Mr. W.P. Kirkwood



The first principal of Tillsonburg's Annandale High School, Wallace (Kirk) Kirkwood, died Christmas Eve 1989 at Tillsonburg District Memorial Hospital. He was in his 80th year.

Born in Chesley, Mr. Kirkwood arrived in Tillsonburg in 1946 to become principal of the old Tillsonburg High School, located near Lake Lisgar. Prior to that, he had spent nine years as a teacher and principal in Pine River and Forest.

In the 22 years that followed, he guided the Tillsonburg secondary school system through its period of greatest growth and change, while earning the wholehearted respect of teachers and students alike.

He was the first principal of Annandale High School and played a key role in designing not merely the school but the educational programs that would be offered there. When the new school - known then as Tillsonburg District High School and today as Annandale High School - opened in 1950, it boasted an enrolment of 550 students. Mr. Kirkwood saw the school expanded in 1955, when eight more classrooms were added on.


In 1959, with the town experiencing tremendous growth and with the Annandale High School population around the 980 mark, Glendale High School was opened. Mr. Kirkwood took over as principal there, managing both schools at the same time for a few years.

He retired as the Superintendent of Secondary Education in Tillsonburg in June 1969.

Mr. Kirkwood was active in community work for many years. He was a member of St. Andrew's Presbyterian Church and was on the church's board of elders. As well, he was a member of the Tillsonburg Lions Club.

Mr. Kirkwood is survived by his wife, the former Edith Van Valkenburg.

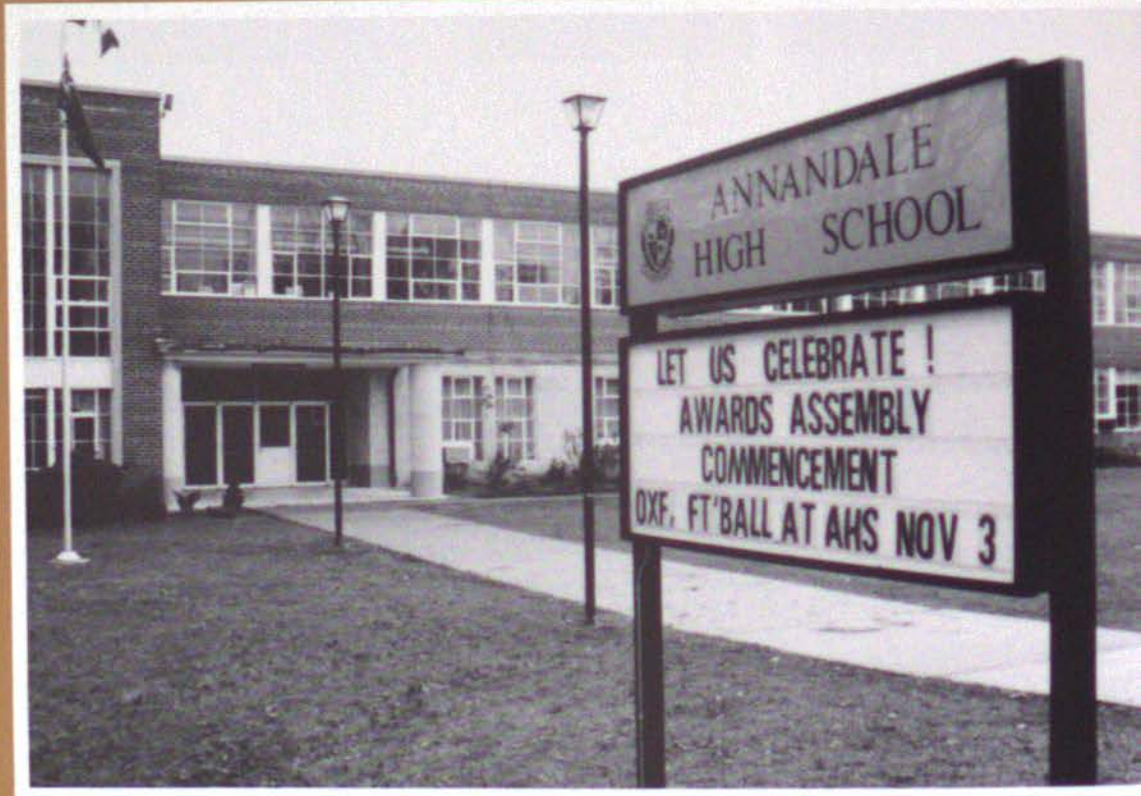

From Our Vice-Principal

IS IT 3X'S AND OUT?

