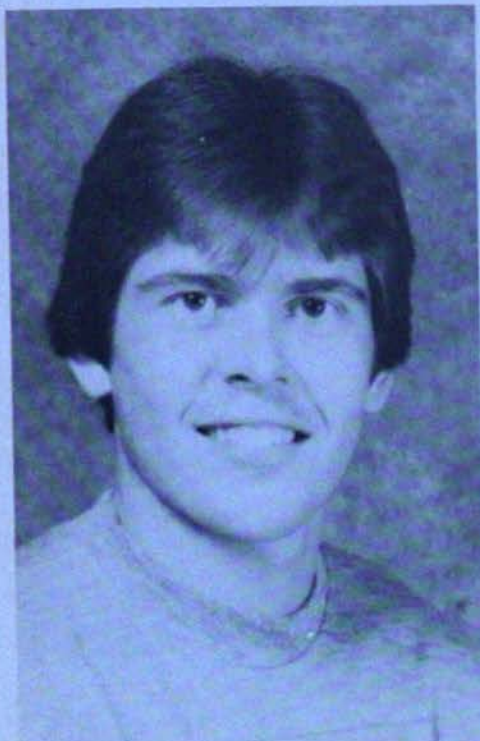
And thanks to all those people who went out advertising for the yearbook. Thanks to all of the people and companies who bought ads from us, and to our Patrons.

## From the Principal

As Annandale moves into its fourth decade, there is considerable uncertainty in secondary school education. Declining enrolment and the "Secondary Education Review Project" dominate educational thinking. High schools have been forced to come to grips with dwindling numbers, and nobody knows for sure where "SERP" is taking us.

This school's answer, in part, to declining enrolment, is "Integration". Integration is much like walking a tight rope. It is not easy to enter into an atmosphere of cooperation and togetherness, while still attempting to maintain one's individuality. While forging ahead with combined colours, a new name, and co-ordinated timetables, the school has attempted to keep its distinct identity.

The Tatler is an example of this. It continues to provide an enduring record of the happenings of this school. While, in name, "Marauders" and "Panthers" are no longer with us, many of the clubs, organizations, and activities remain unique to this student body. These things continue to bring our students together, and help to produce the same spirit and enthusiasm as was present before "Gemini" was introduced.

Our successes on the sports field suggest that we have walked the tight-rope well to date. With "SERP" and the potential changes that it suggests - abolition of Grade 13 for one - a new challenge is right around the corner. While still consolidating in the one area, we may be required to break new ground in another. May we continue to move together in this undertaking in the same spirit of co-operation as in the past.

We have lost a true person and a valuable friend.



