This year, everyone competed ... and the whole day ended with a grand mud battle (pictured to left). WHAT A WONDERFUL DAY !!!

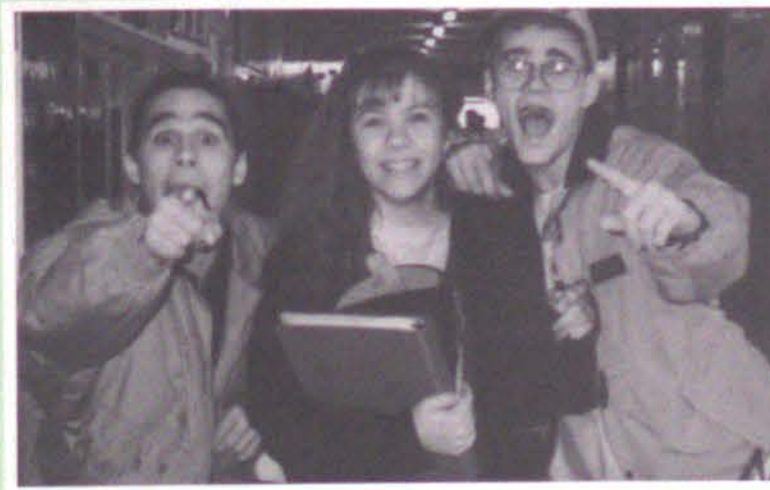

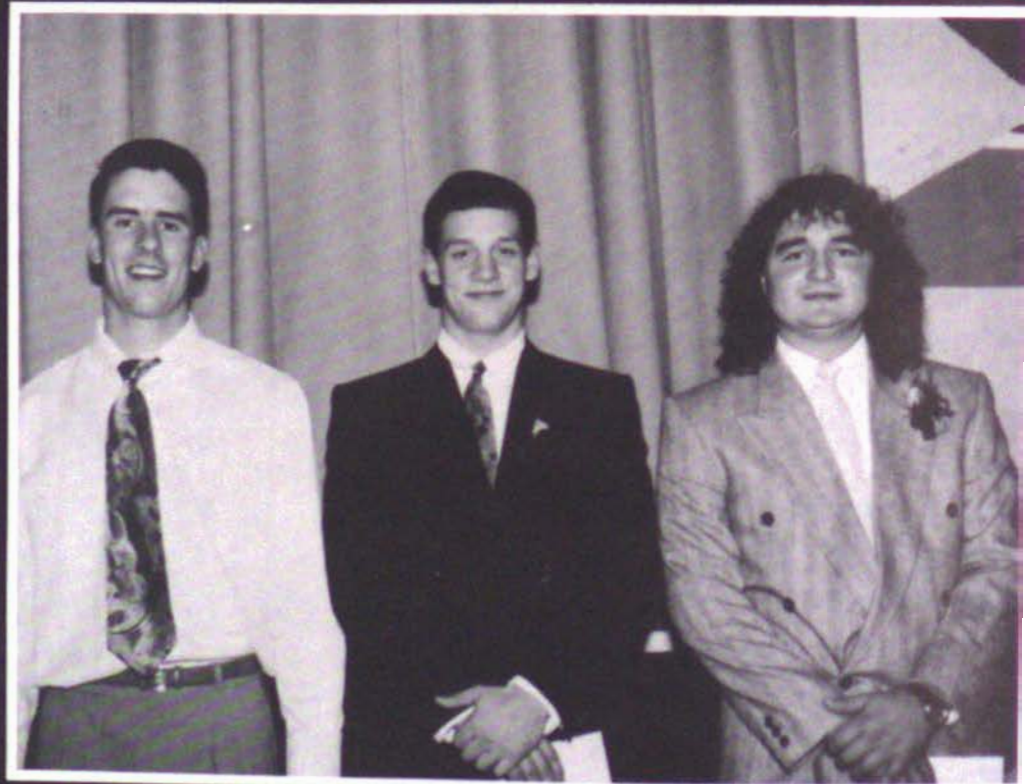


## CHAD WEILER

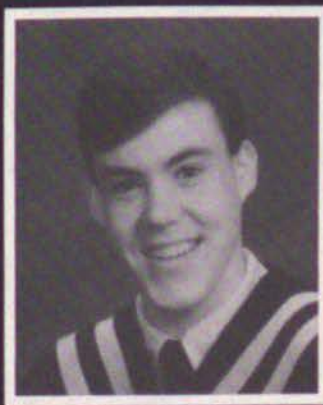


GOVERNOR-GENERAL'S

## ASHFORD BRINGS HOME PROVINCIAL HONORS AFTER WEEKEND MEET

Tillsonburg's Sherry Ashford smashed her previous best distance and claimed an OFSAA silver medal in the midget girls' shot put.

Ashford was the lone Gemini athlete this year at OFSAA, held at York University on June 5. She was seeded fourth.

"She was putting forth more effort in the last week (of practice)," said Luinstra. And that commitment and drive to succeed proved to be a winning formula.

Ashford was actually leading the event going into the fifth round. It was her third loss of 10.48m that earned the silver. Each athlete was given six throws. The gold medallist's last two throws of 10.75m and 10.82m surpassed Ashford's mark, which means she still has something to shoot for next year.

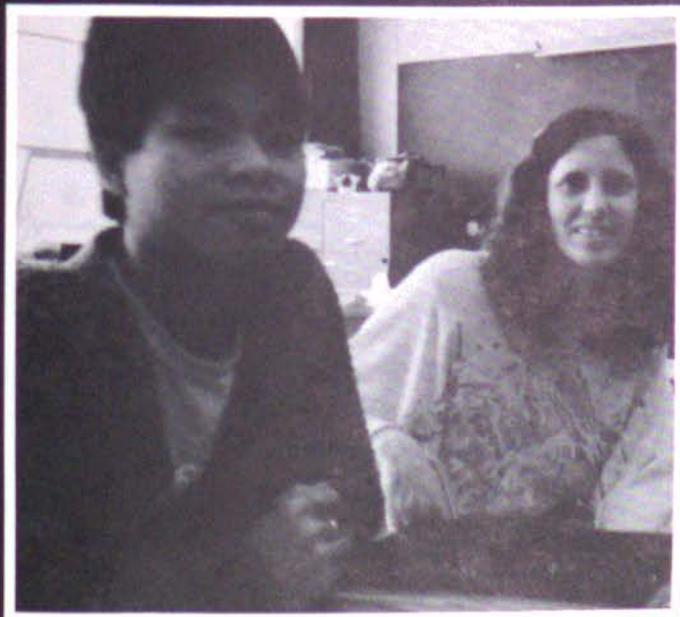
## MR. HARVEY COWAN
