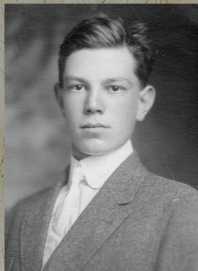

Enlisted with 29 th Battery at Guelph.
Born at Ingersoll and lived at Kitchener
and Galt.
Anglican.

He received a Gun Shot Wound in the head
and died of it on August 8, 1917 at the
age of nineteen years.

He served for thirteen months.
He is the son of Mr. and Mrs. Norman of
Galt. Mr. Norman is the school inspector
for South Waterloo.

Educated at Kitchener Collegiate Institute
and Galt Collegiate Institute.

Gunner Alfred Lloyd Norman was born in Ingersoll to Lambert and Mary L. Norman, of Galt, Ontario.

Alfred's father Lambert was a teacher at Ingersoll District Collegiate Institute. Alfred enlisted at Guelph in December of 1915 with the 29th Highland Regiment.

Gunner Alfred Lloyd Norman was killed in action, August 8, 1917. He rests at FOSSE No. 10 COMMUNAL CEMETERY EXTENSION, Pas de Calais, France.
