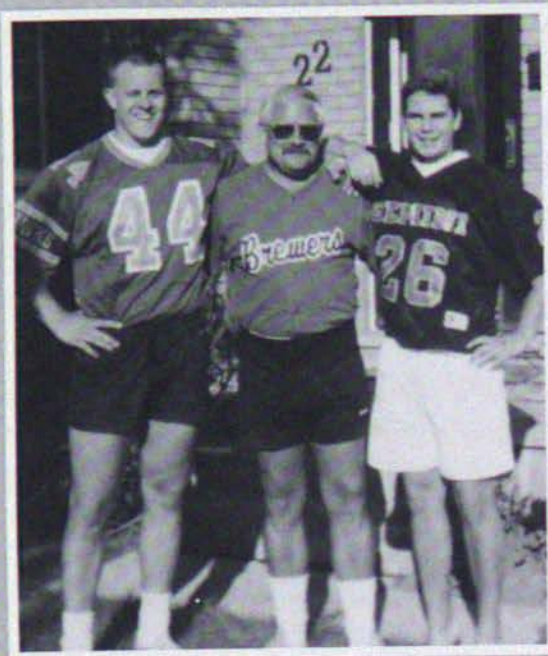

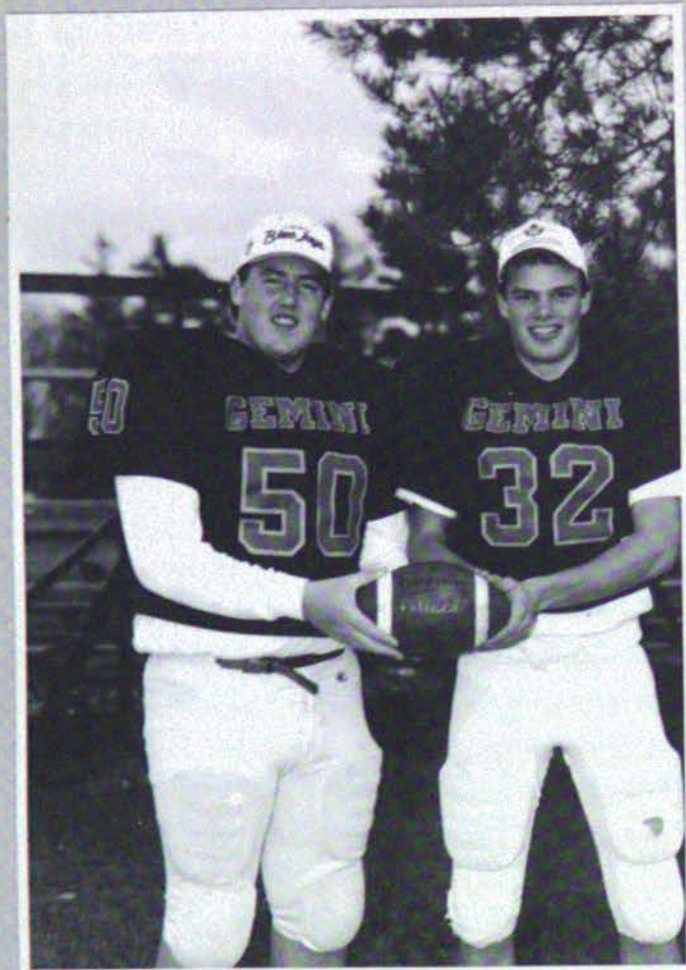

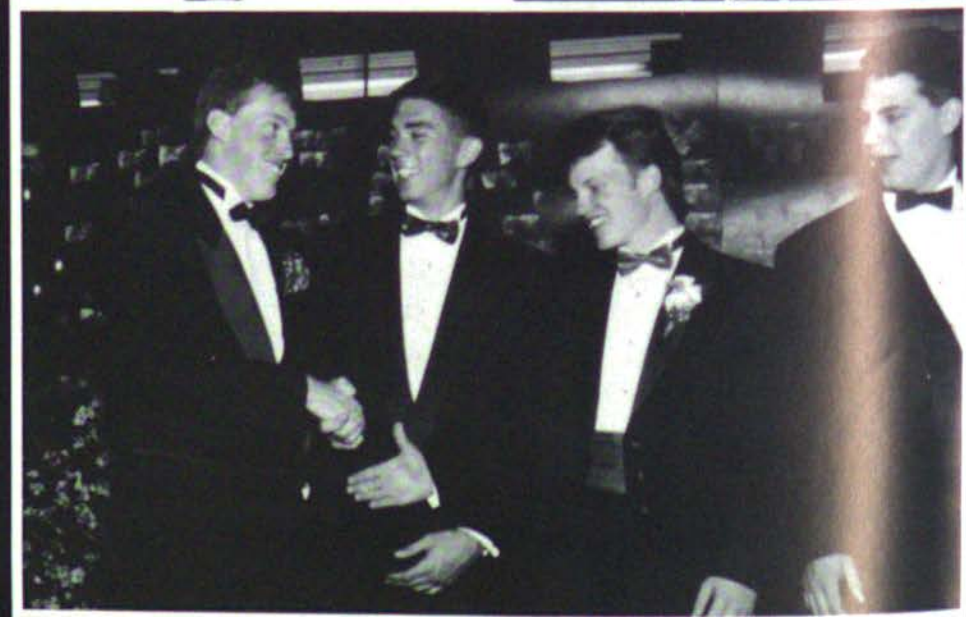

Where are we now? WHO KNOWS? We'll know more next fall!