The pillar on our front entry bears the inscription "ERECTED A.D. 1950". This year secondary education in this current building is completing 40 years.

When I arrived here the first time it was 1954. Our school was then called "Tillsonburg District High School". We had over 900 students in this facility but that was pre-Robarts Plan and Pre-Credit System. We were the only high school in town, maybe "in the world"? Our existence was comfortable and sheltered.

Graduation #1 for me was in 1959. The following September two schools operated on a shift system in this building until the Glendale structure was completed. Hence Annandale High School was "born" so to speak as T.D.H.S. was renamed.

It was in 1967 that I was able to re-enter Annandale High School as a member of the math department. It seemed that mine was a charmed existence. I had already served as vice-principal of my elementary Alma Mater in Straffordville. Now I was repeating this by being able to teach in my secondary Alma Mater.

What a difference Annandale was from Tillsonburg District High School! School spirit was literally driven by the intense rivalry with our cross-town competition. Principal, staff and students all worked to one common goal and that was to beat our local rival. St. Thomas, Ingersoll or Woodstock teams were important but if we Marauders somehow lost to

Glendale the season was not a total success.

Graduation #2 for me was in December 1975. I left to be vice-principal at College Avenue Secondary School. While I was gone, things changed again. There was no new building but instead a recognition that both schools were suffering academically and athletically. Hence the first attempts to integrate programs took place in 1980. Marauder spirit gave way to Gemini.

It was in the fall of 1986 that I again returned to Annandale High School. Again, what a difference! As the vice-principal, I find myself now in constant communication with Glendale High School. Every aspect of school life must be checked with Mr. Curry. Timetable, exams, gym schedules, field trips, discipline, attendance, curriculum, etc. are all co-operative ventures. Teams practices in both schools. Integrated students are involved in activities at both schools. Yes, there are problems but Annandale and Glendale are working together for the common good of students.

We have come a long way! Last year for the first time, we had an excellent balance in the exchange of student credits between schools. Our teams continue to be very successful in Oxford/Elgin, WOSSA and even OFSSA. Tillsonburg is on the map because of our co-operation.

But where is Annandale? We must, even as we co-operate to make Gemini successful also commit ourselves to make Annandale High School known for its accomplishments. We do that by *being* great! In other words, "We Walk Our Talk". The four suggestions below may help us to focus our energy.

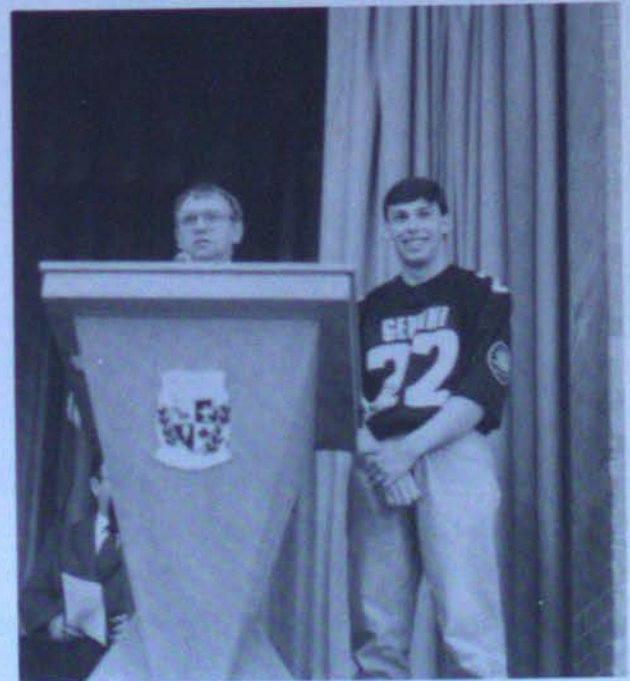

TATLER ADVERTISING & SALES

The TATLER is "fairly big business" these days, at least for a group of volunteers who have to scabble for the money to keep it functioning. This year's edition marks a new milestone. It is 200 pages in length . . . the first TATLER to reach that size.

