of the Province of Canada. Yeoman being weak in  
body but of sound and perfect mind and memory  
do hereby be Almighty God for the same do make  
and publish this my last will and testament  
in manner and form following. That is to say  
First. I will and devise to my beloved wife Lucinda  
Beamer during the natural term of her life. the  
North half of the farm lands and tenements now  
occupied by me and known as the west half of lot  
number twelve in the first conception of the Township  
of Barford aforesaid. I will and devise to my son  
Christopher Beamer <sup>and to his heirs and assigns for ever</sup> the South half of the above  
mentioned West half of lot number twelve in the  
first conception of Barford aforesaid. I will and devise  
to my son James Emily Beamer <sup>and to his heirs and assigns for ever</sup> the East half of lot  
number twelve in third conception of Barford aforesaid.  
I will and devise ~~that~~ after the death of my beloved  
wife Lucinda Beamer to my two daughters Lano  
Beamer and Laura Beamer and to their heirs and  
assigns for ever the above mentioned North half of  
the West half of lot number twelve in the said



first conception of Burford already devised to my  
beloved wife Lucinda during the natural term of her  
life. I will and devise that if after the death of my  
beloved wife Lucinda my daughters Lana and Laura  
their heirs or assigns should disagree among themselves  
in a fair and equal division of the above devised  
north half of the west half of lot number twelve  
in the first conception of Burford that my Executors  
hereafter named shall sell and convey by deed in  
fee simple the above devised lands and tenements  
namely the north half of the west half of lot  
number twelve in the first conception of Burford  
aforesaid and that the ~~share~~ proceeds arising  
from such sale shall be equally and fairly  
divided between my daughters Lana and Laura  
their heirs or assigns. I will and bequeath to my  
daughter Lana one cow and two sheep I will and  
bequeath to my daughter Laura one cow and two  
sheep payable when they respectively shall have  
attained the age of eighteen years. as to the rest  
residue and remainder of my goods and chattels  
of what nature and kind soever I will and  
bequeath to my beloved wife Lucinda and I  
hereby constitute and appoint my beloved wife

Lucinda Beaman and my friend Jeremiah Cowin  
of the Township of Blenheim. Executor and Executor  
of this my last will and testament. hereby revoking  
all former wills by me made

In witness whereof I have hereunto set my  
hand and seal this twenty seventh day of  
December in the year of our Lord one thousand  
eight hundred and forty one
