I am writing on behalf of the Corporation of the Town of Ingersoll concerning our opposition to Walker Industries proposed landfill at the Carmeuse Quarry. As you know, the Town is wholly committed to doing whatever it can to stop this proposed landfill from becoming a reality. Road Crew Activities

Capital

- Hofstetter Road extension – B gravel for the base is in and work has started on the walk path and ditches. Steed and Evans has started on the Urban section. They have been working on the Drains and Watermain.
- CN Bridge on Gobles Rd. – CN says everything is progressing; they are working with the contractor on dates for the dismantling of the bridge and coordinating the arrival and construction of the new 3 span structure. Confidence is still high that it will be completed this year.
- New 1 – ton truck was delayed due to a back ordered part. We will receive the first week of Oct.
- River Rd. – Milling was completed September 26. Widening started on September 28 and paving is scheduled to start on October 4. Road markings will be scheduled for the week of October 10.
- Denise and I filed an OCIF Grant application for Bridge 20 again this year.
- KLT of Plattsville has been retained to replace 2 overhead doors with openers at the Drumbo shop.

County Shared Service/Road Association/Training

- Shared Services meeting – At our Sept.12th meeting we had discussion about gravel pits overloading dump wagons pulled by tractors. These are not legislated vehicles and therefore have NO weight restriction. It is not a big problem yet in our Township however they are becoming more popular. The group has talked to local pit owners and the majority have agreed to only load these vehicles with a max 15 tonne.
 - Next meeting – October 12th.
- Road Association – At our September 14th meeting it was brought up that operator winter maintenance training will be on October 25 & 26.
 - It was also the meeting we have elections for our 2018 executive. I will be remaining as Secretary/Treasurer.

Background:

Township Road 3 currently has STOP signs with Canning Road as a through street. The ADT for Township Road 3 is 450 vehicles in a 24 hr period and the ADT for Canning Road is 241 vehicles in a 24 hr period. Residence at the corner of Township Road 3 have raised safety concerns that while backing out of their driveways onto Township Road 3 they have almost been hit by vehicles coming off of Canning Road. While at the Stop sign on Township Road 3 we have had complaints about visibility looking to the South. There is a safety risk when vehicles headed North on Canning Road want to make a right turn onto Township Road 3. If a vehicle, person or object is on the road they are not visible until the turn is completed. (i.e. it is a blind corner)

Analysis/Discussion:

The Ontario Traffic Manual lists All way STOP controls as: "In some circumstances, it may be appropriate to install STOP signs on all approaches to an intersection. This results in an all-way stop condition, All-way STOP sign controls disrupt the flow of traffic and introduce delays to all drivers within the intersection and should only be considered at the intersection of two relatively equal roadways having similar traffic volume demand and operating characteristics. The approaches should be directly opposing (i.e. not offset), should preferably approach at right angles (i.e. no skewed approaches) and have an equal number of lanes."

After speaking with residence and observing traffic flows at this intersection a 4 way STOP is recommended. The demographic is changing in the area, there are young families with small children living in the area. A 4 way STOP at this intersection will improve safety and have minimal impact on the motoring public.

BY-LAW NUMBER 2036-2017

Being a By-law to confirm the proceedings of Council.

WHEREAS by Section 5 of the *Municipal Act* 2001, S.O. 2001, c.25, the powers of a municipal corporation are to be exercised by its Council.

AND WHEREAS by Section 11 of the *Municipal Act* 2001, S.O. 2001, c.25, the powers of every Council are to be exercised by by-law;

AND WHEREAS it is deemed expedient that the proceedings of the Council of the Corporation of the Township of Blandford-Blenheim at this meeting be confirmed and adopted by by-law;

NOW THEREFORE the Council of the Corporation of the Township of Blandford-Blenheim hereby enacts as follows:

1. That the actions of the Council of the Corporation of the Township of Blandford-Blenheim in respect of each recommendation contained in the reports of the Committees and each motion and resolution passed and other action taken by the Council of the Corporation of the Township of Blandford-Blenheim, at this meeting held on October 4, 2017 is hereby adopted and confirmed as if all such proceedings were expressly embodied in this by-law.
2. That the Mayor and proper officials of the Corporation of the Township of Blandford-Blenheim are hereby authorized and directed to do all things necessary to give effect to the actions of the Council referred to in the proceeding section hereof.
3. That the Mayor and the CAO / Clerk be authorized and directed to execute all documents in that behalf and to affix thereto the seal of the Corporation of the Township of Blandford-Blenheim.
