Flying Officer Robert Philpot Swallow was a son of Herbert and Mary Ann Swallow, of Ingersoll.

Robert's father Herbert was a partner in the Ingersoll File Company. Robert joined the Royal Canadian Air Force, 166th Squadron, and was declared missing on a mine laying mission over enemy waters South August 16, 1943.

Flying Officer Robert Philpot Swallow has no known grave but his service is commemorated by the RUNNYMEDE MEMORIAL, Surrey, United Kingdom
