Know all men by these Presents that we Jane Anderson of the County of Durham
in the County of Oxford Widow Administratrix of the Estate of the late John Anderson late of the County of Durham
deceased His Father Symon Anderson of the County of Middlesex Tamm and John the Deceased
are held and firmly bound to His Excellency Lieutenant William Rowan
Commander of the Bath, Administrator of the Government of the Province
approved and to his Successors in Office, in the sum of Two hundred and
Ninety six Pounds of lawful money of the said Province, to be paid to our
Sovereign Lady the Queen her heirs or Successors; for which payment,
to be well and truly made, we bind ourselves severally, our heirs, and
each of our heirs Executors, and Administrators jointly by these presents, sealed
with our seals, and dated at Woodstock in the County of Oxford this
thirteenth day of November in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred
and fifty three.

The Condition of this obligation is such, that if the above bounden
Jane Anderson Administratrix of all and singular the goods
and Chattels and credits of John Anderson deceased, do make or cause
to be made a true and perfect inventory of all and singular the goods chattels
and credits, of the said deceased, which have or shall come into the hands, pos-
session or knowledge, of her the said Jane Anderson or into the hands and pos-
session of any other person or persons for her and the same so made, do exhibit
it or cause to be exhibited into the Registry of the Surrogate Court of the
County of Oxford on or before the first Monday in June next ensuing, and
the same goods, Chattels and credits, and all other the goods Chattels and credits
of the said deceased, at the time of his death, which at any time after shall
come into the hands or possession of the said Jane Anderson or into
the hands and possession of any other person or persons, for her
do well and truly administer according to Law; and further
do make or cause to be made a true and just account
of her said administration at or before the first Monday of
January the next year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred
and fifty four and all the Rent and Residue of the said goods
Chattels and credits which shall be found remaining
upon the said administration account the same being first
examined and allowed by the Judge of the Court for the said
County shall deliver and pay unto such person or persons
respectively as the said Judge by his decree or sentence conform-
ably to the provisions in a certain Act of Parliament
intituled "An Act for the better settling Intestate Estates
and passed in the fourth year and third time of years
of the Reign of Charles the Second and also in a certain Act

passed in the first year of King James the second
 contained shall limit and appoint and if it shall hereafter
 appear that any last will or testament was made by the
 deceased and the Executor or Executors therein named do
 exhibit the same into the said Court making request to them
 to allow and approve accordingly If the said James
 Anderson above bounden being lawfully required
 do render and deliver the said Letters of administration
 (Approbation of such Testament being first had and
 made) in the said Court then this Obligation to him
 bind and upon effect shall to him remain full force
 and virtue
