Dear Sirs

Oxford August 2 1832 ⁴⁴

Finding myself under difficulties
on account of the present situation of the
Down plot I humbly undertake to ask
a favor of the honorable Council that is
to have the goodness to inform me of the
true situation I have placed myself in
by purchasing an improvement on the Down
Plot - About three years ago came into
this country an Emigrant from the United
States ignorant of the laws & customs of
the country & having an offer of the improve-
-ments of a place on the Plot & being told that
the government would allow of no advantage
being taken of me I ventured to purchase
at the expense of all my property which
if I should lose would ruin me entirely
Under these circumstances I hope your honorable
body will consider my case & if consistent
with the regulations of government
advise some method for me to pursue in
order to buy the soil
