#### Died of Wounds.

That their son, Sapper Arthur W. Stevens had died of wounds in No. 3 Casualty Hospital, France, on August 1st, was the sad news received by Mr. and Mrs. W. A. Stevens, John Street, Ingersoll, Ontario. Previous word of the wounding of Sapper Stevens had been received by the parents, but no particulars, other than that he sustained a gunshot wound in the chest, were given. He was the eldest son of Mr. and Mrs. Stevens and was well known in Ingersoll. He was in his 19th year and enlisted with the 71st Battalion at Woodstock.

Sapper Arthur William Stevens was a son Mr. and Mrs. William A. Stevens, of Ingersoll, Ontario.

Arthur attended school in Ingersoll and was working in the area as a farmer. He enlisted in Woodstock in December 1915 with the Oxford Rifles.

Sapper Arthur William Stevens was killed in action, August 1, 1917. He rests at LIJSSENTHOEK MILITARY CEMETERY, Belgium.
