

Ingersoll Chronicle, 29 June 1916 Private Archie Minler grew up in ingersoll at 99 Canterbury Street. His parenits, Peter. Minier and his mother Mary Eshelby Talbot Minier had three other children, Murray, Ezra & Gertle.

Archie was member of the local Cavalry Unit, 24th Grey's Horse and he enlisted shortly after the onset of the war in September 1914. Both of Archie's brothers also enlisted and were sen't overseas to join the war offert. Only Archie was to make the ultimate scarifice, giving his life at the battle of Ypres, Belgium, in Flanders Fields. There is a headstone in the ingestoll furing Cemetery that marks the life of Archie, and he shares this monument with his mother, Mary.
