Private James Vance Neill was a son of William and Janet Neill; husband of Edith Neill, of Ingersoll, Ontario. Born in Mochrum, Scotland.

James was a foreman at the Noxon Manufacturing Company was trained as a carpenter. He married Emma Huckkle in 1912. He enlisted in Ingersoll in 1916 with the 168th Battalion, Oxford Rifles.

Private James Vance Neill was killed in action, August 15, 1917. He rests at AIX-NOULETTE COMMUNAL CEMETERY EXTENSION, Pas de Calais, France.
