Wounds received in action in France on July 4 by Gunner Robert Clark, have proved fatal. The official message was received by his mother, Mrs. Martha Johnson, Tunis street, from the director of records. Grn. Clrake succumbed to his wounds on the same day that he had previously been reported as wounded. He was 25 years old and well known in Ingersell and Salford districts. He was unmarried and enlisted at London in January of 1941.

Ingersoll Tribune, 20 July 1944 Gunner Robert Roy Clarke was a son of Walter Mercer/Clarke, and of Martha Clarke, of Ingersoll, Ontario.

He served in the 12th Field Regiment, Royal Canadian Artillery

Gunner Robert Roy Clarke was killed in action 4 July 1944 in France. He rests in the Beny-sur-Mer Canadian War Cemetery, Reviers, France.
