

Pilot Officer Roy Clifford Haycock was a son of Abram and Ethel Haycock, of Ingersoll, Ontario.

Roy Clifford Haycock joined the Canadian Fusiliers in London in 1940. Transferring to the R.C.A.F. June 1941. He trained as a Air Traffic Controller at the R.C.A.F. Station in Hagersville, shortly thereafter moving to aircrew in December 1942. He graduated with Air Gunner's Wings at R.C.A.F. Station Mont Joli in March 1943, later joining #426 Squadron in December that same year in England. Roy was killed on operations over Nuremburg March 31, 1944, and his body was buried in Durnback Military Cemetery, Bad Tolz, Germany. He was born November 15, 1918, was a member of the choir, St. Peter's Anglican Church, Dorchester, Member Dorchester Junior Farmers, Loyal Orange Lodge and Independent Order of Oddfellows and worked at McCormick's in London.
