## KILLED IN BATTLE

Major Norsworthy was a former resident of Ingersoll, where the father, J. C. Norsworthy, resides. His bravery in the engagement at Langemarck, in which he was killed, was mentioned in "Eye Witness" dispatches. He had formerly lived in Montreal, where he was manager of the Dominion Securities Company.

Major Edward Cuthbert Norsworthy was a son of James C. and Mary Norsworthy, of Ingersoll, Ontario.

Brother of Lieutenant Alfred James Norsworthy, who died while serving with the Canadian Infantry (Quebec Regiment).

Cousin of Gunner Robert Godfrey Hunter and Bombardier Harold Gilray Hunter, both died while serving with the Canadian Field Artillery.

Edward grew up in Ingersoll and went on to work in banking in Montreal. He enlisted with the Royal Highlanders and distinguished himself in battle for gallant service on the field.

Major Edward Cuthbert Norsworthy was killed in action, April 22, 1915. He rests at TYNE COT CEMETERY, Belgium
