Alfred Boniface

Alf Boniface was bom in Ingersoll and attended Victory Memorial School and Ingersoll Collegiate Institute. After a stint at the Ingersoll Nachine a Tool Company he went to work for George Beck Confectionary. In November 1943 he joined the Canadian Army and became a truck driver. Alf served in Canada, the Minde Kingdom and Continental Europe. He sometimes drove a tank, but also drove ammunition in a truck to the Front. Lance Corporal Alfred Eoniface was discharged August 22, 1946. When he returned home from the war he worked for George Beck for about a year and then purchased the business. His Dusiness was so successful, he had to expand it, so moved it across the street to the former Walker Store building on Thanes Street at the comer of King Street, where it flourished under his name. Alf and his wife, the former Isabel O'Leary had two children: Ralph, of Goodstock and Mary Hutt, of Ingersoll; and five grandchildren. They were active members of St. James Analican Church.

Alf died November I2, I980, just three months after he sold his business.