In July, we found ourselves in a "Catch 22" situation. In order to finance the book this year, we had to raise more advertising revenue. Those rates had been maintained at the same level over the past three years. Therefore, we had to sell more advertising and that meant that we needed four more pages for the book. Pages are not sold in "fours"; they are sold in "eights". Therefore, a 200-page book!

The people pictured at left represent a group of over 40 people who made this year's book financially possible. The total cost of preparing and publishing the book now runs to over \$13,000.00. The Student Council this year granted us \$2,000.00 and the books that we sold brought in over \$4,000.00. That leaves a shortfall of over \$7,000.00.

That money is raised from advertising in Tillsonburg and area. The professional and business people of the Tillsonburg District are wonderfully caring. Many of them went to school here; almost all of them understand our plight. However, they must be visited and they must be sold.

Jim Brotz, our business manager this year, personally sold \$1,195.00 worth of ads, a total of 19 advertisements. Josh DeWaele took part in sales that totalled \$790.00 and sold 23 advertisements. In most cases, advertising is sold by teams of students. Derek Tait was Josh's partner for most of those sales, sharing in sales of \$640.00 worth of ads. Cyndi Rushton and Brent Collins were among the TATLER's leading sales people for the third straight year, earning \$635.00 in only two afternoons. The partnership of Mike Hayes and Shannon McGlynn sold 11 ads worth \$450.00 in a single afternoon blitz while Kevin Thurston and Chad Weiler teamed together to sell 12 ads worth \$440.00. Those were the sales leaders.

Jeff Whitesell and Don Holland brought in a total of \$315.00; Michelle DeBrabander and Stephanie Baxter took part in two advertising runs totalling \$370.00; one of those runs was shared with Jackie Chevers and Jessica Pasztor for a total of \$230.00. Steve Szikszay and Ron Vanderhaeghe earned \$260.00 of advertising revenue on a single run; Paul VanHoooydonk and Tom Racz earned \$225.00. Debra Lava sold \$35.00 worth of ads; Caroline Sitts and Michelle Richardson had an excellent advertising run of 10 ads worth \$350.00. Stephanie Green and Corrie Lingaitis earned \$375.00 on two blitzes; Emily O'Sullivan and Stacey Rice earned \$245.00. Kate Koster and Jennifer Freeman sold \$95.00 in ads; Julie Pinter, Angela Easey and Missy Dalby shared sales of \$310.00. Alison Piron and Amy Moore sold 7 ads worth \$280.00 and Patty Habl and Bernadette Rosehart sold \$110.00 of advertisements. Arn Stover had a total of \$370.00 in sales.

Without these people and the businesses and professions that purchased advertising, each TATLER would have cost YOU over \$40.00. Take time to say, "Thank you."