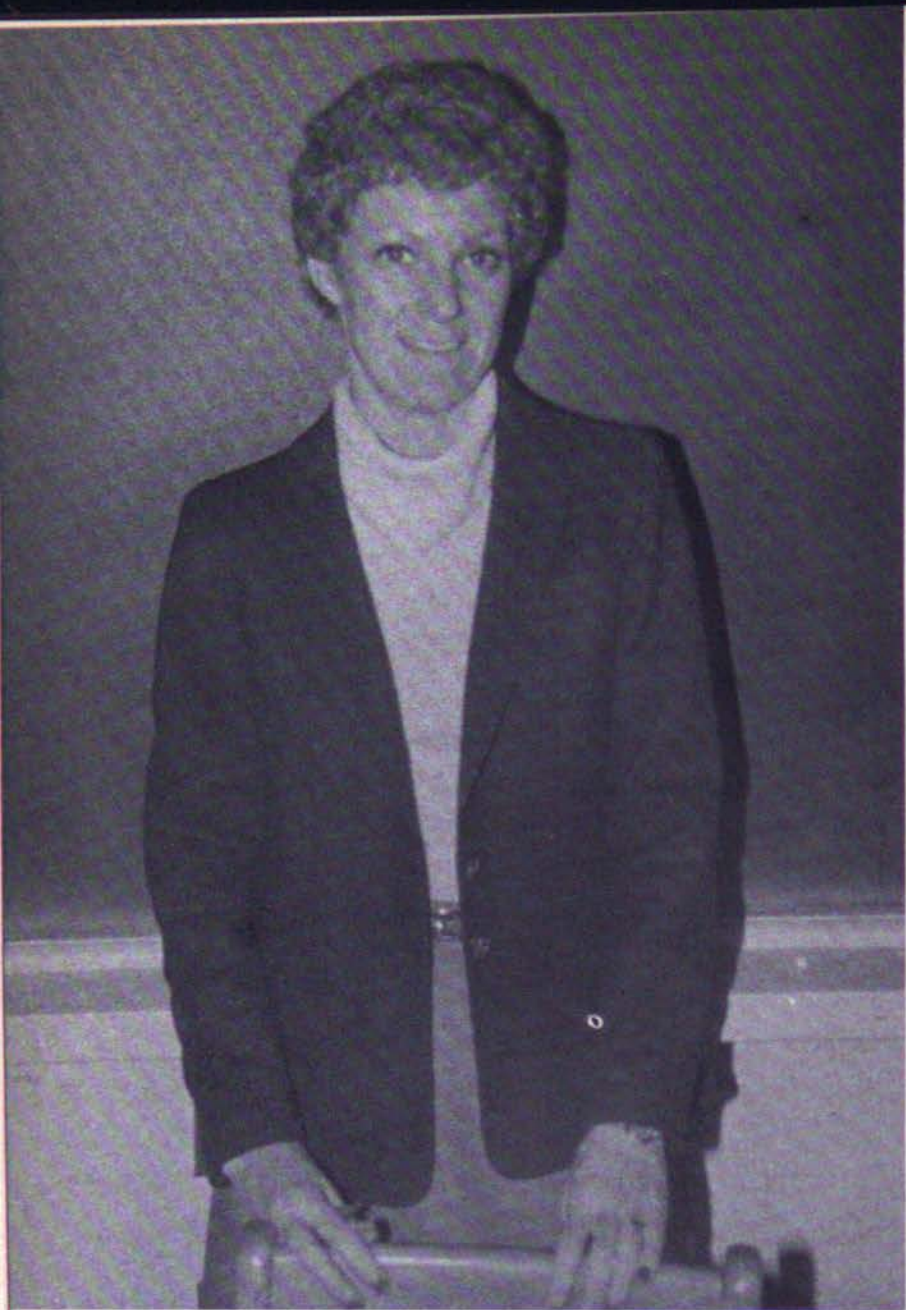

Our business manager, Archie Verhoeve, has a distinct flair for working with people and for selling advertising. We thank both of them for the uncounted hours of involvement in the TATLER that they have given to the school. Both cared a great deal.

However, two people cannot turn out a yearbook. This year the TATLER was fortunate to have capable people "to come off the bench" who brought enthusiasm and pride to our organization when everyone was most tired.

Kelly Everitt, Lori Graves, and Laurie MacFarlane, Grade 11 students, handled every problem with capability and good humour. They will be excellent co-editors for TATLER 82.

Dave Stover effectively organized the last hunt for advertisements to pull us into the "black" once more. We look forward to working with him as Business Manager next year.

And, finally, a focus on the "Mafia" - the Grade 10 crew that worked every night through May and June and turned out an amazing number of pages of copy when the deadline situation looked hopeless. Our special thanks to Susan MacFarlane, Kathy Nunn, Paula Rice, Roxanne Goethals, Jane Anderson, and Sherry Sandham for doing so much for the TATLER this year and, most of all, for bringing back laughter and music and pop and potato chips to the TATLER process.

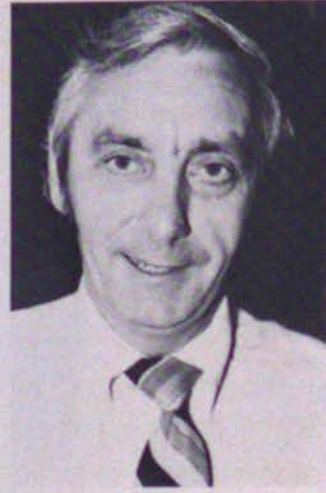

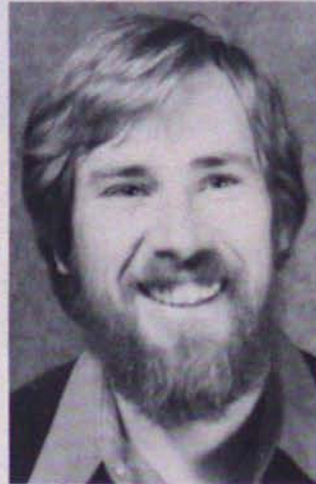

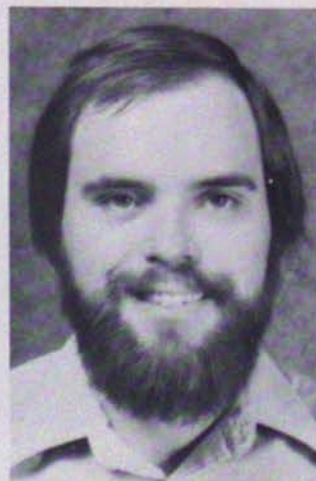

# Valedictory Address

Platform guests, staff members, fellow graduates, family and friends.

I would first of all like to express my deepest gratitude for this honor which you have bestowed upon me.

