James married Adah E. Dilling of Brussels, Ontario in 1905, He was employed at the Borden Milk Condensing Company as a machine hand.

In September of 1915, he made the brave decision to join the war effort by enlisting at the Ingersoil recruiting office.

Sergeant James Alexander Livens was killed in action on August 19, 1916. He rests at DICKEBUSCH NEW MILITARY/CEMETERY, Belgium.
