systems being directed to questionable outlets. This is a reminder that the following are NOT legal outlets:

- Roadside Ditches: You can only use roadside ditches as an outlet if permission is granted by the road authority. If permission is granted, we recommend that you secure the permission in WRITING.
- Private Ditches: Private ditches are private infrastructure and unless permission is given, another property owner has no right to connect a newly installed tile drainage system to a private ditch that flows across a neighbouring property. Similar to using a roadside ditch as an outlet, if permission is given, make sure it is in WRITING. If work needs to be done on the neighbouring property, make sure all parties are clear on cost-sharing and also that all parties are clear on the extent of work and the potential disruption of land.
- Municipal Drains: Municipal drains have a defined watershed; the lands within that watershed have paid for the construction and management of that drain and only these lands have the right to connect to the municipal drain. If you are installing tile drainage on a property, it is possible that only a portion of that property has the legal right to connect into that drain. If you are not sure, check with the local drainage superintendent before undertaking the work. If there is a section of land that is outside the limits of the watershed, you must ask for permission to connect those lands to the drain.
- Wetland or low area: Sometimes it's tempting to outlet a tile drainage system into a wetland area, particularly if the wetland is located on your client's property. However, before doing so, you should examine the area to determine if the out letting of the tile drainage system could be any impact on other property owners. If there could be, don't do it without first acquiring permission.



If a property owner is unable to secure an outlet, that owner has the right to petition their municipality under the Drainage Act for an outlet. Although it takes longer to get the outlet using the Drainage Act, when it is done, you can have confidence that the tile drainage work you perform will not result in legal action. If you still decide to take shortcuts on legal outlets, remember that the courts consider the tile drainage contractor to be an expert. You may want to check out the liability risk of you and your business.

Construction Drains:

- Construction Drains are initiated by a petition that is filed by the landowner, county or even the roads of a municipality.
- Council will either accept the petition or it can be rejected.
- If Council accepts the petition than Council will appoint an Engineer to do a study and a report.
- Drainage meetings will be arranged and notifications will be mailed to the landowners within the watershed.

It is very important that ANY notifications that a landowner receives from the Township is FULLY understood by the landowner. It is essential for all landowners to understand all of the deadlines, appeal dates and all the financial implications of the drainage work.

FIRE & EMERGENCY SERVICES DEPARTMENT

Emergency Preparedness Week: May 6-12, 2018 'Be Emergency Ready – Stay Connected'

Alert Ready in Ontario is part of a national service designed to deliver critical and potentially life-saving emergency alert messages to Canadians. Emergency alerts are distributed on radio and television to help ensure Ontarians have the information they need in emergencies in order to take precautions necessary to protect themselves.



Beginning April 6, 2018, emergency alerts will be sent from Wireless Service Providers (WSPs) over the National Aggregation and Dissemination (NAAD) System to compatible mobile devices on LTE networks. Alerts on mobile devices will warn Canadians about dangers that cause an imminent to life and property so that recipients they can take appropriate action. Wireless public alerting is geo-targeted ensuring it is relevant to those receiving the alerts (applied to specific areas of coverage).

A province-wide test of the Public Alerting System will take place on May 7th at 1:55PM EDT and again on September 19th.

BURN PERMITS

Zorra Township has a Permanent Fire Permit process for open air burning. This process involves a one-time application which will reduce the effort required to set up permission for an open air burn. All applications will be reviewed by the Fire Chief and upon approval, the applicant will be able to proceed with open air burns by calling into dispatch directly to report the burn details. Visit our website at www.zorra.on.ca to review the application form and conditions for the new permit, then complete your application! Please note: small recreation burns within a ring or fire pit in backyard don't require a permit.

FIREWORKS

Please keep in mind that the Township has a Fireworks By-law, #36-2014. The by-law regulates selling fireworks, displaying fireworks and special events.

All retail sales of consumer fireworks requires and application permit, fees, and approval from the Fire Chief or his designate.

All fines related to fireworks are set at \$200.00 plus surcharge. If you plan on celebrating a national holiday (Canada Day, Victoria Day, Labour Day), with the use of fireworks, please review the By-law which can be found at www.zorra.on.ca, or contact the Municipal Law Enforcement Officer or Fire Chief for further details.

BY-LAW ENFORCEMENT

RULES ABOUT DOGS

As the weather is now changing and dogs are outside for extended periods of time, please be aware of the Noise by-law, 69-12 Section 2 (2.1), as it relates to noise due to consistent barking; the result of which may be a fine of \$125.00.

