This TATLER is a marvellous stimulus for remembering the past year. The key to good memories is participation.

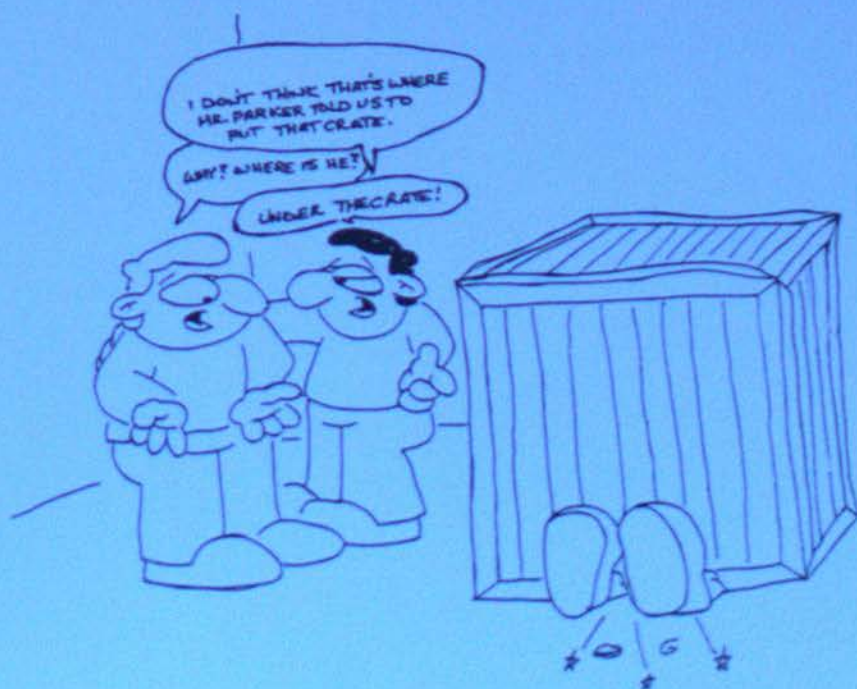

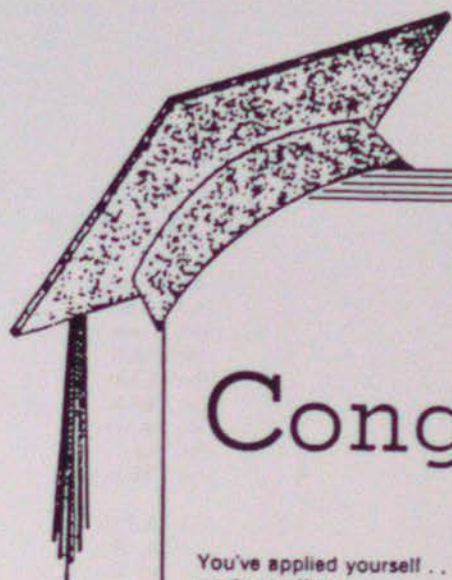
We were involved in tournaments in Windsor, London, Brantford, Woodstock, and Kitchener as well as our local dual-meet schedule in Oxford County.

Pictured at right is Capt. Paul "Pitch" Molnar of "The Red Indians", 421 Tactical Fighter Squadron, who took part in OPERATION DESERT STORM for the Canadian Armed Forces and who spoke to a group of students who had written to him from Annandale. The visit and letters were arranged by Mrs. M. Gilbert. Capt. Molnar, an Annandale valedictorian, gave the students involved an insider's view of the conflict which we had all followed so closely on television. Capt. Molnar, in an earlier letter, had described his experiences thus: "In that short period of time (13 weeks total), I experienced many different situations such as a SCUD attack, contact with enemy aircraft and, most of all, the experience of dealing with the Arab people in this region (Qatar)." Capt. Molnar was involved in the first Canadian contingent in the Gulf in October, 1990, returned to CFB Baden-Soellingen, and then returned to the Gulf for the final days of the War. We are very proud of Capt. Molnar and feel much safer with people like him in our armed forces.

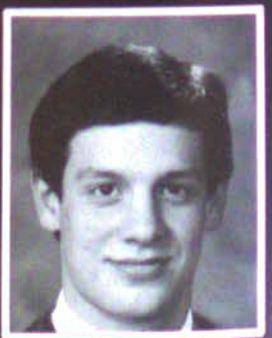

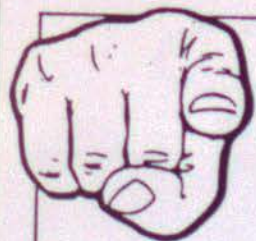
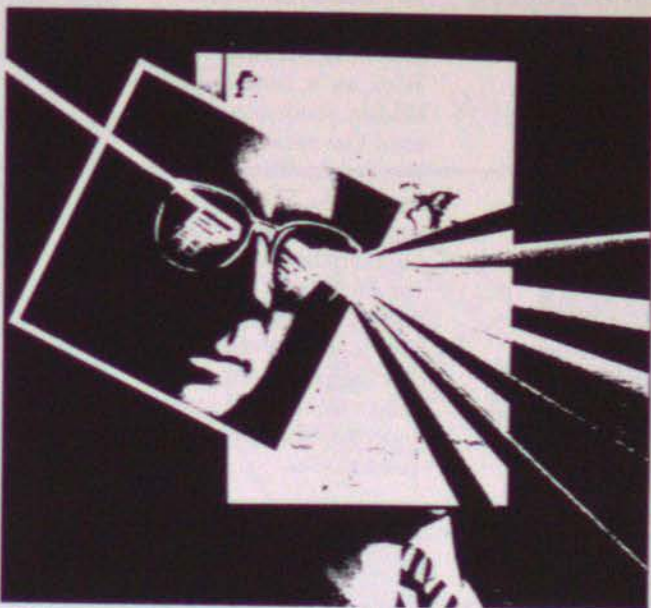

Local photographer awarded craftsman certification in B.C.

(STAFF) - Tillsonburg photographer Fred Meulemeester has added yet another feather in his cap.

At the recent national convention of the Canadian Professional Photographers Association in Whistler, British Columbia he was presented the Craftsman of Photographic Arts (CPA) award. It is one of the most prestigious awards made by the association.

The award signifies a high measure of achievement in photography in service to the association and within the community.

Each year the the professional association conducts a print show competition which is held in con-

junction with the national convention. A member photographer may enter no more than four prints per year. They are judged by a panel of five qualified print judges on a scale of 0 to 100.

Prints receiving 75 or more points can then hang in that year's Salon Competition. Each accepted print counts as six points toward the craftsman award. To receive the honor, the photographer must have at least 50 points.

The photographers association recognizes its members through service points which are awarded for contributions as officers and committee persons of the association and of its constituent provincial associations. They include a variety

of activities like judging photographic competitions or attending seminars.

Mr. Meulemeester (CPA) began photography as a hobby in 1972, doing weddings and portraits for friends and relatives. In 1973 he moved to Tillsonburg and three years later joined the Professional Photographers of Ontario and Canada.

In 1980 he began work on his Craftsman of Photographic Arts.

He has attended several workshops and schools including the Winona Professional School of Photography in Chicago.

He owns and operates Fred's Photography with wife Jane.