Valedictorian seems to have various meanings at different schools. I was under the impression that the Valedictorian was the person with the highest academic standing as it is in many schools. I soon realized that there was more to it than that after a Monday morning, one of the few Monday mornings I was able to attend, during which I talked with my homeroom teacher Mr. Hall. Some people labelled it school spirit, some people labelled it love and caring. In any respect, no matter what you call it, I still call it Annandale. The difference between a high school and Annandale is similar to that between a house and a home.

Trying to evaluate what this specialness does for you is very hard. It affects you in so many ways that the only real way which you can describe it is that it makes you a well rounded conscientious person. It is along the lines of a social education. You learn to interact with people loving, caring, laughing and crying. So many people today are educated but just can not function with other people. This is a necessity which all too many people neglect. At Annandale you are forced to respond to it. I know we were from grade nine when we were dressed as supermen and cheerleaders on Initiation Day, until the final day of school, a very painful day in many ways for those of grade twelve or thirteen.

We soon realized that just as a home must send its young out into the world, so Annandale must send its graduates. Many young people are afraid when they leave home that they won't have what it takes to succeed in the world. I'm sure that many of the graduates have that same fear, however, it is up to each individual graduate to realize that Annandale has given us all we need to succeed. Annandale instilled the seed of success in all of us, we just have to provide it with the conditions to grow.

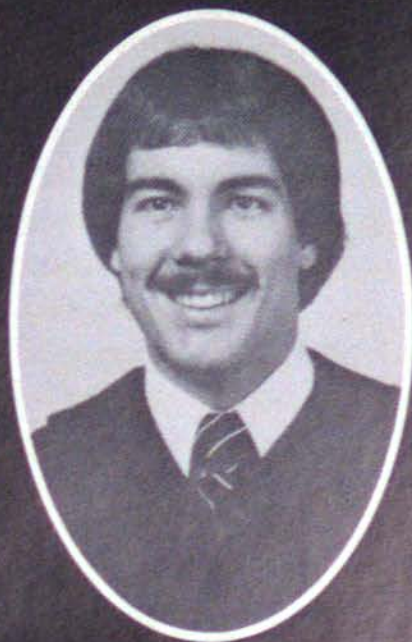

We've had some great years together and none of us will ever forget the things we've learned and achieved together. I think Emily Dickinson said it best when she said "Parting is all we know of Heaven and all we need of Hell".

I would also like to express our gratitude to our family and friends. Without your love, caring, and support we never would have made it.

For the first time in Ontario, two separate schools have become integrated. Glendale and Annandale High Schools began a major change in their school system at the start of the 80-81 school year. Although some students were introduced to this system beforehand, it did not become available to all students until this year.

Although the two schools have had many problems throughout the year, for the most part, the problems were minor and could be handled.

Some students feel as though the integration system is not working. My view of this is opposite. I feel the integration plan works very well, allowing students to take a wider variety of courses. The integration system also allows students to associate with more people and have more friends.

At Annandale, separate home forms called I-A and I-G were set up for integrated students. This allowed teachers as well as the office to have an easier way of taking attendance. Next year, we will see the end of this as home forms will once again be back to normal.

Some students dislike the integration system because they feel segregated. In years to come it is hoped that many of the problems that exist will be solved, and we will have a major integration system that works, and works well.

In closing, I would personally like to thank Mr. McKenzie and Mr. Birtwell for their cooperation throughout the year.

During the year we took part in several tournaments, gaining a great deal of experience and several championship titles.

