PTE. WILLIAM WILSON DIED OF INJURED RECEIVED OVERSEAS Word came on Wednesday morning of last week that Pte. William Wilson had died of injuries on March 2nd. He had been wounded on February 16th when his injuries consisted of concussion and fractured spine. He enlisted at London, March 17th, 1940, and was with the army of invasion of D-Day. Since then he had served in Belgium with a Canadian Salvage Unit. He had resided in Ingersoll for several years and had been employed at the Ingersoll Machine and Tool Co. Besides his wife, Merritt St., he is survived by a son, Ronnie.