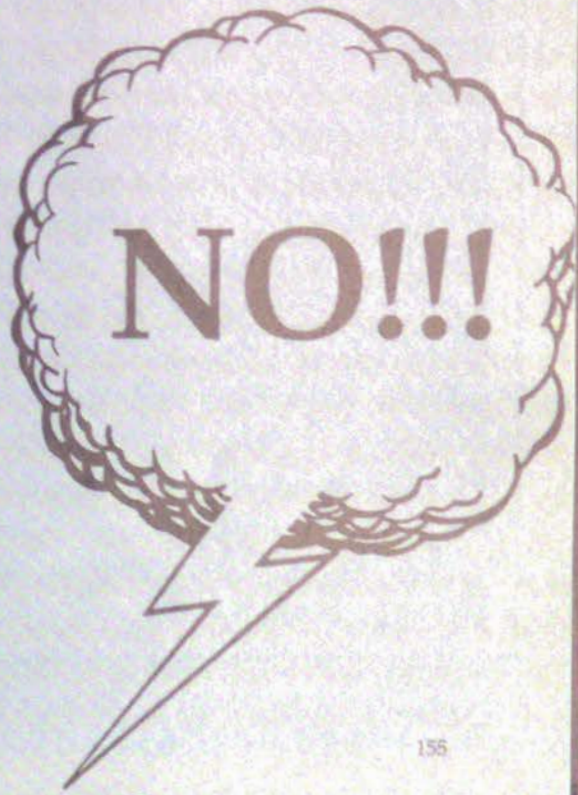


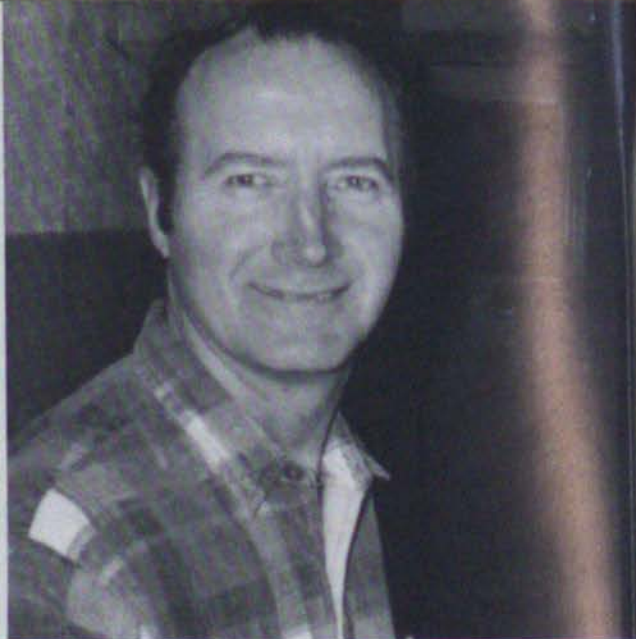

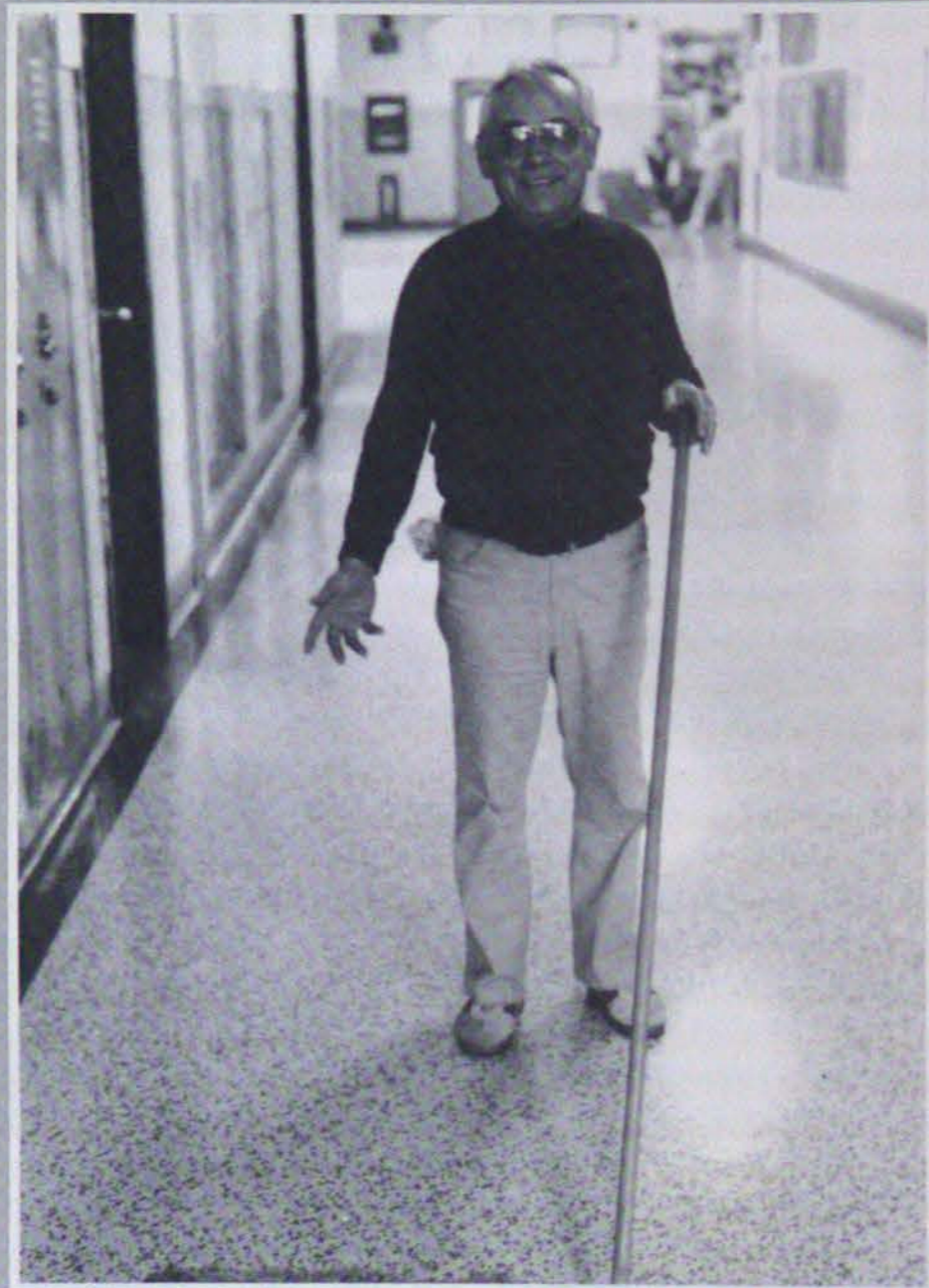

Mrs. Carol Stueck will move to