FLT. SGT. W. WADE PAYS SUPREME SACRIFICE

Mr. and Mrs. E. Wade, 264 Wellington St., have received word that their son, Flight Sergeant William Wade, RCAF, has given his life while on active service for his country. Flt. Sgt. Wade was one of Ingersoll's finest young men and sincere sympathy is extended to his bereaved parents. The message was received from the RCAF casualties officer at Ottawa reads: "Deeply regret to advise you that your son, Flight Sergeant William Harold Wade, was killed on active services overseas. November 27.

Ingersoll Tribune 2 December 1943 Flight Sergeant William Harold Wade was a son of Ernest William Wade and of Anna Maude Wade (nee Annison), of Ingersoll.

Born in Ingersoll, Bill Wade, spent all of his life here until enlisting in the RCAF. He attended the Ingersoll schools and later was employed by the Loblaw Groceterias Co. He was a member of St. James' Anglican Church and had taken an active part in Sunday School and Boy Scout work. After enlisting in the Air Force, he received his training a navigator-bomber. He had been overseas since January of this year.