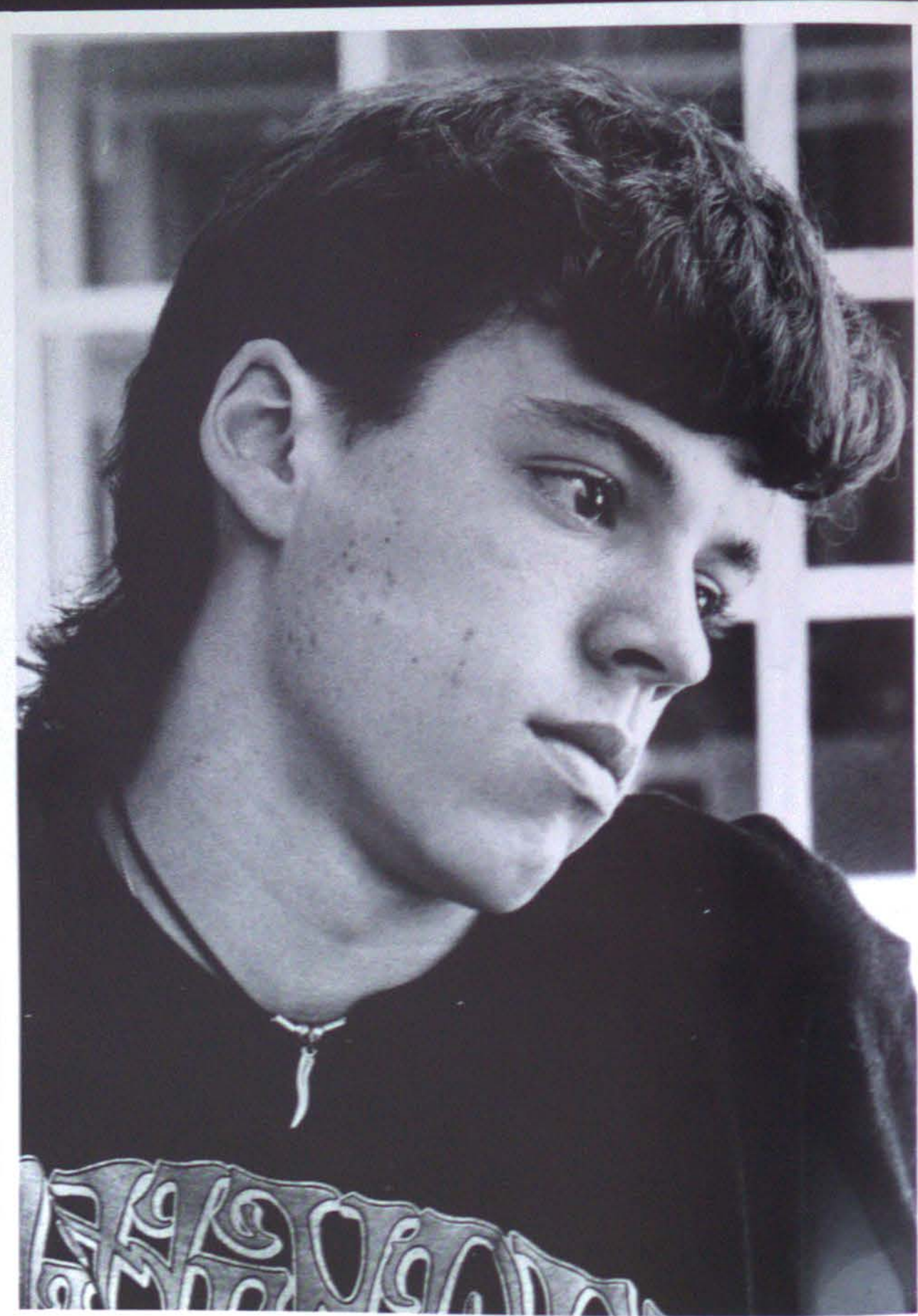

The Senior Gemini Football Team developed amazingly during the 1989 season, filling both coaches and fans with great admiration.

