FLT.-LT. CHARLES A. LAMBERT, son of Mr and Mrs. William Lambert of Ingersoll, Ontario, who was reported missing on December 15 following operations over Germany and who is now presumed killed in action. Flt.-Lt. Lambert enlisted in the R.C.A.F. early in 1940, and received his wings and commission at Camp Borden in October, 1941. He instructed at Uplands, Ont., for two years prior to being posted overseas in March, 1944 and had been serving with No. 439, City of Westmount Typhoon Squadron, stationed in Holland. Flt.-Lt. Lambert's wife, the former Hilda Logan, of the Alex-

Flight Lieutenant Charles Alfred Lambert was a son of William Frank and Rachel Elizabeth (nee Bean) Lambert of Ingersoll, Ontario. Husband of RCAF Nursing Sister Hilda Muriel (nee Logan) Lambert of Niagara Falls Ontario. Charles & Hilda married in January of 1944 at St. James Anglican Church, Ingersoll, before he was sent overseas.

Flight Lieutenant Charles Alfred Lambert joined the Royal Canadian Air Force shortly after the war began. He was reported missing over Germany, December 15, 1944 and rests at REICHSWALD FOREST WAR CEMETERY, Germany.
