Kim was one of the fortunate few who were able to spend the school year of 1985-86 aboard this Polish-built barquentine as a student - crew member - tourist.




This year's Midget Basketball Team got off to a shaky start, but talent and leadership soon proved out as the squad shaped into a tough defensive bunch.

After debating on literally hundreds of suggestions, the committee finally decided on the theme of "Tropical Paradise."


A loan was provided by the Student Council, and we were on our way. Decorating occurred on Tuesdays and Wednesdays from January until May.


To GUS PELLIZZARI, my thanks for all of the unnoted tasks and unthanked labours that everyone in the school takes for granted.
