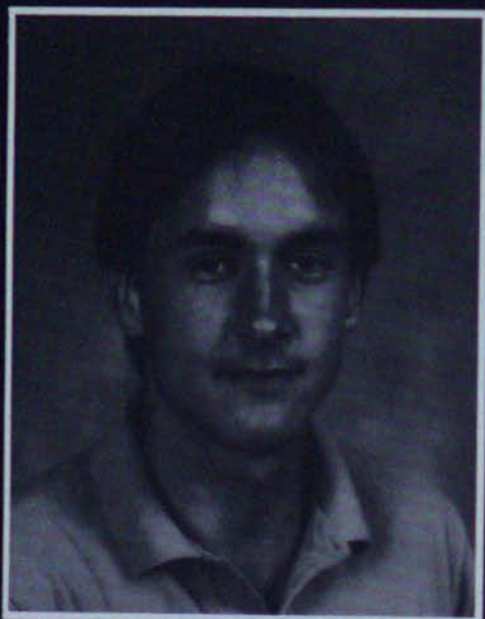






# OUR VALEDICTORIAN

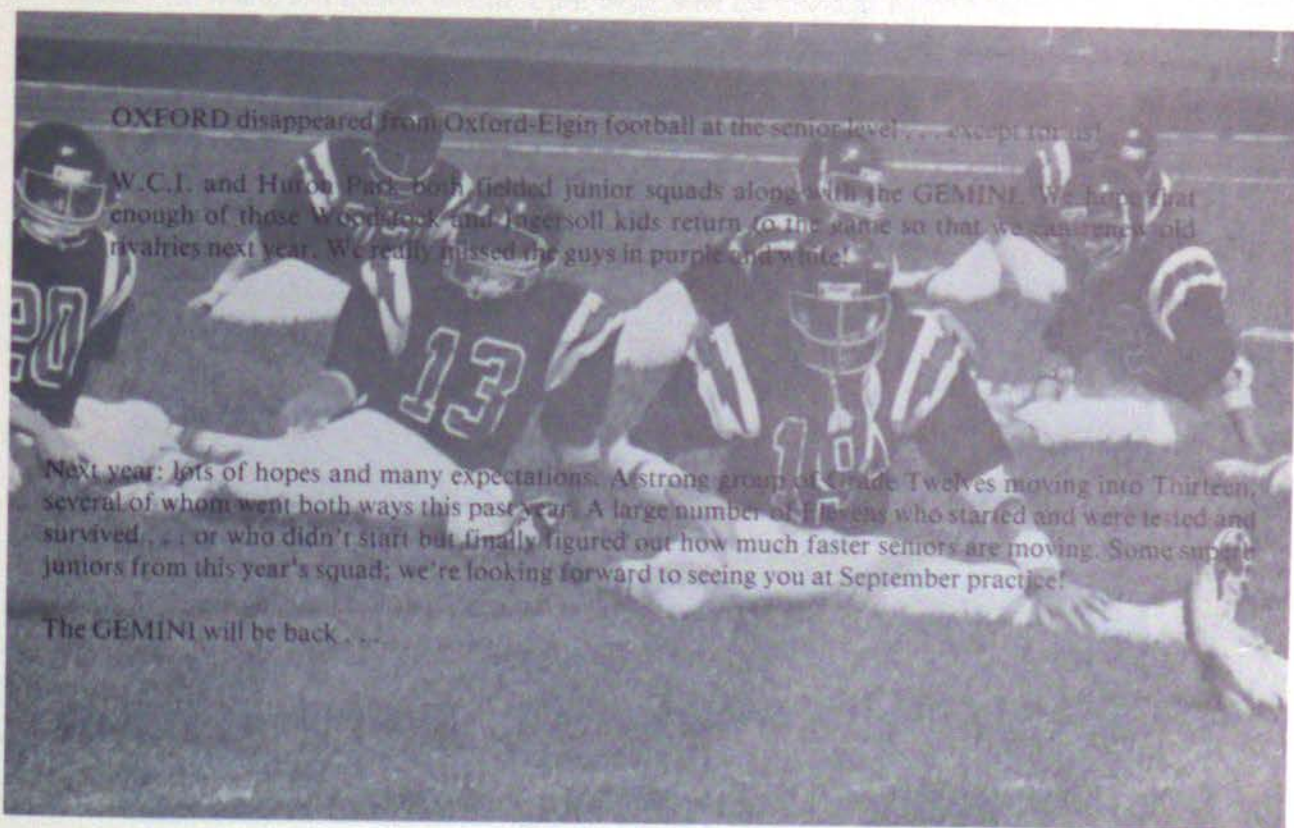

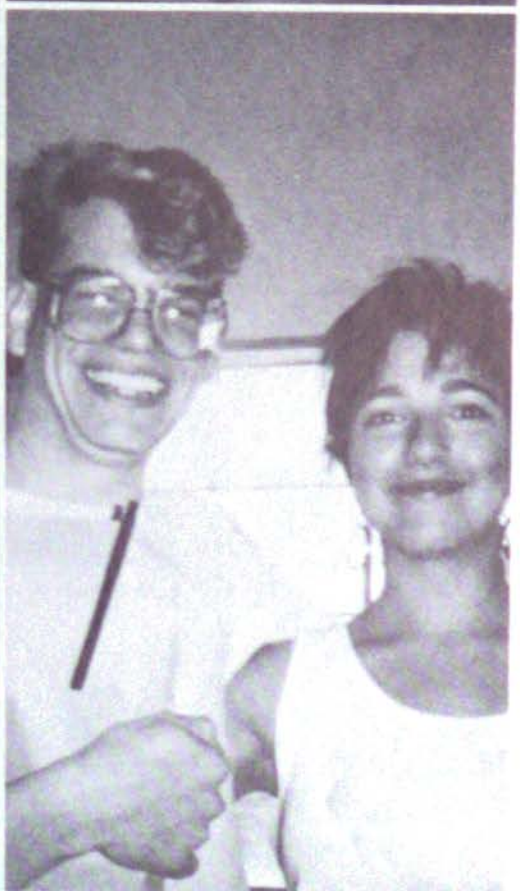
The Gemini Rowing team had its most successful and competitive year of sculling and oarring this time around. Twice as many members joined as compared to last year, including two novice men's crews.

I'm so glad you let us use it at the beginning of the book.

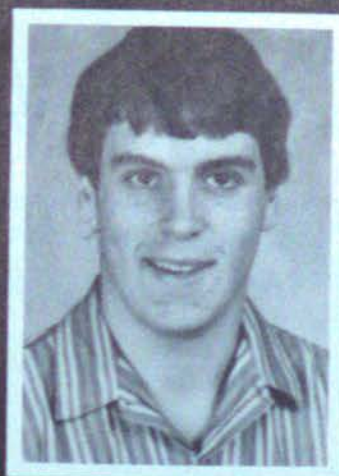

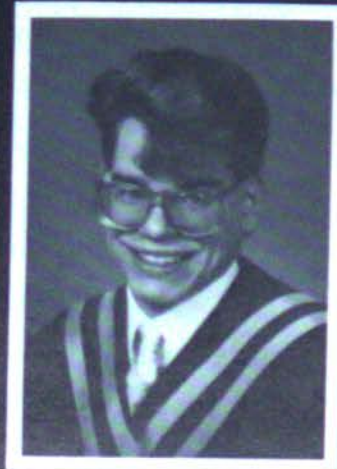
## ASSISTANT EDITOR COMMENTS
