 "He played the game"

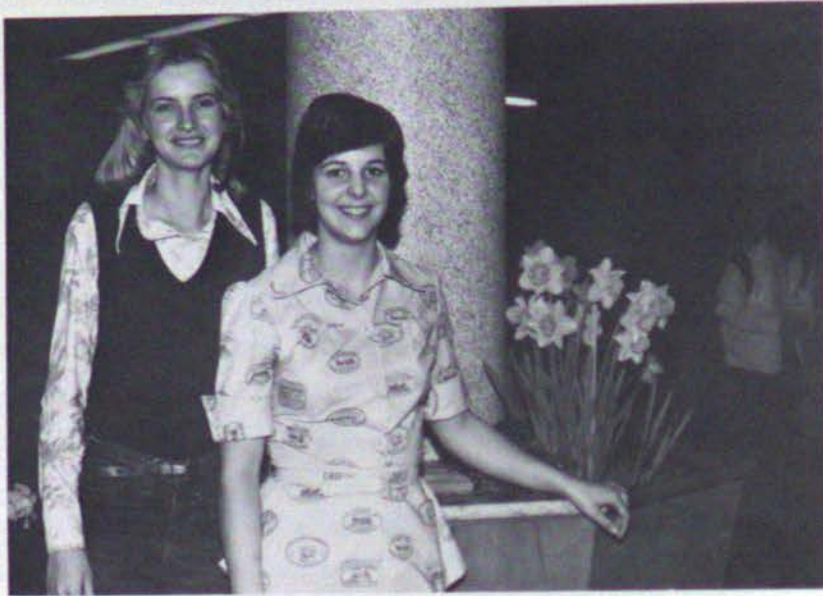
And so we, too, in humbler ways

Farewell



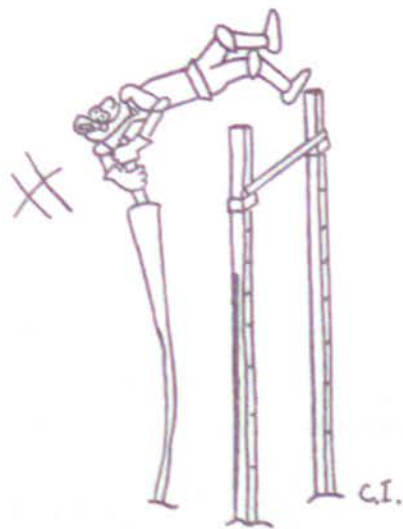
With the end of this school year Annandale is losing two outstanding members of its faculty.

Every student is free and welcome to join in the activities and through these associations you build up invaluable experiences that will remain with you long after your formal education has been completed.

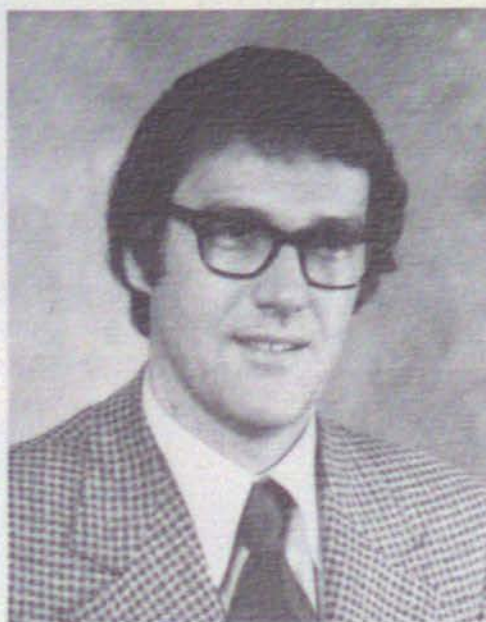

Message from the Director of Education

Aristotle long ago said, "Men acquire virtues not by knowing what they are, nor by talking about them, nor by admiring and praising them, but by practising them".

The pursuit of education experiences ever-changing motives from era to era. In one there is an economic thrust; in another, a cultural one. Sometimes it must be a melding of the two. In examining contemporary society in 1975, we note its rifts and conflicts and hear its groans and protests. We appear as lemmings hastening to the precipice and to oblivion in the sea below. At a time when man is in possession of so much knowledge is he placing sufficient emphasis on the need for finding virtues as Aristotle suggests they should be found?

