That your Petitioner is a native of
Upper Canada, and he resided in it since
his birth; that his father Ebenezer Allen
deceased - Heir of Land of the Chief Justice
Petition of Harris in the Peace Names
of the Township of Delaware, about 23
years ago, which land was for 999 years;
that his father's name was broken into by
the enemy during the War, and that he
came with other property taken therefrom
a destroyed; that his father died in the
Year 1814, your extreme old and feeble she
employed in his Majesty's Service; that
your Petitioner has four Brothers and
two Sisters now alive; that your Petitioner
has taken the Oath of Allegiance again
by Law, and he never received any
Land or order for Land from the Crown.

Wherefore he prays that you
would be pleased to grant him
400 Acres of Land subject to the Payment
