FLT. SERGT. BRUCE WINDERS NOW PRESUMED DEAD

Word was received officially this week by Mr. and Mrs. Thomas Winders, that their son, Flight Sergeant Bruce Winders previously reported missing, is now presumed to have lost his life on air operations on September 27, 1943. He enlisted in June 1941, at the age of 18 years in London, with the RCAF, and was in training at St. Hubert, Quebec, St. John, NB; and Trenton, Ontario, receiving his air gunner wings in November 1942, at Mt. Joli, Quebec. He went overseas in December 1942 and was the only Canadian of an RAF crew. Born in Ingersoll, Bruce had many friends. He attended Victory Memorial School and the Ingersoll Collegiate Institute