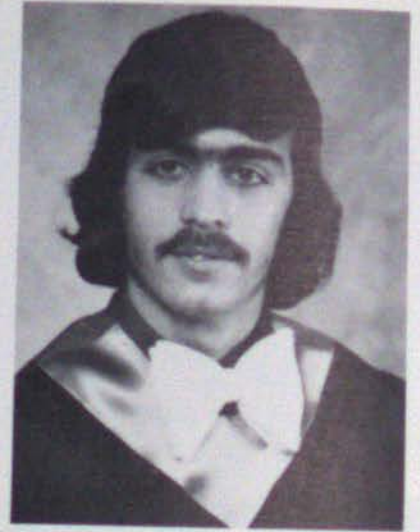




Valedictory Address

"We are the hollow men
We are the stuffed men
Leaning together
Headpiece filled with straw. Alas!
Our dried voices when
We whisper together
Are quiet and meaningless
As wind in dried grass
Or rat's feet over broken glass
In our dry cellar."

T. S. Eliot



Each of us here tonight sees himself in a more optimistic light. We do not even remotely resemble these "Hollow men". And yet we may. If we abandon ourselves to a life of mindless conformity; indeed we shall be "men of straw". We must cling to the vital threads which separate us from our machines ... our ability to love and to sorrow and to laugh.

For as long as there have been valedictory addresses, graduating classes have been reminded of the callous world which looms ahead of them. Raw and virgin to the experiences which lie ahead, we must not merely endure, we must prevail. It is said that, "we must fill the shoes of those who have come before us," that "the youth of today is the future of tomorrow", "it is our duty".

May I suggest that there is something more to life than "filling the shoes of others"? Man should have a greater goal than to merely carry on. A world that is so sterile that it measures man only on his ability to invent, to labour, and to progress can hardly be a world worth preparing ourselves for. Man is not merely the sum total of his parts. He must be much more. He must be measured by his sorrows as well as his labours; his failures as well as his advances. How long could man survive "as true men" in a world where logic, fact and output are the only foundation of Society?

I plead with each of you not to passively accept this life. Granted man will someday build planes that will whisk him around the world between breakfast and lunch; he may find a cure for the common cold; he may even create life where there was no life before.

I do not wish to depreciate the value of man's technology for its scope of usefulness is so vast that it speaks its own defence. But the glory and the CURSE of mankind is his technology. It raises him above the beasts of the field and the forest, but it may also doom him as a species. Care must be taken not to create a 'Frankenstein' that we are powerless to stop. If not held in check, man's technology will erupt in the holocaust that will end us all. This "check" of which I speak? ... men's souls ... spirits capable of compassion and sacrifice and endurance. We face a much greater challenge than to follow the footsteps of others; ours is to bring back the peace and understanding to this almost barren world. Humanism and technology must be intertwined in a carefully balanced system. As long as we retain our intense and sometimes irrational feelings, compassion and humanism we will prevail. If we abandon our feelings, we will become hollow and thin, meagre and insignificant.

Tonight we must remember that Annandale was vital to the conquering of the hollow man that dwelt in each of us. In our years at Annandale, we were not so much instructed in formal theory as we were instructed in the faculty of being human. Our minds, so supple, as impressionable as clay, were molded here. The mold was humanistic; the product was a sense of self. The spirit of work and achievement, of individual development and success were the greatest gifts we have all received.

Memory is a vital part of our condition. In gathering tonight we will not remember the four walls of a room, but rather the bonds of friendship and harmony. We will remember the teachers ... in many ways, and as we say 'Goodbye', we do not comprehend the debt we owe. I would like to thank all those both staff and students who made our stay so memorable.

The world holds forth the manacles of non-being. In defense I would suggest we must fall back on these memories of comradeship and humanism. For in the final definition of our existence what lies behind us, or before us, is not so important as what lies within us.

I thank you.

Next to OFSSA at Collingwood. The OFSSA 'A' Championships were very well organized. We played two games, along with attending a banquet and dance for the teams.

