## Explanations and Directions to accompany the Collectors' Rolls for 1852.

1. *Numbers.*—The outside left hand column, headed "Nos.," will be found convenient,—the object being to number each entry, 1, 2, 3, &c., on the Collector's Roll, to correspond with the numbering in the Assessment Roll, and thus afford easy means of referring from the entries on the one Roll to the corresponding entries on the other.

2. *Names of parties Assessed.*—This column is required by the 32nd Section of the Assessment Act of 1850—(See *Scobie's Municipal Manual*, page 173.)

3. *Freeholders, Householders.*—These columns are rendered necessary by the 120th Section of the Municipal Corporations' Act, as amended by the Act of 1851.—(See *Manual*, pp. 262 and 263; also p. 274.)

4. *Real Property.*—There are two columns under this head, for the purpose of describing the property assessed. In Townships the first of them is used to enter in it the number of the Concession, and the second, to enter in it the number of the Lot, assessed against the party; or the portion of the Lot, if the whole of it be not assessed against him. In Towns and Villages, the number of the Street or Square will be entered in the first, and the number of the House or Lot in the second column; or whatever other mark the property may be known by. It is necessary that each piece of property be assessed separately, and specifically entered on the Roll; for the 38th Section of the Assessment Act authorizes Collectors to receive taxes on land separately assessed, although the taxes on others assessed against the same party be not paid.—(See *Municipal Manual*, p. 175.)

5. *Assessed Value and Amount.*—There are three columns under this heading. The first of them is to be used in Townships, for the purpose of entering in it, opposite to each separate piece of property, the Assessed Value of such property; the second, for the purpose of entering in it the amount of Taxable Personal Property or Income, for which each party is assessed; and the third, for the purpose of entering in it, opposite to the name of each party assessed, the total amount of the assessed value of the property, both Real and Personal, for which he is so assessed. It is on the sums in this last column that the taxes are to be calculated.—(See *Assessment Act of 1850*, Sec. 32, *Manual*, p. 173. *Corporations Amendment Act of 1851*, Sec. 120, *Manual*, pp. 262 and 274.) In Towns and Villages the assessed yearly value only will be entered in the two first columns under this heading, and the taxes on such yearly value only, calculated and extended into the third column thereof. The word "yearly" can be written at the top of the heading of each of these three columns, for Towns and Villages.—(See *Assessment Act of 1850*, Sec. 11 and 13, *Manual*, p. 168. *Assessment Amending Act of 1851*, Sec. 6, *Manual*, p. 283.)

6. *Taxes.*—There are seven columns under this heading. The three first appertain to the County Rates; and the three following to the Township, Town or Village rates; and the seventh is a Provincial Statutory Rate.

The *County Rate*,—(See *Assessment Act of 1850*, Sec. 32, *Manual*, pp. 173 and 174,) shall embrace the whole amount to be levied for County purposes proper. The *Special County Rate*, (See *Municipal Corporations Act of 1849*, Sec. 177, *Manual*, pp. 51 and 52,) shall embrace any special rate imposed by the County Council, apart from the General County Rates. The *General School Rate* shall embrace the sums to be levied and accounted for, under the 27th Section of the Common School Act of 1850, (See *Manual*, pp. 201 and 202.) The payments of salaries to local Superintendents of Schools do not properly come within this branch of the heading, as these salaries are fixed by the Council, and levied and paid out of the General funds of the County. They will therefore be included in the *County Rate* proper. The *Township, Town or Village Rate*, is required and explained by the 32nd clause of the Assessment Act, which refers to the "County Rate," mentioned above; and the "Local Special Rate" in Townships, Towns and Villages, is required and explained by the 177th clause of the Municipal Corporations Act, which refers to the "Special County Rate" mentioned above; while the "Local School Rate" shall embrace any levy ordered to be made, under the authority of the Common School Act already referred to, as it relates to Township Councils, (*Manual*, pp. 196 to 195,) or to Town and Village Councils, (*Manual*, pp. 198 to 201.) The "Lunatic Asylum Rate" is imposed by Act of Parliament, and is fixed at 6d. in the £100 in Townships, and 1d. in the £1 in Towns and Villages, (See *Manual*, pp. 183 and 184.) Referring to Section 31 of the Assessment Act of 1850, (See *Manual*, p. 173,) the County Clerk, before the first day of August, must certify to each Township, Town or Village Clerk in the County, the total amount which shall be directed to be levied in their respective Municipalities for County purposes. This provision is amended by the Assessment Amending Act of 1851, Sec. 6, (See *Manual*, p. 283.) The Township, Town or Village Clerks are required to compute from the amounts to be raised in their respective Municipalities for County purposes, the rates in the pound which will have to be levied to cover the County assessments, and insert them severally at the tops of the columns to which they respectively belong, for "County Rate," "Special County Rate," or "General School Rate,"—(thus, "1d. in the £," or "3d. in the £," or as the case may be,) charging each person on the Roll with his proportion of the amount of such assessments calculated at such rates. In like manner, the rates in the £1 will have to be computed for Township Taxes, and entered at the top of the respective columns.