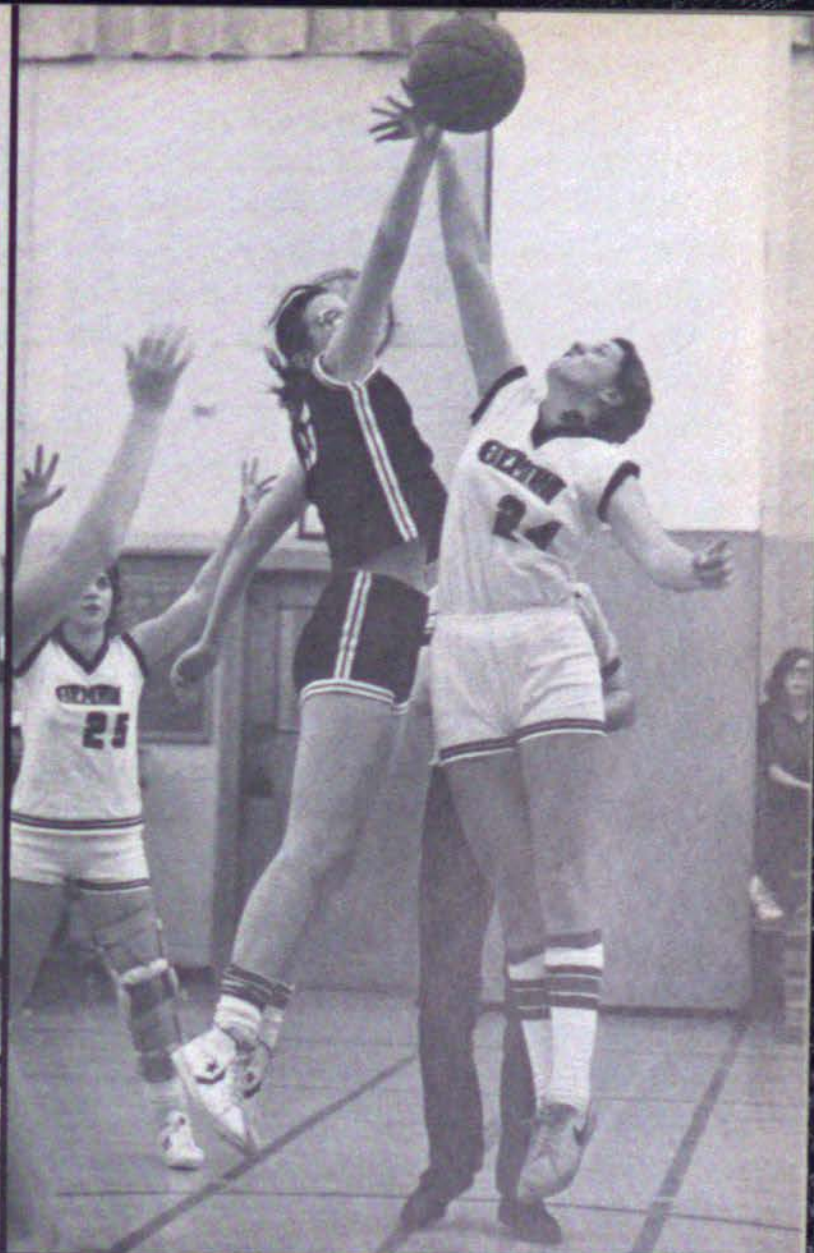

We would also like to thank Mr. O'Rourke for often dropping in to our practices and for assisting us a tremendous amount.

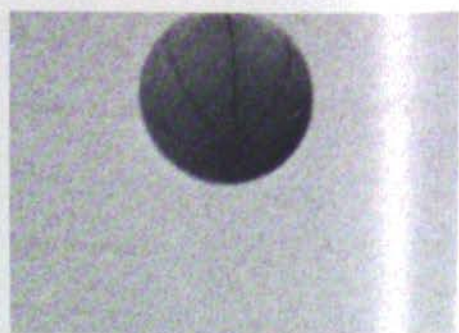
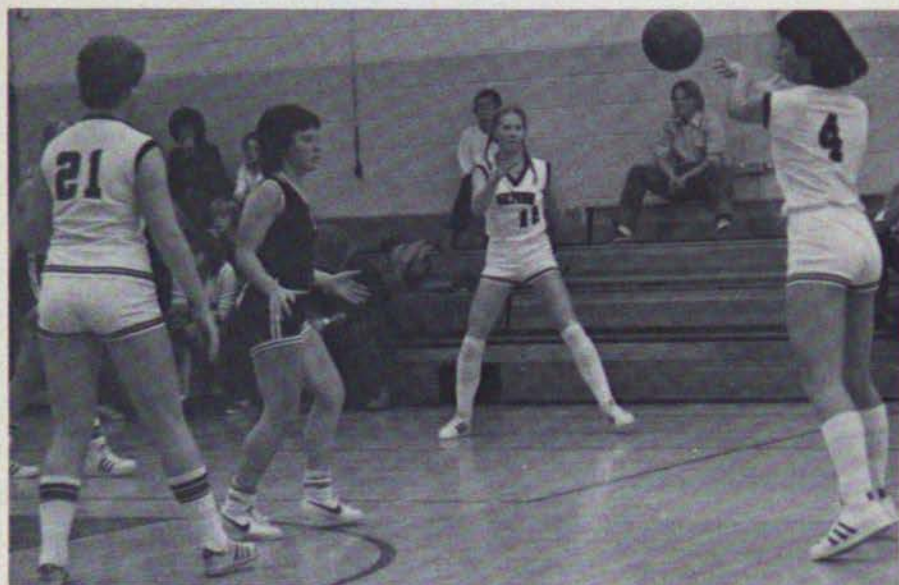

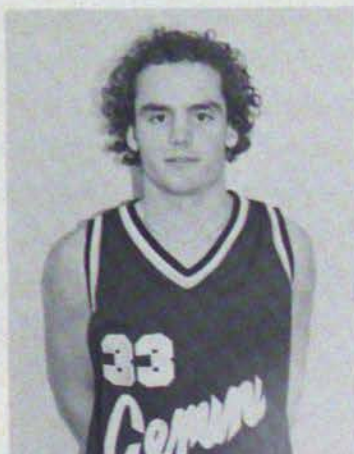
## COACH'S COMMENT