- Dogs require a leash at all times when walking off of your property. They shall not wander (Running at Large) on public or other private properties. The fine for running at large is set at \$200.00.
- If you keep your dog outdoors during the warm seasons, you must provide your dog with adequate amounts of shade, shelter to protect from the elements, with food and water. The fines for inadequate amounts of shelter, food, water is \$300.00
- If you tether your dog, the tether shall be no less than 11.5 ft. and the dog must be tethered at the side lot or rear lot. Furthermore, no person shall cause a dog to be hitched, tied or fastened to a fixed object as the primary means of confinement for an extended period of time.

SWIMMING POOL FENCING

As the spring and summer weather quickly approaches, those who are considering installing a backyard pool must ensure that the pool and fencing meets the requirements of the By-law 23-08, and submit an application to the Building Department with fee.

A Pool is defined as:

- Any type of pool, when filled, that contains a depth of 18 inches or more of water at any given time *Does not include fish ponds, hot tubs, spas or irrigation ponds.
- Above-ground swimming pools do not require a fence IF the structure is at least 4 feet in height above
 grade, and has no permanently attached ladder which is removed when the pool in not in use. It
 cannot contain any exterior foothold or handholds including a pump or accessory appurtenance or
 structure.
- Where a deck is erected at or near an aboveground pool, the deck shall be fenced and gated.

LAND CLEARANCE

The main purpose of the Land Clearing By-Law is to ensure that all properties are maintained with consistency and with regards to safety and appearance. Grass and weeds must be maintained at a height less than 8 inches. Further, properties shall be free from industrial and domestic wastes, unlicensed motorized vehicles, excessive brush, heavy undergrowth and all noxious weeds. By-law 70-2011 can be reviewed on the Township website.

THAMESFORD OFF LEASH DOG PARK

- 1. Open from dawn dusk, 7 days a week
- 2. Pick up your dogs poo don't make others do it
- 3. Dog must have vaccinations up to date and dog licence
- 4. Use the off leash dog park at your own risk
- 5. Leash your dog while entering and exiting the park
- 6. Keep your dog in sight and verbal control at all times
- 7. No puppies under 6 months of age, female dogs in heat, sick dogs or aggressive/out of control dogs
- 8. No play toys, balls or food of any kind allowed in the park

- 9. Unsupervised children under 14 years are not permitted
- 10. If your dog digs holes in the dirt, please repair holes
- 11. Pitbulls as defined under the Ontario law must be muzzled and leashed at all times whether there are in an off leash park or not
- 12. No glass containers allowed at dog park

It's easy, and it's the law!

For those residents who purchased a 2016-2018 dog tag, there is no action required on your part this year as those tags are good through the end of 2018. There is an annual administrative fee of \$15.00 per tag that will be charged to your final 2018 tax bill. For tenants, an invoice will be mailed.

If your dog tag is lost, there is a \$3.00 fee for a replacement tag. Please call or email the office for more information.

If you did not register your dog in 2016 or if you have a new dog, you can obtain a tag by visiting our website www.zorra.on.ca or you can contact the office by email admin@zorra.on.ca or by phone 519-485-2490 Ext 221 for your new tag. Payment methods include cash, cheque, debit, or charge to taxes.

Failure to obtain a dog tag may result in a fine of \$125.00.

New Animal Care and Control By-law 43-15

- Requires all dogs over 3 months of age to be licensed with the Township.
- Failure to register your dog may result in a fine of \$125.
- A valid tag will assist animal control staff in returning your dog should it ever become separated from you.
- A maximum of 3 dogs are permitted in each dwelling.
- Prohibits or regulates the running at large of dogs within the Township of Zorra. All dogs in Zorra must be kept on a leash when not on the owner's property. If a dog strays it can be impounded and its owners can be fined for "permitting a dog to run at large." The dog that is impounded is not being punished but rather protected.
- To protect individuals and other pets from disease, Zorra requires that any person who owns, harbours
 or possesses a dog shall immediately remove and sanitarily dispose of any feces (droppings) of the dog.
 Failure to do so may result in the owner being fined.
- Canine Service Animals, Livestock Guardian Dogs, Police Working Dogs, and Dangerous Dogs shall only be licensed at the Township Administration Office.
- Kennel licenses can be issued to Canadian Kennel Club (CKC) members only and proof of valid CKC
 membership is required. Kennel licenses will now also require an approved Site Plan, must adhere
 to minimum standards, and will be subject to an annual inspection. Kennel licenses are issued at the
 Township office only.
- All dog owners must adhere to the minimum health and general well-being standards.
- PROVINCIAL LEGISLATION REQUIRES THAT ALL DOGS HAVE CURRENT RABIES VACCINATIONS.
- All animal bites should be immediately reported to The Oxford County Board of Health at 519-539-9800.

