James (Mip) Henderson is Ingersoll born and bred. He was born here June 8, 1920, went to WS and then to ICI. He had worked at Borden's during the summers and worked there again, when he returned from the war, for a total of 40 years. In 1947, Mip hitch-hiked to London and joined the Royal Canadian Air Force, After attending the Manning Depot at Toronto, he was sent to the St. Thomas Air Carft School. He served overseas for three years as an air frame mechanic. While there, Leading Air Carftsan (LGN Nip Henderson met and married WG Marjorie Taylor in 1945 at Harrogate. Nip was discharged and came home in 1945. It was IS months before Marje and their son, John, whom he had never seen, were able to come to Ingresuoll. He retired from Sociems in 1978. My has been an outstanding sportsam. He was an OMA referee and played a lot of hockey himself. He recalls, with pleasure, the games and the crowds at Princess Elizabeth School during the 1950s. He also played a great deal of golf at one time. Along with his friend, Lorne Moon, Mip was instrumental in establishing the Ingersoll Sports Hall of Fase. Nip Henderson passed way in 2007.
