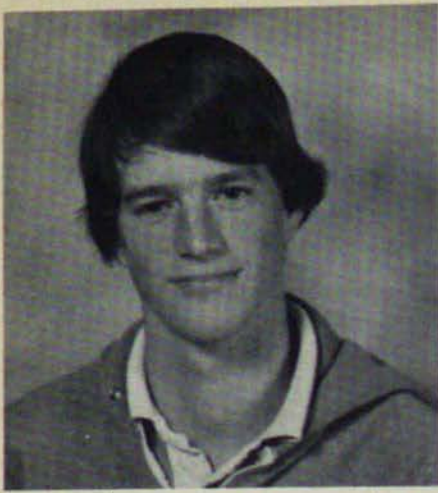

Until the end of time.

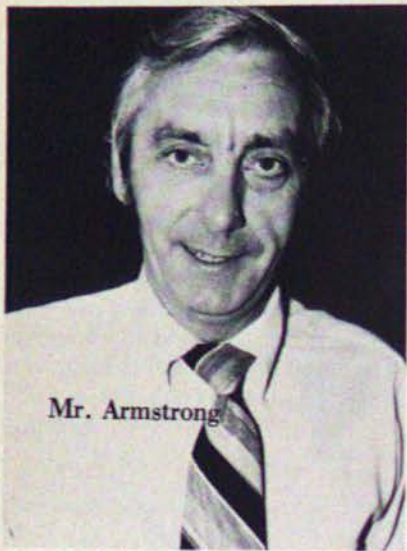


Mr. Glen Sharp

On behalf of the Annandale family, the Tatler would like to thank you for giving so much. Good luck in the future in whatever you do.

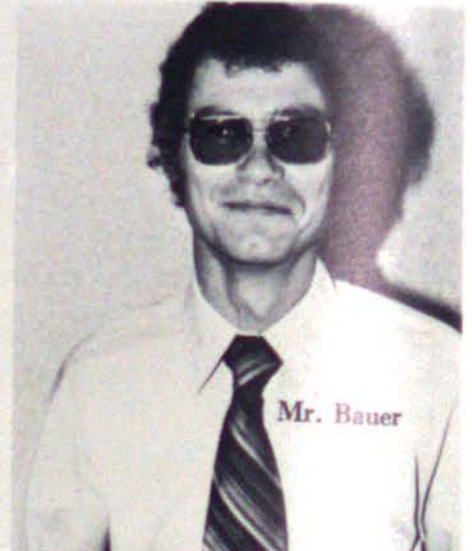

The players of the team would like to say a special "Thank-you" to Mr. Donaldson, who gave his time and effort throughout the season.



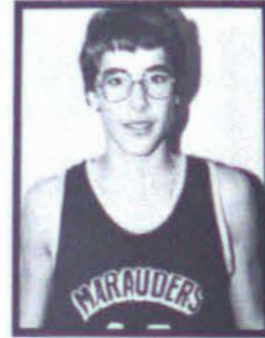

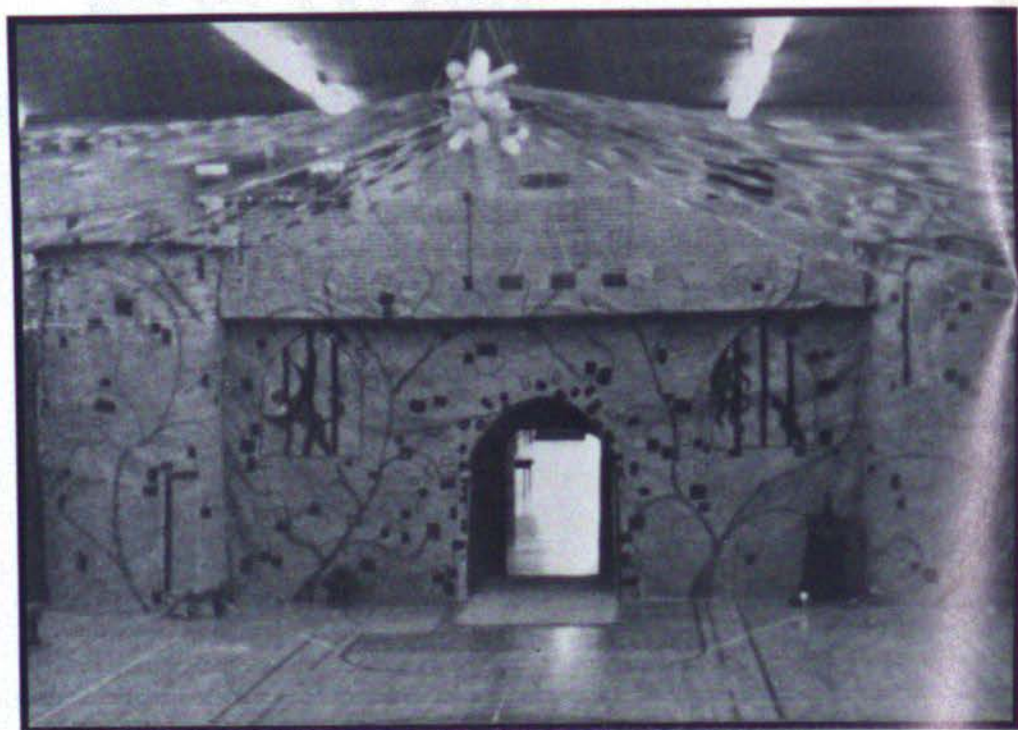
Many of the Drama Club members were also involved in Performance '79, helping to make it another success.