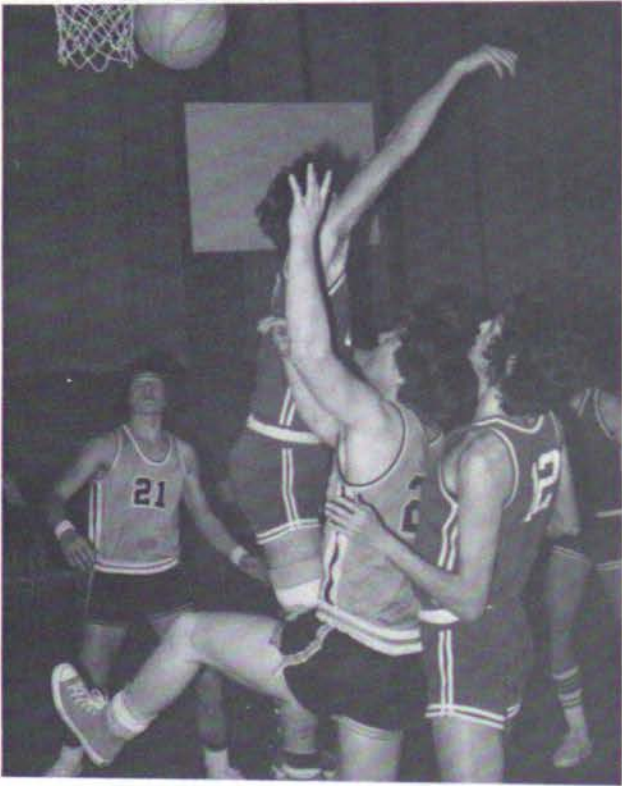
In our first game we easily won 67-46 against Ernstown from the Ottawa Valley.

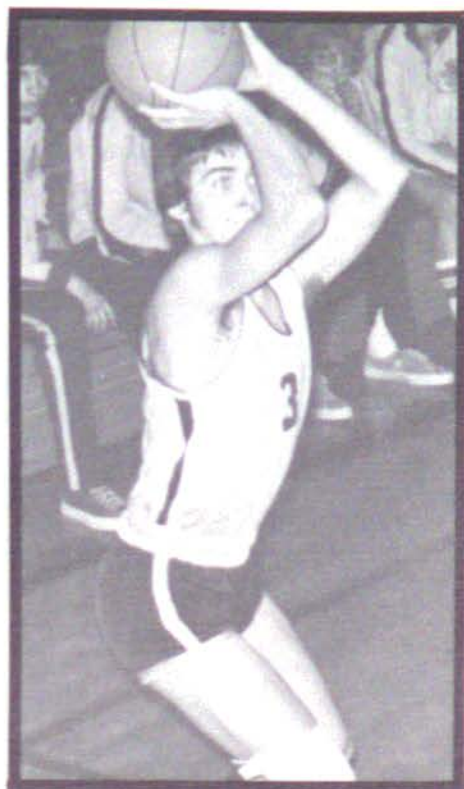

Although our club was small, we enjoyed the times we had together.

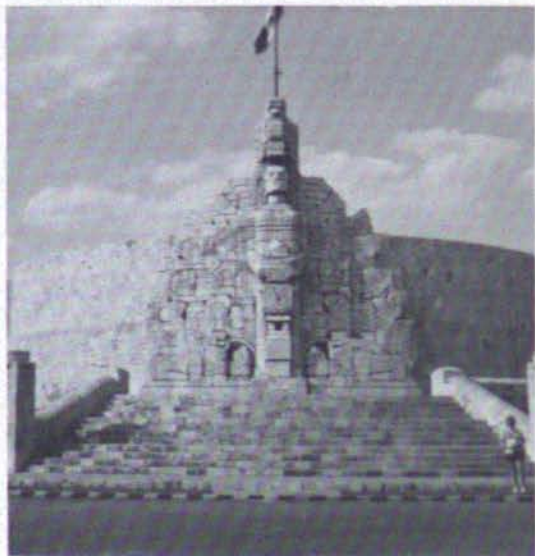
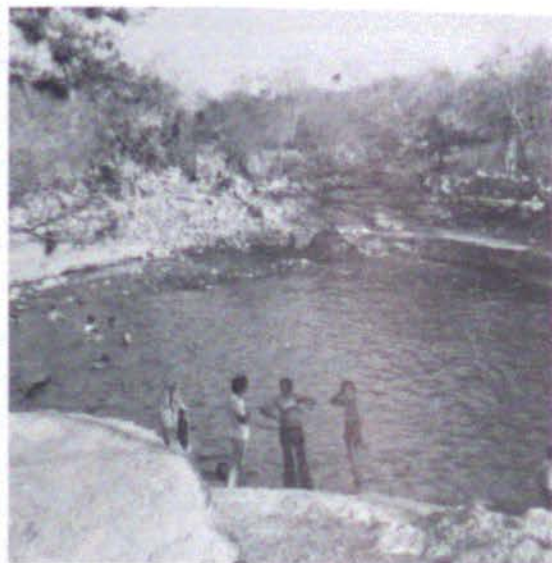