The Farm 911 Emily Project is taking the importance of rural safety to the next level. Starting with our farm families and their properties. We believe all rural properties should be properly addressed.

The Farm 911 emergency awareness project came out of a tragedy that happened nearly four years ago in eastern Ontario. A seven-year-old girl named Emily Trudeau was the victim of a fatal farm accident. Emergency crews were called to the scene of Emily's accident, but the challenge with dispatching first responders in rural

areas is providing directions. First responders could not find Emily's location because a 911 sign or civic address did not exist for the field where the accident occurred. Unfortunately, first responders drove past the field and Emily's mother had to run out to the road to flag them down. Emily suffered traumatic injuries and later passed away in the hospital.

The Farm 911 Emily Project was launched in the summer of 2017 and has received support from various municipalities, fire departments, businesses, councillors and mayors. The initiative originated in the Counties of Northumberland, Hastings, Prince Edward and Lennox and Addington but we continue to spread the message across Ontario about the importance of 911 number signage at the entrances of rural properties.

In the event of an emergency, no one should have to wait helplessly for first responders to find them. Time is everything, and a civic address at the entrance to a vacant farm field could make all the difference.

Putting up 911 signage on field entrances, farm laneways, trail entrances, sugar bushes, woodlots and other rural properties will provide first responders with more accurate locations and will help reduce the chances of missing emergencies in remote locations.

Voter Information

How can you vote in the 2018 Municipal Election?

- By mail or attending the Township Office.
- Delivery of Voting Kits, including a ballot, will begin in the Fall to those that are on the Voters' List. Voters will receive a Voter Kit in the mail containing all of the materials required to place their vote by mail. The voter simply follows the instructions in their kit, deposits in the mail using the postage paid response envelope, and the ballots will be delivered to the Municipal Office for tabulating on Election Day. If you choose not to mail your vote or it is after the determined mailing date deadline, you may drop-off your ballot at the Municipal Office (274620 27th Line) during regular business hours or place in the after hours drop box.
- All ballots, whether mailed or hand delivered, are placed into a sealed ballot box that remains sealed until Election Day.

Who is eligible to vote in the Zorra Township Municipal **Election?**

A person is entitled to be an elector at an election held in a local municipality, if on voting day he or she is:

- a Canadian citizen;
- at least 18 years old;
- residing in the local municipality or an owner or tenant there, or the spouse of such owner or tenant; and
- not otherwise prohibited from voting

All school board nominations must be filed with the City of Woodstock

Who is eligible to run for Mayor or Councillor in Zorra Township?

In order to run for office in Zorra Township, an individual must be:

- A Canadian citizen; and
- At least 18 years of age; and
- A resident of the Township of Zorra, or
- An owner or tenant of land in the Township of Zorra, or the spouse of the owner or tenant; and
- Not legally prohibited from voting; and
- Not disqualified by any legislation from holding office


How do I file nomination papers?

All nomination forms must be filed in-person at the Township Office located at 274620 27th Line from May 1, 2018 until July 27, 2018 at 2 p.m. and provide the following:

- A completed Nomination Form
- At least 25 declaration of endorsements (Mayor and Council candidates only)
- Current acceptable identification
- Nomination filling fee

How does a candidate choose which ward to run in? Do you have to live in the ward you are running in?

A candidate can run for office in the ward of their choice. You do not have to live in the same ward you are running in. However, you do have to vote from the address at which you reside. For example, you live in Ward 2, but are running in Ward 1. You have to vote in Ward 2.

Third Party Advertiser Information

Who is a Third Party Advertiser?

A third party is any person or entity that is not a political party, candidate or constituency association, and that engages in political advertising. Third parties include corporations, partnerships, unincorporated businesses and associations, and many other groups.

What is a Third Party Advertisement?

A third party advertisement is a message in any medium (billboard, newspaper, radio, etc.) that supports or opposes a candidate. Third party advertising does not include issues-based advertising so groups that do public outreach can continue their issued-based advocacy work throughout the municipal election period. Advertising that does not cost money to post or broadcast, such as comments made on social media, will not be considered to be third party advertising.

Who can register as a Third Party Advertiser?

