Dear Mrs. Jenvey:

A report has now been received from a Graves Registration Unit on the Continent, which confirms that your husband, Flight Lieutenant Donald Edward Jenvey, D.F.C., was buried in the cemetery at Enschede, Holland, in Grave No. 191.

The reverent care of the burial places of all who served in the Forces of the British Empire is the task of the Imperial War Graves Commission. Already, eminent architects are at work, planning the construction of beautiful cemeteries, and each individual grave will be supported and sustained by the nations of the Empire. I hope it may be of some consolation to you to know that your gallant husband's grave is in sacred care and keeping.

May I again extend my sincere sympathy in your great loss.

Flight Lieutenant Donald Edward "Duke" Jenvey was a son of Earl Stanley Jenvey and of Mary Eunice Jenvey (nee Mitchell), of Ingersoll, Ontario, husband of Beulah Marguerite Jenvey (nee Chamberlain), of Ingersoll.

Donald enlisted in the Royal Canadian Air Force in 1942 and was awarded the Distinguished Flying Cross.

Flight Lieutenant Donald Edward Jenvey was previously reported missing after air operations, he died evading capture by enemy forces.

He rests in the ENSCHEDE EASTERN GENERAL CEMETERY, Enschede, Netherlands.