Glendale H.S. full time this fall as she has become the Special Education Chairperson there. Come visit!

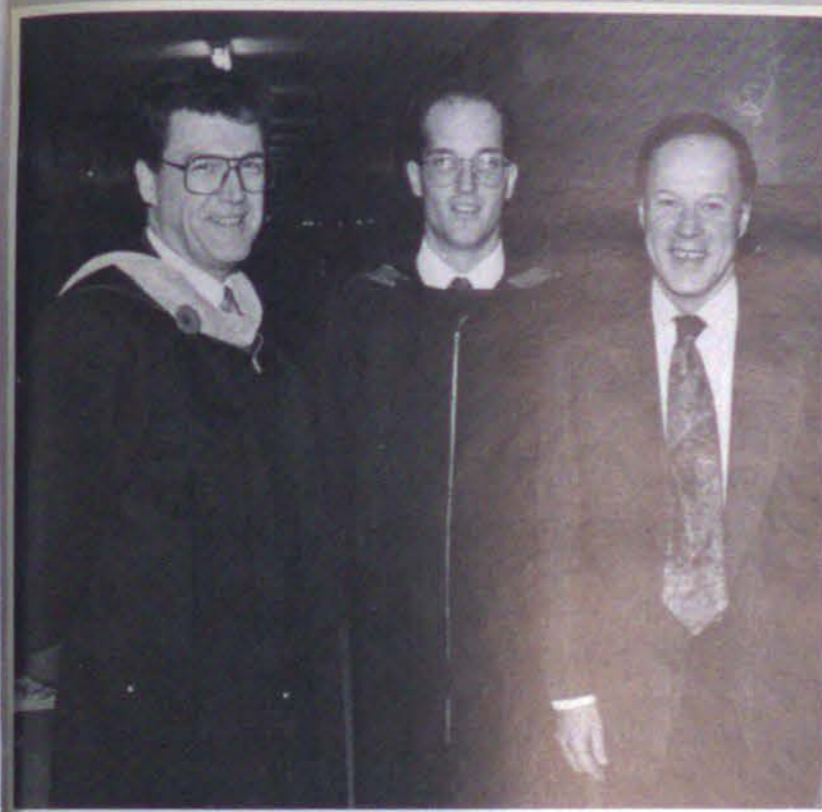




Mr. Paul Beck