Individuals, corporations and unions can register as third party advertisers and can also make contributions to third party advertisers. Third party advertisers will need to register with the municipality where they want to advertise. Registration allows a third party advertiser to promote or oppose any candidate that the electors in the municipality can vote for (local council, school board trustee positions and regional or county council offices). Third party advertising must be done independently of candidates, who are not able to direct a third party advertiser. Candidates are not able to register as third party advertisers

RED CROSS SWIM PRESCHOOL

For swimmers 6 months - 5 years.

PARENT & TOT

Babies and their caregivers work on getting wet, buoyancy, rhythmic breathing, movement and shallow water entries and exits. Designed for children 4 to 24 months of age and their caregiver.

SEA TURTLE

Front and back floats and glides, jumping into chest-deep water with assistance, kicking on front and front swim.

SEA OTTER

Swimmers work on front and back floats and glides, kicking on front with a buoyant object, and will be able to swim 1 metre upon completion of this level

SALAMANDER

Swimmers work on improving their front and back float and jumping into chest-deep water unassisted. Kicking is added to the front and back glide and swimmers will be able to swim 2 metres upon completion.

SUNFISH

Swimmers work on kicking and can perform glides (front and back), enter deep water safely, float in deep water, swim with a PFD, and swim 5 metres continuously.

CROCODILE

Swimmers further develop the front and back glide with kick, front and back swim, jump into deep water, swim with a PFD in deep water, and swim 10 metres continuously

WHALE

Swimmers increase their distance on front and back glide with kick, increase distance on front and back swim, learn the sitting dive, and will be able to swim 15 metres continuously upon completion of the level.

RED CROSS SWIM KIDS

For swimmers 6 years and older.

LEVEL 1

Swimmers develop front and back float, front and back glide, flutter kick (assisted), shallow water entries and exits, and swim 5 metres

LEVEL 2

Swimmers learn front and back glide with flutter kick, develop front swim, complete assisted deep-water activities and swim 10 metres continuously.

LEVEL 3

Swimmers increase their distance on front and back glide with flutter kick, perform flutter kick unassisted, wear a PFD in deep water, float in deep water, and swim 15 metres continuously.

LEVEL 4

Swimmers learn back swim with shoulder roll and front crawl (10m), work on flutter kick on back, perform kneeling dive, introduction to sculling and swim 25 metres continuously.

LEVEL 5

Swimmers develop front crawl (15m), learn back crawl (15m) and whip kick on back, learn stride dive and treading water, perform head-first sculling on back, and swim 50 metres continuously

LEVEL 6

Swimmers increase their distance on front and back crawl (25m), learn elementary back stroke (15m), learn

dolphin kick, tread water in deep water, perform front dive, and swim 75 metres continuously

LEVEL 7

Swimmers increase their distance on front and back crawl (50m) and elementary back stroke (25m), learn front scull, perform whip kick on front and dolphin kick, learn stride entry and swim 150 metres continuously

LEVEL 8

Swimmers increase their distance on front and back crawl (50m) and elementary back stroke (25m), learn front scull, perform whip kick on front and dolphin kick, learn stride entry and swim 150 metres continuously

I FVFI 9

Swimmers increase their distance on front and back crawl (100m), elementary back stroke (50m) and breast stroke (25m), learn sidestroke kick, perform head-first surface dive, and swim 400 metres continuously

LEVEL 10

Swimmers increase their distance on front and back crawl (100m), elementary back stroke (50m) and breast stroke (50m), learn sidestroke (25m), perform dolphin kick (vertical), learn feet- and head-first surface dives with underwater swim, and swim 500 metres continuously

PRIVATE LESSONS

For swimmers who prefer one on one instruction.

A 1 on 1 setting designed to provide extra attention to a specific skill or a swimmers need that group lessons may not address. Tree Planting around Zorra!

Trees help to clean the air and fight against global climate change, they also impact aesthetic, social, economic and health benefits.

Environmental needs are becoming increasingly important across our globe and every tree helps!!

Throughout the Township of Zorra there are various tree planting programs available for residents. Available programs are as follows:



New Memorial Forest Sign!! Located on the 43rd Line, North of Road 68.

Township of Zorra Memorial Tree Program

Memorial Trees can be purchased, in memory of loved ones, at the Township Office for \$40.00 through the Upper Thames River Conservation Authority (UTRCA). Individuals may also have their loved ones name added to a memorial tree sign when they purchase a tree for an additional fee per plaque. Signs are located at Grace Patterson Park in Thamesford, Embro Conservation Area and Harrington Conservation Area. The trees are planted in various locations throughout Zorra on Township or UTRCA property at a pre-determined location. Approximately 120 trees, usually 6'-8' sugar maples, have been planted throughout the Township since the start of this program in 1995. Fill out the Memorial Tree Request Form on the Zorra website www.zorra.on.ca or contact the Township Office.

