

unto her the said Margaret Beamer otherwise House within one
month after my demise, and also from Notes of hand which I
now have in Possession for Stock to make up unto her the said
Margaret Beamer otherwise House the sum of Eighty six pounds
fifteen shillings to be paid in Stock unto her the said
Margaret Beamer otherwise House from such notes of hand as shall
first become due, also I leave unto her the said Margaret Beamer
otherwise House the Bed Bedstead and Bidding which I usually
