




THE MINOR NINERS!

Annandale is something special, and it is probably not until tonight, as we receive







Together, we have found a security within this building - a special feeling that is very hard to say farewell to.


Tonight we have come back together to that building and to those friends who have shared so much with us. As



IN MEMORIAM

JERRED MANSFIELD

1893-1985

Jerred I. Mansfield died Tuesday, January 22, 1985, at the age of 91. Born on a farm near Clear Creek in former Houghton Township, Mr. Mansfield had farmed in New Road area before and after the First World War before moving to Tillsonburg some 50 years ago.

One of Tillsonburg's foremost citizens, Mr. Mansfield was especially noted for his involvement with and contributions to the Royal Canadian Legion, the North Broadway Baptist Church, the Tillsonburg Museum, and Annandale High School.

Mr. Mansfield ("Jerry") was retired as stationary engineer at the old Tillsonburg District High School and Annandale High School. While serving the school in that capacity, Mr. Mansfield had acted as photographer for the TATLER, as drill master for the girls' auxilliary to the Cadet Corps, as stage manager and trouble shooter for unnumbered presentations at Annandale, and as "friend" to every student who passed through the doors of the school.

Mr. Mansfield had never missed a Commencement until this past November when his illness prevented his attendance. He was honoured at the 1982 Commencement.

He is survived by his wife, the former Cenoe McConnell, and several nieces and nephews. His Annandale family will greatly miss his visits . . . his wit, his unflagging good humour, his insight, and his wisdom.

THOMAS GALLAGHER

As a result of an automobile accident on Saturday, January 12, 1985, Tom Gallagher, an Annandale student, along with his father, the Rev. Frederick James Gallagher, was killed. Tom was in his 17th year at the time of the accident.

Tom is survived by his mother, Mrs. Rosella Gallagher, his sisters, Ginger and Heather, and his brother, Peter.



PRINCIPAL'S MESSAGE






Once again, the U.N. Club had an enlightening and excitement-filled year. It was good to see old members remain and new members join, especially from the lower grades.

Annandale's annual

Annandale High School's annual "Performance" finished its three-day run last Friday having played to almost 600 people.

Named after the final show as winners of this year's Performance Scholarships were Barry Wass, one of the two stage managers for this year's show, and Jennifer Johnson and David Vallee, two of the headline performers in the show. All three are graduating students and all three have taken part in four "Performances" starting in 1981.

Producer Arn Stover was pleased with the response of the community to the Annandale student show. He commented upon the number of people who had praised the high level of talent displayed by the students. "And they weren't all moms or dads either!" he added.

After a disappointing Wednesday night crowd, the audiences grew to over 200 for each of the last two nights, giving the students and teachers involved some element of profit which will be spent on much-needed improvements to the lighting in the gymnatorium and in the theatre arts room.

The 1985 version of "Performance" was a calculated gamble as the students and staff gave stage exposure to four separate drama productions, three different bands and a wide variety of other entertainers. When "Performance 84" failed to go last year, Director Ian Moir and Mr. Stover decided to return to the foundations of the earlier Performances, the Annandale drama courses, and to use the students involved in Grade 12 dramatic arts as the

framework of the show. Each night the Grade 12 students mounted a different play around which were arranged a band performance each night and the different variety acts.

The resulting show was a severe challenge for two important segments of the Performance tradition - stage crew and emcees. The number of set changes was strenuous and challenging for Scott Gofton and Barry Wass's crew of Brian Nunn, Jamie Bray, Colin Humble, Jonathan Stover, Mark Smith and Danny Sandham. During the week Bob Clarke, Ted Karagias and Brad Ball had to be pressed into service as well

While the stage crew struggled to make their changes unobtrusively, the Performance emcees, Bram Koster, Bill Clarke, Cindy Meharg, Kim Holmes, Craig Mabee and Sheri Pinter fought for time and provided a meaningful or humorous continuity for the show.

On the final night of Performance the stage was changed four times with only a single intermission.

Wednesday night, the drama classes presented What Shall We Do With the Body?, featuring Melissa Chmarney, Fred Hahn and Vicky Major. The Thursday evening presentation involved a large cast comprising Craig Mabee, Cathy Hayfield, Marlene Parsons, Diane Wilson, Marcy Palmer, Lynda Lee Furlong, Brad

Ball, Randy Helsdon, Shirley Jeromin, Caroll Sys, Sheri Pinter, John Helsdon, Samantha Dawley and Fred Hahn in Country Gothic.

Murder Play, featuring Randy Helsdon, Kim Holmes, Sheri Pinter and Craig Mabee, was the Friday night presentation along with a Drama Club adaptation of Kurt Vonnegut's Fortitude under the direction of teacher Mike Woron. The Grade 9 cast included Becky Coward, Morganna Abbey, Kelly Epple, Cindy Friedrich, Sheri Schmedt, Munir Noormohamed and Sheri Grabstas. They were helped in staging by Sheri Pinter, Randy Helsdon and Zulekha Noormohamed, senior members of the Drama Club, and the Performance stage crew.

Featured in the variety segment of the show were David Vallee singing "As Time Goes By"; Paul DeVriendt at the piano, playing "Fur Elise" by Beethoven and Mozart's "Sonata"; Lisa Seymour in a modern dance sequence to the music "The Heat Is On"; and Mike Wybo singing his own composition "Follow Me."

Cathy Rayfield, accompanied by Nancy Jancsurak, entertained twice each evening, opening the show with "The Rose," and later singing "Against All Odds" and "Let It Be." David Vallee on piano and Jennifer Johnson on violin combined in J.S. Bach's "Air for G String" while Randy Helsdon, John Dean and Jason Gilpin made audiences laugh each night with a Monty Python skit "The Pope."

The Friday night Performance gave its debut to Just-Us, featuring Mike Nunn, Rob Varro, Eddie LeBlanc, Scott Foster and Terry Vanderheyden.

There could have been no show if it were not for the general production staff headed by the show's production co-ordinator, Becky Stover. Committees looking after publicity and posters were headed by students Mary-Ann Cocchetto, Sue Barzo and Alana Keba with advice from Mrs. Stover and Connie Bray.

The same students doubled on the Ticket Distribution Committee, directed by Gus Pellizzari and Irene Vandermeersch. The House Committee was under the direction of students Dean Keba and Jeff Dingwell while Maria Kiriakopoulos aided by Alana Keba, Anna Kuilboer, Leanne Boughner, Janet Dodgson, Lori Godfree and Deb Coles supervised the usherettes and the refreshment booth.

Andre DeDecker gave technical advice to the crew in charge of set design, construction and painting, including Jamie Bray, Scott Gofton, Sheri Grabstas, Colin Humble, Brian Nunn, Danny Sandham, Mark Smith, Jon Stover, Rob VanHooren and Barry Wass.

On lights were Mary-Ann Cocchetto, Leah Stroud, Sue Barzo, Bill Ketchabaw, Shannon Ross, Jamie Horvath and Dale Nurse. Tricia Moir was in charge of prompting and curtains while stage crew members Barry Wass and Danny Sandham doubled on sound. Talent coordinator, assisting Mr. Moir, was student David Vallee.

Almost 100 other students who acted as ticket representatives, made posters, worked on the house crew, or acted as usherettes have not even been named. Performance really does involve a large percentage of the students and staff of Annandale as you can see.

The Student Council was quite successful this year in accomplishing what it set out to do. We had an exciting and memory-filled time, with ample opportunities for learning and leadership throughout our term.