Township of Zorra Memorial Tree Forest

Zorra Township has partnered with Brock and Visser Funeral Home – Thamesford Chapel and UTRCA to have trees planted in memory of those individuals whose funeral arrangements have been conducted through Brock and Visser Funeral Home. The Memorial Tree Forest is located on the 43rd Line, North of Road 68 on land owned by UTRCA. The trees are purchased by Brock and Visser Funeral Home. The trees that are being planted are native species, 6'-8' in size. Since 2015, approximately 150 have been planted in the forest. Contact Brock and Visser for more details at 519-285-2427.

Township of Zorra Replacement Tree Program

Currently when the Township of Zorra Public Works staff take down a tree along a road side or near private property, they offer the land owner two trees to replace the one that was removed. The two trees are for planting on their private property. In 2017, 150 6'-8' sugar maple trees were planted through this program. 
UTRCA Private Lands Program

Brooksdale Women's Institute and Our Legacy



For ninety-five years Brooksdale Women's Institute, a branch of the Federated Women's Institutes of Ontario, has offered opportunities to the people of this community in (West) Zorra Township, Oxford County, aligned with the FWIO motto "For Home and Country".

BWI offered "comfort boxes" for our soldiers, leadership programs for short courses, 4-H programs, executive positions, and floats for the Embro Fair parade, as well as exhibits and prize money. Fundraisers took the form of catering the Zorra Caledonian Society's Haggis Supper for 25 years, euchre games, and fashion shows. With these finances, BWI supported the Women's Institute scholarship program, the Red Cross, the Canadian Cancer Society, the CNIB, the Embro & Zorra Agricultural Society and its Ambassador program, War Memorial Children's Hospital/Children's Hospital of Western Ontario, Ronald MacDonald House, Save the Children Fund, Canadian Mental Health Association, Oxford Family & Children's Services, Art In The Classroom, 4-H, ZHPPS by donating three sewing machines as well as sports uniforms, the Embro Community Center, Cambrocourt landscaping, the Township of Zorra Fire & Emergency Services. BWI remembered new babies in our community, and the sick and shut-ins. BWI members served Oxford District Women's Institute. London Area Women's Institute, and FWIO in many positions, and were proud to be part of FWIO lobbying efforts which started with the mandatory pasteurization of milk sold in the province and led to important innovations such as flashing lights on school buses. Many boxes of yarn and craft materials supported our sisters in the Caribbean, while other boxes of supplies helped the life-saving work of midwives in South America. Memorial donations honouring past members have contributed to the upkeep of the Adelaide Hunter Hoodless Homestead and the Erland Lee Museum, both National Historic Sites memorializing the founding of Women's Institutes. BWI dedicated the Youngsville plague in 1984. The value of the initiatives and work undertaken by the women of this community, their contributions to its growth and development, the joy of the social interactions, and the fun experienced, cannot be expressed.

The Tweedsmuir History Books are records of communities, preserved over the years by Women's

Institute branches everywhere. BWI's legacy is our Tweedsmuir Community History Books, which record the activities of the Brooksdale community, the family farms, and our people. Scrapbooking became important to the Tweedsmuir Books as clippings from local newspapers were collected, recording the activities and life moments, big and small, of generations, with photos and print.

These Tweedsmuir Community Books are now closed, following the formal motion to disband Brooksdale Women's Institute on March 13, 2018. This was the final action of a process undertaken with care and attention to ensure that the books could be closed in both a literal and a figurative sense. The task of digitizing all forty-one of BWI's Community History Books, and its Minute Books, will be complete in the very near future. Following a process, these pages will be made available on the World Wide Web, as part of FWIO's Virtual Archives, which will allow for present and future generations to research the Brooksdale community and its people. BWI's written records and its Tweedsmuir Books have been delivered to the Oxford County Archives where they will be stored. The Archives will also house the digitized books on USB sticks; these items continue to be the property of FWIO.

We, the members of the former Brooksdale Women's Institute, are very proud of our Brooksdale Tweedsmuir Community History Books, the historical record of Brooksdale, its people and its community. This is BWI's legacy to the community which we have served "For Home and Country".

Tweedsmuir books from across the province, once digitized, are being added to FWIO's Virtual Archives, and thus made accessible as valuable research tools. Their importance has been recognized by Library and Archives Canada, which has now provided funds in the amount of \$100,000 per year for three years to help FWIO digitize more Tweedsmuir collections and other record books.


