A MESSAGE FROM THE PRINCIPAL



The future is yours. Get involved - be ready for it. All the best in your future endeavours.



We say farewell to Mr. Steve Blasko who has been with us here at Annandale for the past two years as Vice-Principal.





Matt Austin is graduating and has contributed much help to our tennis program during his five year tenure with the team - we wish him well in his future activities.