7. *Arrears of Taxes.*—This heading is authorized by the Assessment Act of 1850, Section 46, (See *Manual*, p. 177,) also by the Special Act, on pages 184 and 185 of the Municipal Manual. It embraces three money columns, one for arrears of "Wild Land Assessments," another for arrears of "Municipal Assessments," and a third for any arrears of "other Assessments," between the years 1836 and 1849 both inclusive. The 8th Section of the Assessment Amending Act of 1851, extends the time for collecting these "arrears" to the present year.—(See *Manual*, p. 283.)

8. *Quakers, Menonists or Tunkers.*—This column is necessary in some Townships. The tax is 10s. each in time of peace.—(See the Act authorizing it, *Municipal Manual*, pages 119 and 120.)

9. *Statute Labour.*—This heading is required by Sections 22 and 23 of the Assessment Act of 1850.—(See *Manual*, pp. 170 and 171.) There is first a column for the number of days Statute labour to which the party is liable, and then money columns in which to enter the amount at the authorized rate of assessment or commutation, which may vary in different Townships.—(See also Sec. 3 of the Assessment Amending Act of 1851, *Manual*, p. 282.)

10. *Dog Tax.*—There is a column under this head for the number of dogs, and money columns for the amount of taxes. In some Townships there is no dog tax. In others, where such tax is levied, it is done by authority of By-law.—(See *Manual*, p. 9, for *Municipal Corporations Act*, Section 31, twentiethly: Also, *Manual*, pp. 126 and 127, for *Special Act authorizing a tax on dogs*.)

11. *Total Taxes.*—In this column the total amount of taxes, chargeable against each party, shall be entered; and the sum of the addition of the column shall be the whole amount of taxes of the particular locality, for all purposes whatsoever. The aggregate amount of this column should correspond with the sum of the addition of all the previous money columns of taxes taken together.

12. *Remarks.*—The column headed "remarks" will be found useful for any entries that may be necessary to be made by the Collectors under that head: or it may be converted into additional money columns, if required.

**NON-RESIDENTS' LANDS ASSESSMENTS.**—According to the 32nd Section of the Assessment Act of 1851, (See *Manual*, p. 173) the valuation of the Lands of non-residents shall be set down on the same roll which contains the ordinary assessments, opposite to the respective lots, part lots or parcels of land, so that each Collector shall be furnished with only one Roll, which shall contain a list of all the taxes to be levied in his District, from residents and from the lands of non-residents. The lands of non-residents are not liable for taxes on "Personal Property or Income," or on "Dogs," or on "Quakers, Menonists or Tunkers," so that these columns in the Collectors' Rolls shall not be made use of with respect to those Lands. All the other columns on the Roll are as much required for non-residents' lands taxes as for those of residents. It would be advisable, in every case, to enter all the non-residents' lands assessments, by themselves, at the end of the Residents' Roll. By being kept separate in this way, it will prevent confusion. It will be convenient to number the entries in the order in which they are made, as in the other case.—(See No. 1, above.) The "Description and Extent" of each piece of property shall be entered in the columns in the Collector's Roll, appertaining to "real property." The "assessed value" of each piece of property shall be entered opposite to it in the columns in the Collector's Roll, headed "Assessed Value and Amount;" but the middle column of that heading will not of course be used, in this case, as it refers to personal property only, and does not come within the scope of the "Non-Residents Lands Assessments." The lands of "non-residents" are liable, according to their value, to all the assessments levied against the lands of resident inhabitants, and the amount chargeable against each piece of non-residents' land, for each description of assessment, shall be entered in the column appropriated for the purpose, the same as in the case of resident inhabitants, omitting only the columns headed "Quakers, Menonists or Tunkers" and "Dog Tax."

**CITIES.**—This Roll is not intended for Cities, which are Counties in themselves; but, it may be used for them, by selecting the columns that are appropriate to the City requirements.

The sheets for the present Collectors' Rolls, are ruled to admit of their being folded and stitched in the middle, book-ways, for which there is sufficient space left in the centre; and the form will be more convenient than the old mode.