hoofs.

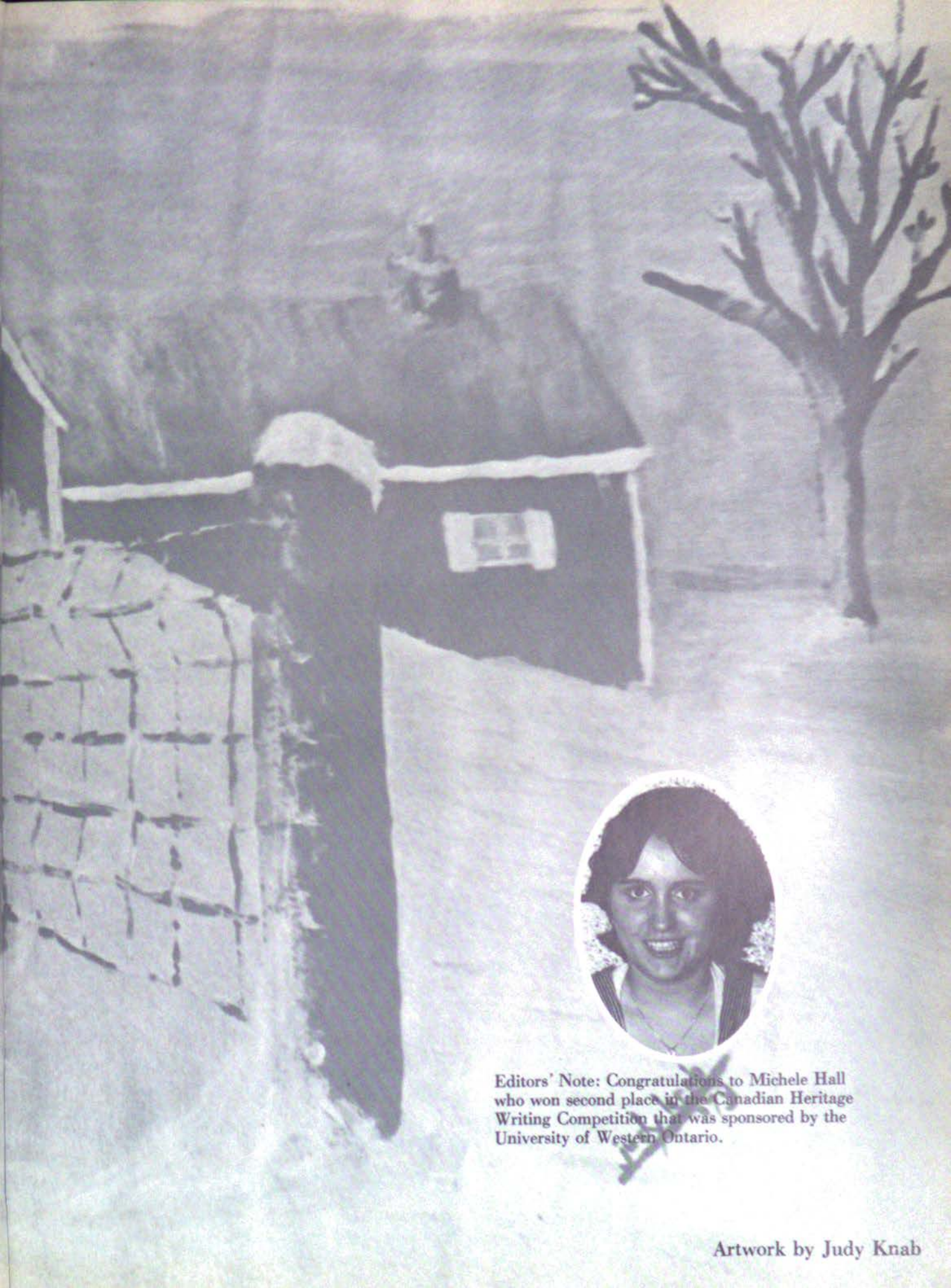
He also knew the country's hostile face,
