**IMPRESSIVE MEMORIAL SERVICE
HELD IN ST. JAMES' CHURCH
ON SUNDAY EVENING FOR
FOUR MEMBERS OF THE CON-
GREGATION.**

There was a very large attendance at the Memorial Service held in St. James church Sunday evening. The service was arranged in memory of William Alcott, Arthur Robert Allen, Archie Barrow and Thomas Cussons, who have recently made the supreme sacrifice in France. These young men were members of St. James' congregation and belonged to the 168th Battalion.

Ingersoll Chronicle 31 May 1917

Private Thomas Cussons, son of Don Pedro Cussons of Hull, England. Thomas emigrated to Canada and worked in Ingersoll as a labourer, living with his brother Fred.

Thomas joined the Oxford Rifles in January of 1916 and was reported missing in action on the battlefields of France in April of 1917, and was declared killed in action. Thomas rests in the Nine Elms Military Cemetery, Pas de Calais, France.

In partnership, Oxford County Library and Ingersoll Cheese & Agricultural Museum recognize the service of Ingersoll veterans.