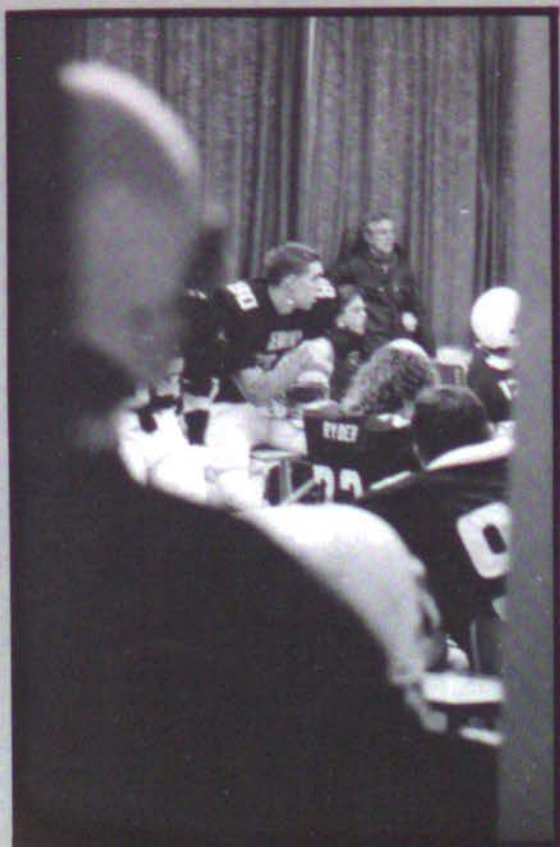

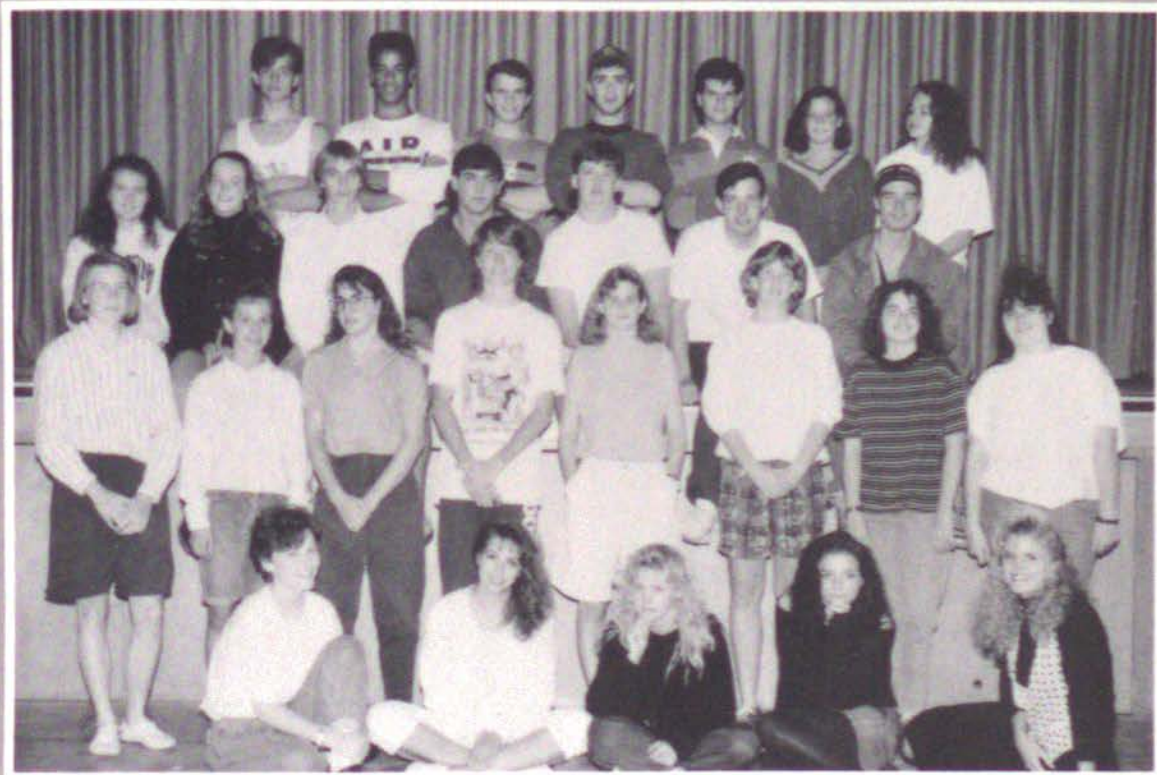

Local photographer awarded craftsman certification in B.C.

(STAFF) - Tillsonburg photographer Fred Meulemeester has added yet another feather in his cap.

At the recent national convention of the Canadian Professional Photographers Association in Whistler, British Columbia he was presented the Craftsman of Photographic Arts (CPA) award. It is one of the most prestigious awards made by the association.

The award signifies a high measure of achievement in photography in service to the association and within the community.

Each year the the professional association conducts a print show competition which is held in con-

junction with the national convention. A member photographer may enter no more than four prints per year. They are judged by a panel of five qualified print judges on a scale of 0 to 100.

Prints receiving 75 or more points can then hang in that year's Salon Competition. Each accepted print counts as six points toward the craftsman award. To receive the honor, the photographer must have at least 50 points.

The photographers association recognizes its members through service points which are awarded for contributions as officers and committee persons of the association and of its constituent provincial associations. They include a variety

of activities like judging photographic competitions or attending seminars.

Mr. Meulemeester (CPA) began photography as a hobby in 1972, doing weddings and portraits for friends and relatives. In 1973 he moved to Tillsonburg and three years later joined the Professional Photographers of Ontario and Canada.

In 1980 he began work on his Craftsman of Photographic Arts.

He has attended several workshops and schools including the Winona Professional School of Photography in Chicago.

He owns and operates Fred's Photography with wife Jane.
