SGT. KENNETH MCKEE KILLED IN ACTION

The war came close to Ingersoll again this week when word was received by Mr. and Mrs. Fred McKee, that their son, Sergeant Kenneth Gilbert McKee, R.C.A.F., had been killed in action on Saturday, May 16th. Official notification from the Chief of the Air Staff at Ottawa was received on Monday afternoon and further details were received later from the same source.

Sgt. McKee was born in Ingersoll and had lived here until his enlistment in the R.C.A.F. He attended the public schools and Ingersoll Collegiate and throughout the town had a great many friends. At the time of his enlistment he was employed at the Morrow Screw & Nut Co. Limited. He was active in sports and had been a member of the Morrow Co. softball team. Sgt. McKee attended St. Paul's Presbyterian Church.

Flight Sergeant Kenneth Gilbert McKee was a son of Fred G. McKee and Vera A. McKee, of Ingersoll, Ontario.

Kenneth was a machinist at the John Morrow Screw Company. He enlisted Royal Canadian Air Force and went overseas in September of 1941.

Flight Sergeant Kenneth Gilbert McKee was killed in action on May 16, 1942. He rests at SCAMPTON (ST. JOHN THE BAPTIST) CHURCHYARD, Lincolnshire, United Kingdom.
