He made the decision to enlist in December of their year in Moodstock. Charles was part of the Battle of Vitriyi Ridge in which four divisions of Canadian sodilers were successful in Jailming victory. This win came at gleat cost; when the battle was over on April 12, there were 10,602 casualties.
