PTE. LAWRENCE MORGAN KILLED OVERSEAS

Mrs. Lawrence Morgan was notified on Sunday that her husband had been killed in action about the first of the month. He had been overseas for less than a year. He married the former Flossie McKee, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Wm. McKee, King Hiram street, while they were both in service at the training school at Woodstock.

Mr. and Mrs. H. V. Morgan, parents of Pte. Morgan, reside at Princeton, B.C.

Private Lawrence Herwood Morgan was a son of Harry Vanault Morgan and Jessie Florence Morgan; husband of Iva Flossie McKee Morgan, of Ingersoll, Ontario.

Lawrence worked as a machine operator in Ingersoll and he had just married an Ingersoll girl in March of 1944.

Lawrence enlisted in 1943, near his former home in Vernon, BC. He participated in the war effort as a driver & mechanic with Royal Canadian Army Service Corps.

Private Lawrence Herwood Morgan was killed in action, April 1, 1945. He rests in GROESBEEK CANADIAN WAR CEMETERY, Netherlands.
