Rites Monday For Veteran Of Second War And Korea

Funeral services will be held from St. Michael and All Angels' Anglican Church on Monday at 2 p.m. for Conrad Watson Shaddock, 47, of Westbank, who died Friday.

Born in London, Ontario, in 1922, Mr. Shaddock served with the Canadian Armed Forces for 23 years. He was one of Canada's first paratroopers, serving in Italy during the Second World War with the First Special Service Force, the noted Devil's Brigade. Mr. Shaddock served in Korea with the United Nations and in Europe with NATO, and after completing his tour of duty, he brought his family to Kelowna in 1962.

In 1965 he became an insurance agency manager in Kelowna. He was an active member of the community, being a member of the Royal Canadian Legion, and Prince Charles Masonic Lodge.



CONRAD SHADDOCK

Corporal Conrad Watson 'Ted' Shaddock was a son of Frederick & Annie [Procurier] Shaddock. Ted lived in Ingersoll after the war with his wife Lyla and young family. He served in the CAF and was one of Canada's first paratroopers, continuing his military career as part of the fearsome 'Devil's Brigade'. Corporal Conrad Watson 'Ted' Shaddock finished his service and moved his family to Kelowna, BC. He rests in the Kelowna Memorial Park Cemetery.
