Wounds received in action in France on July 4 by Gunner Robert Clark, have proved fatal. The official message was received by his mother, Mrs. Martha Johnson, Tunis street, from the director of records. Gnr. Clarke succumbed to his wounds on th same day that he had previously been reported as wounded. He was 25 years old and well known in Ingersoll and Salford districts. He was unmarried and enlisted at London in January of 1941.

He served in the 12th Field Regiment, Royal Canadian Artillery

Gunner Robert Roy Clarke was killed in action 4 July 1944 in France. He rests in the Beny-sur-Mer Canadian War Cemetery, Reviers, France.
